
### Message

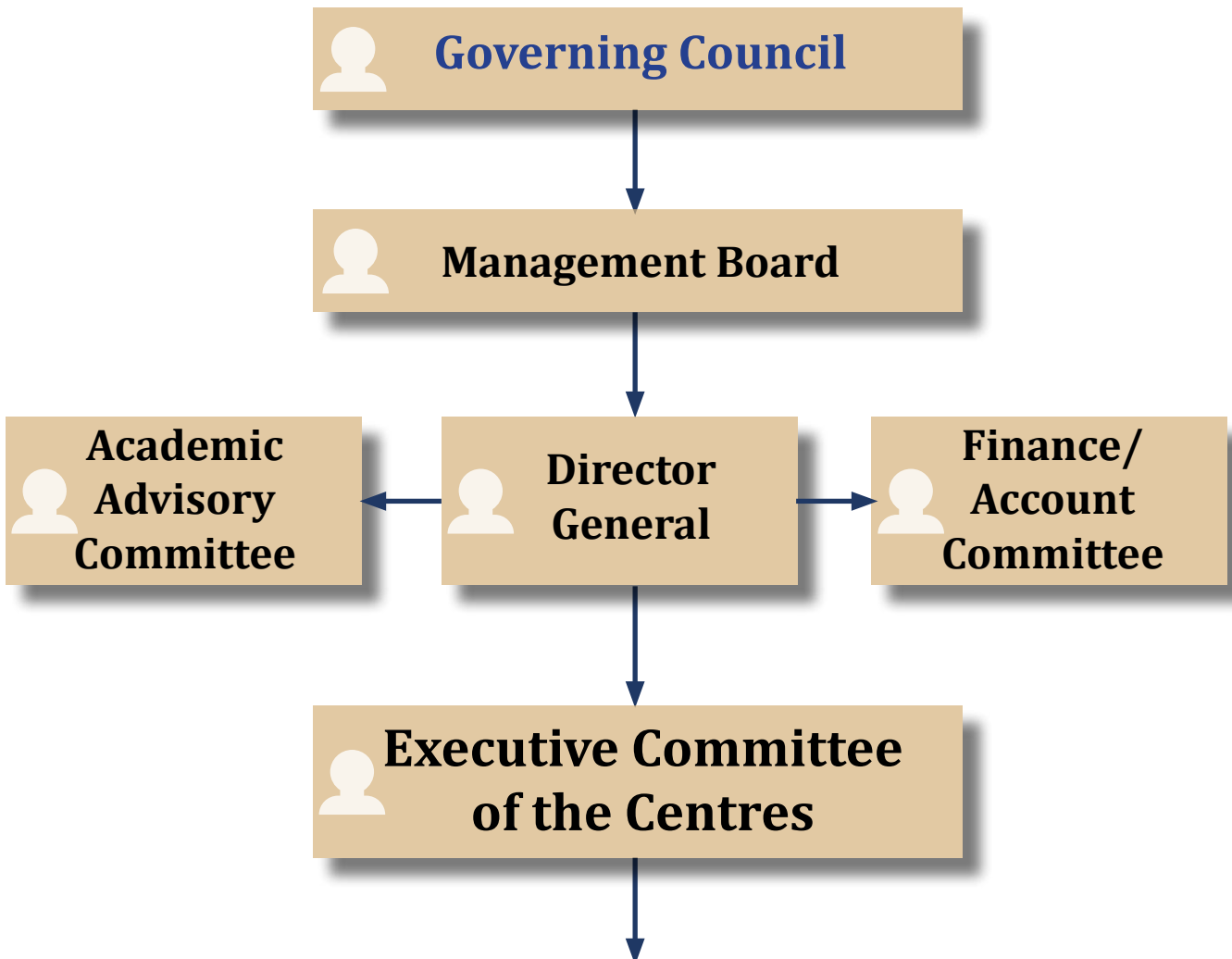

## ORGANIZATION MANDATE

National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT), is an autonomous scientific society under the administrative control of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India. NIELIT is actively engaged in Capacity Building and Skill Development in the areas of IECT such as Future Skills, Cyber Law; Cyber Security; Cloud Computing; ESDM and related verticals. It offers courses in Degree/Diploma Levels as well as Skilling Courses and is also one of the National Examination & Accreditation Bodies which accredits institutes/ organizations for the conduct of courses in the Non-Formal Sector. NIELIT is also rolling out Digital Competency Programmes for many State Governments for its employees and the masses.

NIELIT is functioning under the overall control and guidance of the **Governing Council**. The Hon'ble Union Minister for Electronics and Information Technology (E&IT) is the Chairperson of the Council whereas Hon'ble MoS (E&IT) is the Deputy Chairperson with its members from Government, Industry, Academia and representatives of various professional bodies.

**The Management Board** of NIELIT is chaired by the Secretary, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India. Each NIELIT Centre has an **Executive Committee** consisting of representatives from respective State Governments, Academic institutions and industry for the effective implementation of the decisions of the Board and the Council.

**The Finance & Accounts (F&A) Committee** of NIELIT is chaired by the Director General, NIELIT and the Committee assists the Governing Council by recommending the Budget Estimates / Revised Estimates and other finance related matters. The Committee is also mandated to scrutinize the Audited Annual Accounts before its submission to the Governing Council for adoption, besides appointment of Auditors.

**The Academic Advisory Committee (AAC)** is chaired by an eminent Academician with its members drawn from Academia and Industries and is the Advisory Body on the academic activities of NIELIT.

The Vigilance department of NIELIT is headed by the Chief Vigilance Officer (CVO), a senior officer from MeitY. The CVO is assisted by Vigilance Officers at all Centres and also at NIELIT Headquarters.

In order to promote transparency and accountability, mandatory provisions of the Right to Information Act (RTI) have been implemented in the Institute with effect from July 2005. The Public Information Officer (PIO) at Headquarters, as well as, PIOs at all NIELIT Centres have been appointed, as per the requirement spelled out under RTI Act. To deal with the requests under RTI Act, internal procedures have been formulated and the mandatory information has been hosted on the NIELIT website ([www.nielit.gov.in](http://www.nielit.gov.in)). With a view to bring excellence in public service delivery and to redress grievances of citizens in a meaningful manner, NIELIT has also appointed a Public Grievance Officer (PGO), in line with the guidelines promulgated by Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances.

# ORGANIZATION HIGHLIGHTS

## A AUGMENTATION OF NIELIT CENTRES

With a vision to provide an excellent infrastructure with residential facilities for the benefit of the students from far flung areas, Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India has approved the setting up of permanent campuses of NIELIT Centres in different parts of the country. Setting up of new Centres has helped in expanding the NIELIT's reach to the remote areas. Apart from setting up of permanent campuses, efforts are also made to set up Extension Centres in remote areas under monitoring of respective NIELIT Centres at the state. Efforts are also being made with respective State Governments for soliciting support in the form of rent-free built-up space/land.

**NIELIT Centres/Labs/Infrastructures inaugurated during 2022-23:**

### (i) Five NIELIT Centers in North East Region:

On 6<sup>th</sup> May, 2022, five NIELIT Centres in North East Region was inaugurated by **Shri Rajeev Chandrasekhar, Hon'ble Minister of State for Electronics & IT, Skill Development and Entrepreneurship**. The Hon'ble MoS visited NIELIT Dimapur Centre of Nagaland and inaugurated it along with NIELIT Centers constructed at Dibrugarh & Jorhat of Assam, Senapati of Manipur and Pasighat of Arunachal Pradesh. The Centres other than Dimapur were inaugurated through video conferencing. On this occasion, the NECB (North East Capacity Building) 2.0 Project was also launched to provide skilling, reskilling & upskilling in the areas of IECT to the youths of North Eastern States.

**Kumar Sharma, Secretary, MeitY has inaugurated the "Skilled Manpower Advanced Research and Training" facility as Chip to Startup programme of MeitY on 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2023 at NIELIT Calicut.** The 'SMART' remote lab facility is available 24×7 and the students, researchers, start-up industries can access the facility, anytime and anywhere.

## **B SPECTRUM OF NIELIT COURSES**

The National Policy on Skill Development is aimed towards empowering all individuals through improved skills, knowledge and nationally and internationally recognized qualifications to gain access to decent employment and to ensure India's competitiveness in the global market. NIELIT plays an important role in skilling of youth in the area of IECT. The wide repertoire of NIELIT Courses includes: (i) **Degree/Diploma Level Courses** such as **M.Tech, B.Tech, MCA, BCA** programmes offered by the NIELIT Centres in association with State Universities/Technical Board ; Aurangabad Centre is also facilitating **PhD** Program in the area of Electronics (ii) **Skilling Courses (Long Term)** such as O Level (IT), A Level (IT), CHM-O Level, CHM-A Level, MAT-O Level etc. ; (iii) **Skilling Courses (Short Term)** in niche areas such as IoT, Cloud Computing, Machine Learning, Cyber Security etc. and (iv) **Digital Competency Programmes** for the proliferation of

Digital Literacy in the country; besides specialized programmes in emerging technologies targeted towards empowering the employees of the State Governments and Departments of Central Line Ministries. In addition, NIELIT has also created expertise for the roll out of **customized skilling, upskilling and reskilling programmes** as per specific needs of public and private sector firms.

## D CORPORATE TRAINING:

NIELIT is one of the preferred agency for capacity building and skill upgradation of Government Officials for various State Government and Central Line Ministries. A glimpse of some of the corporate training undertaken by NIELIT in 2022-23 are briefed as under:

### (i) Corporate Training to Defence Personnel

NIELIT, Aurangabad, Kolkata and Daman has conducted a training program in “Cyber Security and Social Media Analyst” for the Army Personnel of Indian Army at Army Training College and Centre, Pachmarhi, MP. During the year 2022-23, more than 100 Defense Personnel have been trained under the programme. The training program was inaugurated by Brigadier VK Bhat, Commandant, at Pachmarhi.



### (ii) Residential Training Program for DRDO officials



A specialized one-week Training program in the area of PCB Design, Fabrication and Testing was conducted by NIELIT Aurangabad for 20 Technical Officers of Defence Research and Development Organization (DRDO) Centre during 22<sup>nd</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> August 2022.

### (iii) Skill development of Divyang Officers of Armed Forces

A one-year Training Program in Computer Operator and Programming Assistant (COPA) was conducted by NIELIT Kolkata for skill development of Divyang Officers/ Officials of Border Security Force (BSF), Assam Rifles and other Central Armed Police Forces at BSF Camp Chhawla. A total of 48 Divyang Yodhas have been trained.



### (iv) Corporate Training Programmes for Lok Sabha Secretariat



NIELIT is envisaged to train 1000 No. of officials of Lok Sabha Secretariat in the duration of 03 months in Basic IT area in order to make the officers skilled in use of computer. A total of 632 Officials including Officials of Deputy Secretary and Joint Director level from various departments of Lok Sabha have been trained in year

2022-2023 by NIELIT Delhi. Also, a total of 22 newly appointed clerk-cum-typists of Lok Sabha Secretariat have been trained in a 5 days word processing course.

### (v) Skill development of BSF Officers

BSF utilizes NIELIT's expertise in imparting quality skill development training programs in various legacy and disruptive technologies. NIELIT Delhi has conducted a corporate training on Windows Server Management and CCNA for 30 officials of BSF.



### (vi) Capacity Building of School Teachers on IECT Technologies:



Teachers' training in IECT area was conducted by NIELIT Tezpur for 314 teachers in different batches from January 2023 to March 2023. During this Programme, hands on training was given to the government school teachers from non-computer science backgrounds.



**(vii) Hands-on workshop on “Molecular Docking”**

NIELIT Guwahati conducted a 05 days long Hands-on workshop on “Molecular Docking” for the research scholars and faculty members from 31<sup>st</sup> October to 4<sup>th</sup> November 2022. The workshop was attended by participants from reputed institutions of the NE Region like IIT Guwahati, Gauhati University, Rajiv Gandhi University, Itanagar, NIT Arunachal Pradesh, and Royal Global University.

**(viii) Training on Coding & Artificial Intelligence:**

NIELIT Haridwar conducted training for two batches of Govt Teachers of Haridwar District under Samagra Shiksha Scheme. More than 50 participants attended the ten days training programme on the basic coding using Python language and concepts of Artificial Intelligence. A Training of Teachers (ToT) was also conducted by the Centre on the topic “Artificial Intelligence and Web designing” in online mode from 22<sup>nd</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> March 2023.



**(ix) Digital Competency Programmes for Jharkhand and Nagaland Government**



Training on Basic Computer Course along with awareness session on cyber security and digital hygiene is organized by NIELIT Ranchi for various batches of Govt. of Jharkhand officials. Also, a one-day workshop was conducted for Govt. of Jharkhand officials on Blockchain technology and its applications. Similar training on Digital Competency was organized by NIELIT Kohima for

stenographers of Home Department, Civil Secretariat, Nagaland.

**(x) Corporate Training Programmes for J&K Administration**

A training program for 91 Police Personnel of J&K in Advanced MS-Office was conducted during the year at both NIELIT Srinagar and Jammu Centre. Also, a 3 weeks training program on cyber security was conducted for 60 official of IT Department, J&K during March 2023, at both Srinagar and Jammu Centres. The training programs are organized under Centre of Excellence (CoE) established by the IT Department, UT of J&K in collaboration with NIELIT J&K.

### (xi) Corporate Training Programmes for Manipur Government

NIELIT Imphal conducted various Faculty Development Programmes under which 07 days training on “Computer Programming in C++ and Numerical Analysis”, “Understanding Latex and Python Programming”, “Remote Sensing and Geographic Information System”, “ICT Tools and Skills (Basics of Computer, Moodle, Advance Internet & ICT e-resources)” and “Computer Applications for Chemistry Teachers” were conducted for various Department of Manipur University Colleges. These programmes were conducted as per syllabus under National Education Policy 2020.

### (xii) Corporate Training Programmes for Bihar Government



A training programme on Cyber Security was conducted for 171 Officials of Economic Offence Unit (EOU), Bihar and subsequently examinations were also conducted by NIELIT Patna. Similarly, NIELIT a 90 Hour training on Advance Computer Course in Cyber Security was conducted for 300 Police Sub-Inspectors at Bihar Police Academy, Rajgir.

### (xiii) Corporate Training Programmes for Himachal Pradesh Government

A corporate training was imparted to HP Board of School Education on “Financial Accounting Using Tally” by NIELIT Shimla in April 2022. Also, the Centre has imparted training on Office Automation and Networking to 20 officials of Communication and Telecom Services, Dept. of Police, Himachal Pradesh.

### (xiv) Training of Sales Taxes Department J&K

NIELIT Jammu introduced a training program on “Advanced Features of MS-Excel and Data Analysis” for officials of the Sales Taxes Department of J&K, IT in which a total of 141 officials have been trained in the year 2022-23.

## **E HIGHLIGHTS OF CAPACITY BUILDING UNDER FUNDED PROJECTS:**

### (i) Skill Development in ESDM Sector

NIELIT is one of the Key Implementing Agencies for implementing the scheme for Skill Development in ESDM funded by MeitY and Programme Management Unit is set up by NIELIT. So far, **NIELIT has enrolled 53,898 candidates, out of which 53,531 has been trained and 29936 has been certified and 3692 candidates have been placed.**

**(ii) Skilling Programme for SC/ST job seekers funded by DGE, MoL&E**

NIELIT is implementing a programme for providing computer training to SC/ST jobseekers funded by the Directorate General of Employment (DGE), MoL&E. Under the programme, one year training is conducted in two courses, namely (i) O Level (IT) and (ii) CHM-O Level for the SC/ST jobseekers who are registered with National Career Service Centres for SC/ST, DGE. During the The training is conducted at 24 locations across the country under monitoring of 19 NIELIT Centres. **During the FY 22-23, a total of 4829 SC/ST candidates were enrolled in IT O Level out of the targeted 4900 and a total of 1845 SC/ST candidates were enrolled in CHM-O Level out of the target 1960.**

**(iii) Free Training to SC/ST Candidates funded by MeitY**

The programme for providing free training to Schedules Castes and Scheduled Tribe Candidates funded by MeitY is being implemented since 2007 at NIELIT Centres. Under the Pogramme, candidates belonging to SC/ST community are trained in various Degree/ Diploma and NSQF aligned non-formal courses of NIELIT on free of cost basis, this is in-kind DBT scheme of MeitY. **In the FY 2022-23, a total of 3,633 SC candidates and 15,620 ST candidates have been provided free training in various courses by NIELIT Centres.**

**(iv) Capacity Building on Cyber Security for Urban Cooperative Banks:**

Under the ‘Awareness Vriddhi and Training for the Urban Cooperative Banks (AVTU) Mission’ sponsored by Reserve Bank of India (RBI), NIELIT Centres are providing Cyber Security Training [7 to 16 hours] to Urban Cooperative Bank (UCBs) Officers for three different target groups i.e. Board and Senior Management, Technical Officers and Employees (Non-Technical).

CAB-RBI has mapped ten (10) NIELIT Centres with total of 338 nos of UCBs of different regions. **As on 31st March 2023, a total of 1070 Officials have been trained and 914 Nos. Officials have been certified under the programme.**

**(v) Training Program in e-Waste Management**

**A total of 101 officials from various Departments/ Associate Departments/ Stakeholders of Govt/ Non-Govt. organizations in West Bengal have been trained and certified** on Compliance Requirements of e-Waste (Management and Handling) Rules 2016 and RoHS e-Waste under “Capacity building of Government officials and stakeholders for the state of West Bengal” project which is funded by West Bengal Pollution Control Board.



## (vi) Soft Skill Development Training for Artisans

Under the project “Digital Intervention on Handloom & Handicraft Sector for livelihood Enhancement of Artisans of NE States”, NIELIT Kohima organized an awareness program on “Entrepreneurship & Soft Skill Development Program” with an aim to accelerate artisanal growth and creation of repository of artisans in the state. **As on 31<sup>st</sup> March 2023, a total of 2,172 artisans have been trained in the NE States creating an overall conducive environment for entrepreneurial growth.**

## F GLIMPSES OF PLACEMENT DRIVES

### NIELIT Calicut conducts Mega Job Fair

Under Model Career Centre (MCC) project, various NIELIT Centres are organizing Job Fairs in association with Directorate General of Employment, MoL&E to facilitate youth in the region to apply for multiple jobs under a single roof. In this regard, a Job Fair was conducted on 13 August 2022 at NIELIT Calicut wherein around 2000 job seekers were mobilized, 304 were screened, and 113 candidates were shortlisted. Also, 21 candidates received an offer letter on the day, after the final round of interviews.



Another Mega Job Fair was conducted by NIELIT Calicut team on 11th December 2022 wherein around 5000 job seekers were mobilized, 2400 were screened, and 1242 candidates were shortlisted. In a similar Job Fair organized by NIELIT Kolkata on 2<sup>nd</sup> December, 2022 a total of 13 companies interviewed more than 250 job seekers and shortlisted more than 150 of them. Another job fair was conducted at Srinagar on 28<sup>th</sup> December, 2022 wherein around 130 candidates registered, and 16 were shortlisted.

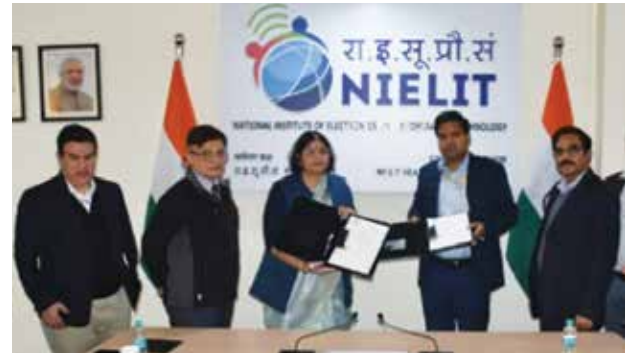
**(iv) Agreement with JDT Bangalore**

**(v) PG Diploma Programs on 3D Printing/Digital Manufacturing**

The first of its kind, NIELIT Calicut has started Post Graduate courses in 3D printing and Digital Marketing to help students to develop the skills required for today's industry world. The latest software like 3-D Experience, CURA, Preform, EIGER, Free CAD, Netfab, ANSYS, CREO Parametric and hardware tools like Ultimaker (FDM) 3-D Printer, Form labs SLA Printer and Accessory units, 3-D Scanner have been made available for these courses.

**(vi) Application to UGC for granting Deemed to be University**

In the 53<sup>rd</sup> Report on Standing Committee on Information Technology (2017-18), 16<sup>th</sup> Lok Sabha, the Committee recommended that Ministry should explore the option of setting up a dedicated university/institution in collaboration with industry associations and/or broaden the scope & mandate of existing institutes.

Accordingly, NIELIT is synergizing to the recommendation of the Committee and has applied to the University Grants Commission for Deemed to be University status under the De-Novo category on 5<sup>th</sup> November, 2022, with its Ropar campus as the Main campus and the campuses at Calicut, Aurangabad, Gorakhpur, Srinagar, Agartala, Imphal, Aizawl, Patna and Kohima as the off-campus(es) of the proposed NIELIT, deemed to be University. **NIELIT has also presented its application for Deemed to be University to the UGC Expert Committee in March-2023.**

**L THIRD PARTY EXAMINATIONS**

**(i) Online Examination for Directorate General of Civil Aviation Department**

NIELIT and DGCA entered into an agreement in Jan 2018 for conduction of online examinations for various categories of AME and FC. In July 2022, the agreement between NIELIT and DGCA got extension of one year. Under the agreement, NIELIT maintains the DGCA Pariksha Portal for Flight Crew and Aircraft Maintenance Engineers and also conducts the licensing examinations for these candidates. Further, NIELIT also conducts online on

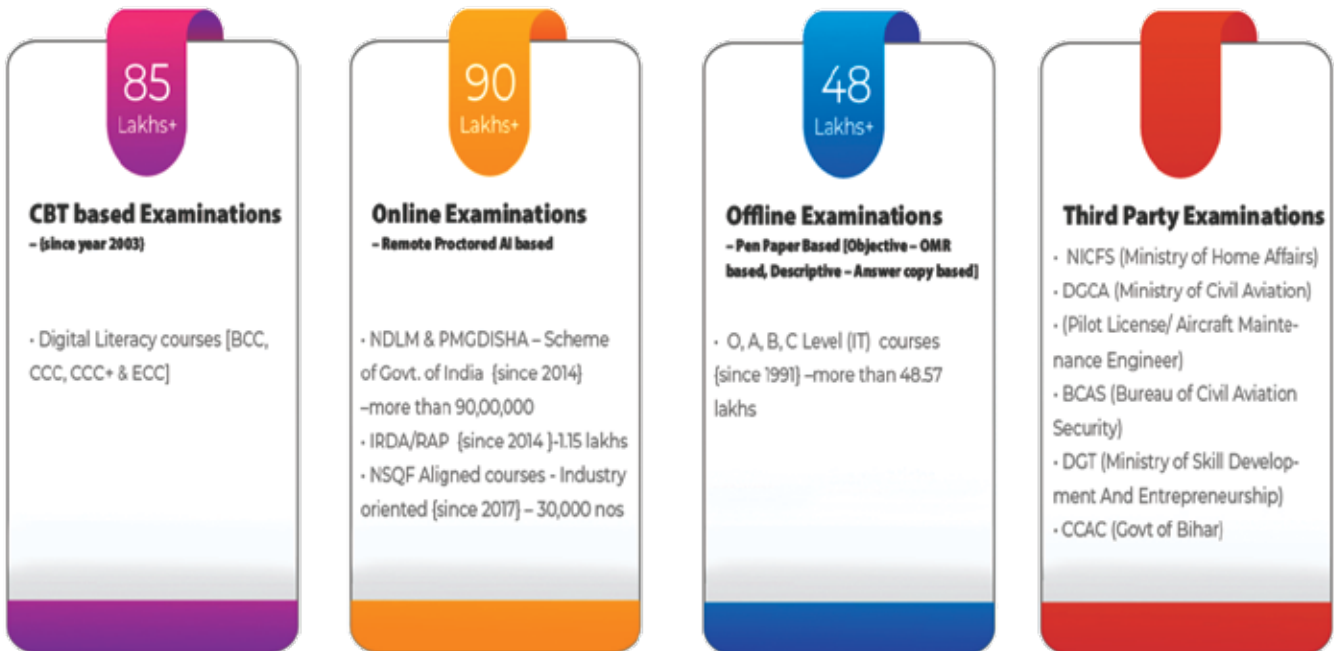

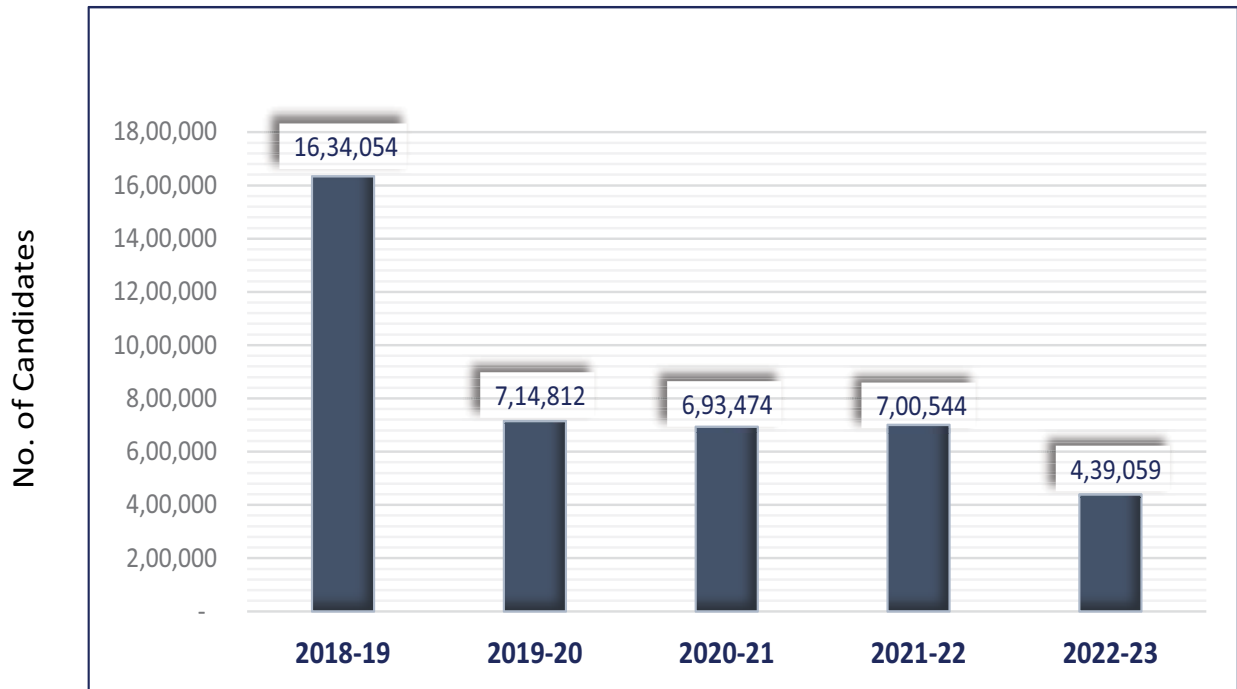

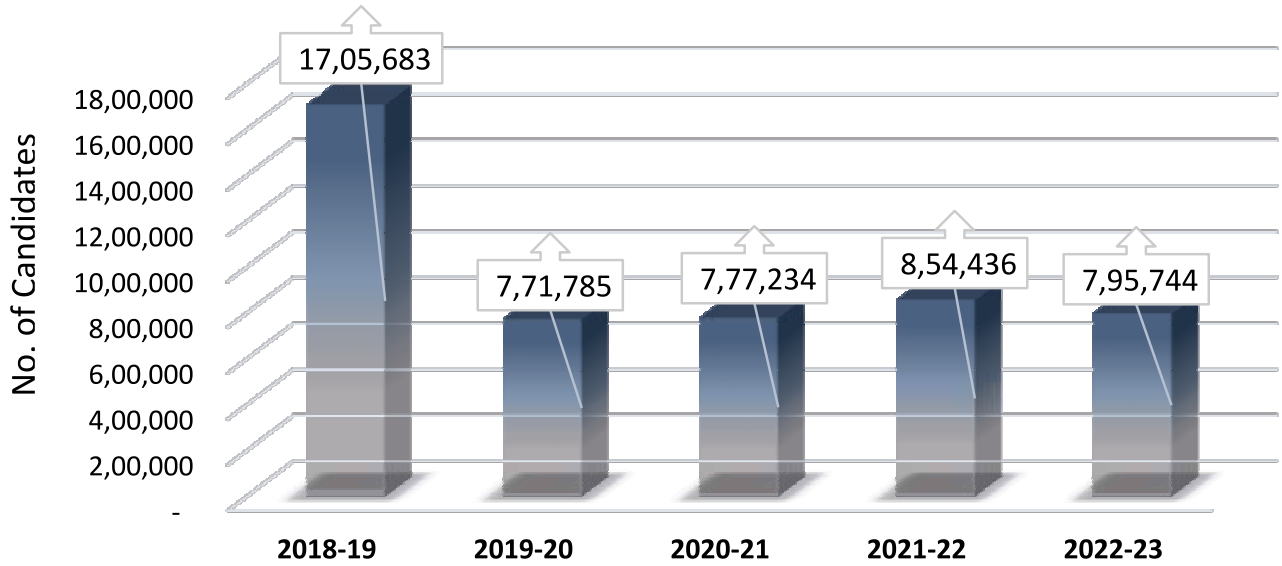

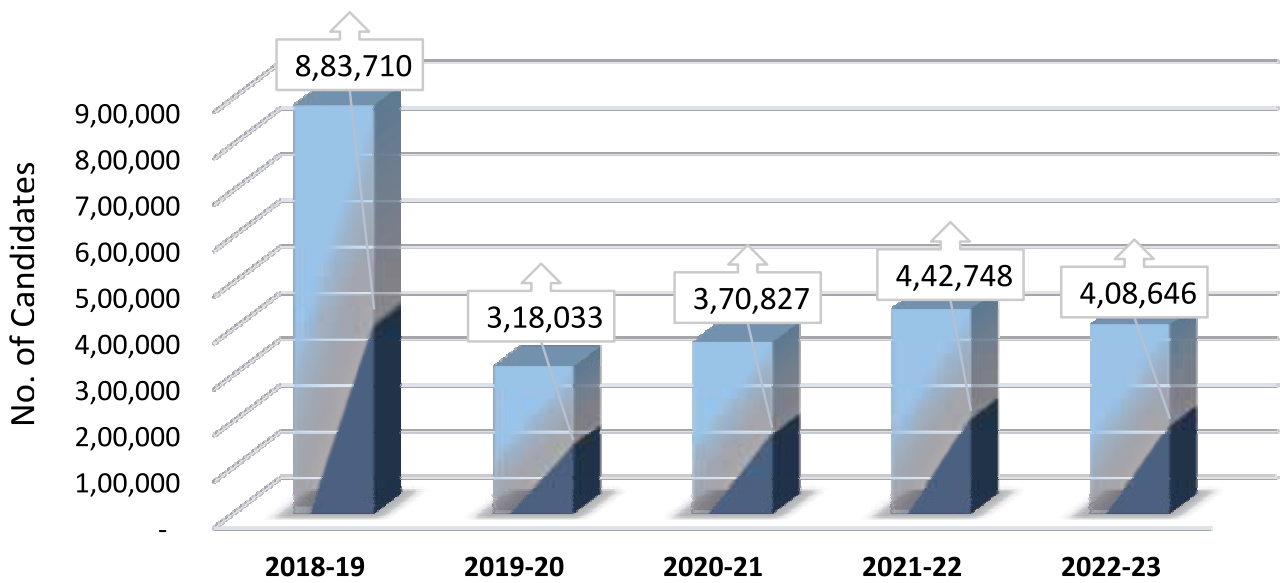

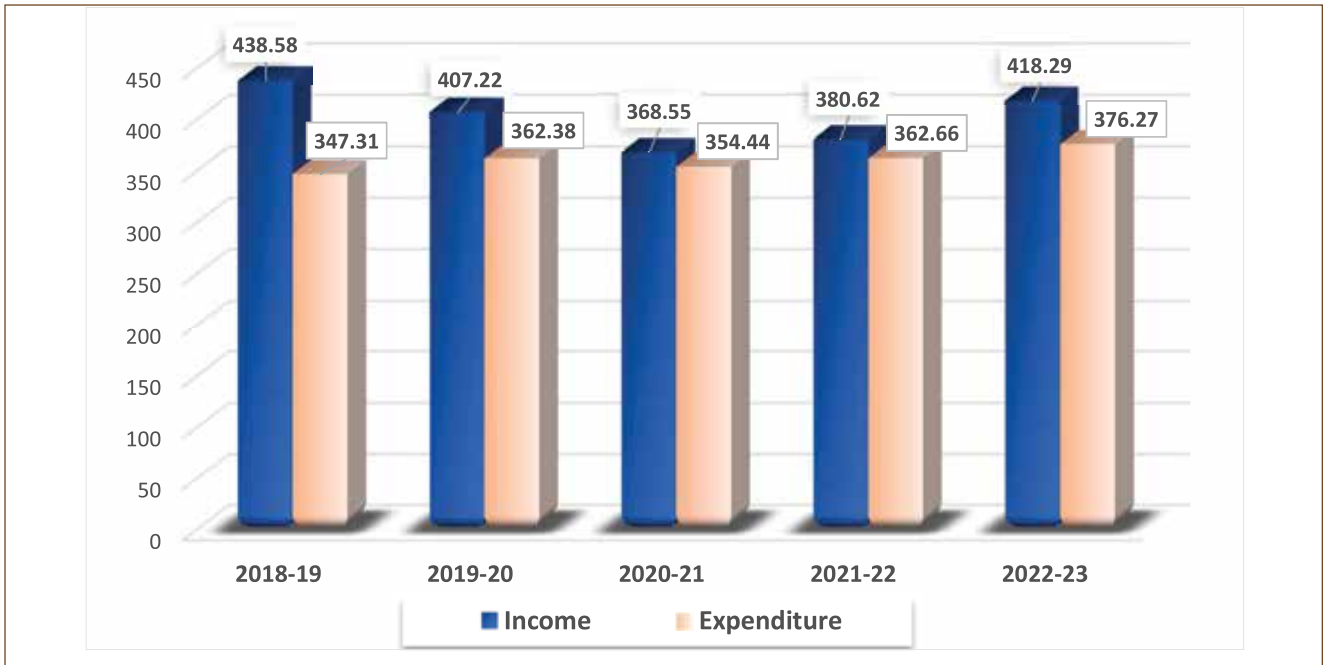

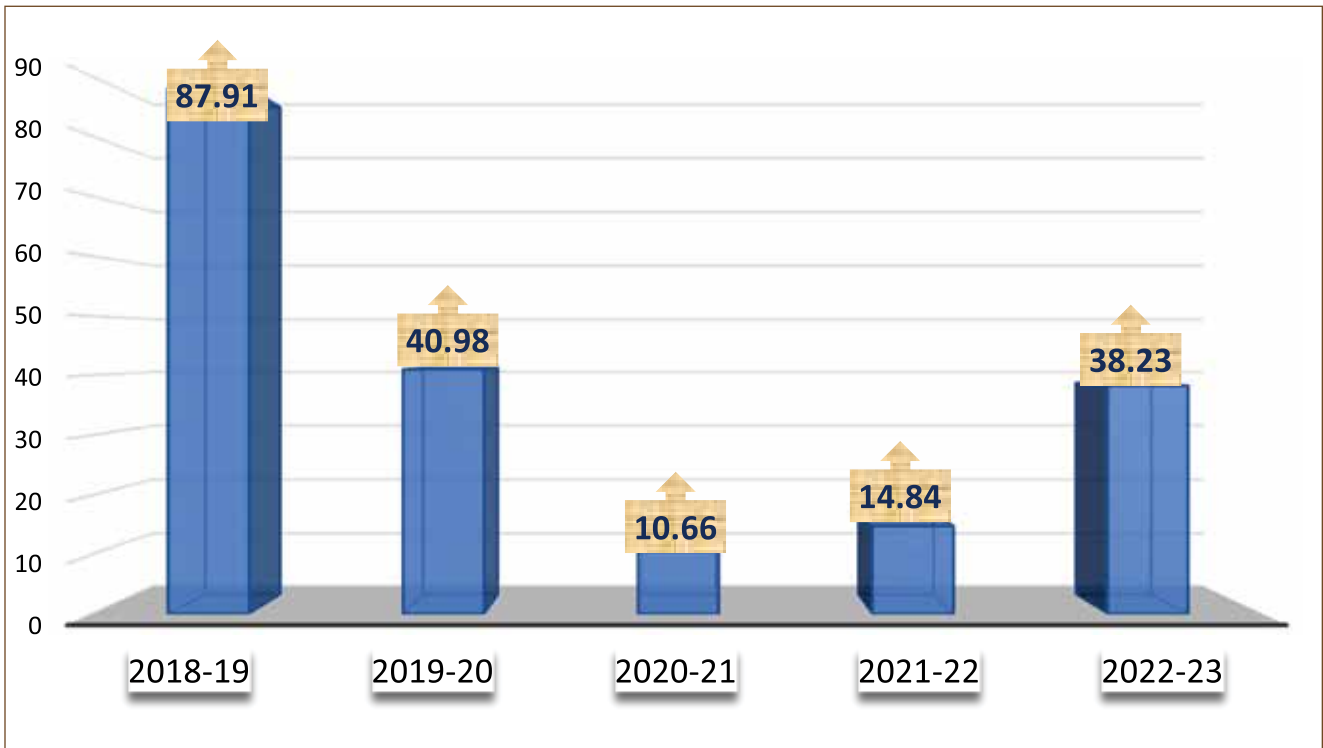

We have audited accompanying consolidated financial statements of **National Institute of Electronics & Information Technology Electronics**, NEILIT Bhawan, Sector - 8, Dwarka, New Delhi - 110077, (hereinafter called as "Society") a society registered under the society Registration Act 1860, which comprises the Consolidated Balance sheet as at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2023, the consolidated Income & Expenditure Account and also the Consolidated Receipt & Payment Account for the year ended on that date, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information annexed thereto in which the returns of NIELIT Delhi head quarter, National population register Consolidated audited by us and returns of twenty two centers - Aizawl, Aurangabad, Calicut, Chandigarh, Chennai, Gorakhpur, Guwahati, Gangtok, Imphal, Itanagar, Kolkata, Kohima, Sri Nagar & Jammu, Agartala, Shillong, New Delhi, Ajmer, Patna, Ranchi, Shimla, Haridwar & Leh audited by other auditors are incorporated.

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, except for the possible effects of matter described in the "Basis of Qualified Opinion" section of the report, the accompanying consolidated financial statements of the society are prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with applicable Laws. The consolidated Balance Sheet and the consolidated Statement of Income & Expenditure and consolidated Receipt and Payment account dealt with by this Report are in agreement with the books of account and with the returns received from the centers not visited by us and give a true and fair view in conformity with the generally accepted accounting principles and accounting standards in India.

### Basis for Qualified Opinion

Please refer "**Annexure -A**" for the basis of qualified opinion.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Standards on Auditing (SAs) issued by ICAI. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the *Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of these Consolidated Financial Statements* section of our report. We are independent of the society in accordance with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements, and we have fulfilled our other responsibilities in accordance with these requirements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.





### **Emphasis of Matter**

We draw your attention towards note 3 of schedule 25 regarding matters related to provision for bad and doubtful debt, GST Input Tax Credit, delay in payment of TDS, ESI & PF, and unadjusted advance/security deposits. Further attention towards note 4 (c,d,e,f,g,h,i,k) of schedule 25 of the financial statements regarding the current status of National Population register and note number 10 of schedule 25 regarding compilation of only material notes in the consolidated financial statements. Further attention is drawn towards Note Number 4(a) of Schedule 25 regarding the contingent liabilities.

Further attention is drawn towards Note Number 4(j) of Schedule 25 regarding the cheques issues but not presented. Further attention is drawn towards Note number 6 of schedule 25 regarding ongoing process of confirmation of debtors, creditors and loans & advances stated in the financial statements.

In case of NIELIT Delhi Head quarter audited by us there were following Emphasis of matter

Attention is drawn towards the note number 12 of schedule 24 regarding the unadjusted amount of advance fee received from the students. Further attention is drawn towards the note 14 and 15 of schedule 24 regarding Grant in Aids. Further attention is drawn towards the note 16 of schedule 24 regarding the unadjusted advances received from the parties. And Further attention is drawn towards note 23 of schedule 24 regarding ongoing process of confirmation with Debtors, Creditors, current assets, current liabilities & loans and advances, which are stated in the books at the value which is Recoverable/Payable. Our opinion is not qualified in respect with such matters.

In case of Shimla Centre, New Delhi Centre, Calicut Centre, Chennai Centre and Srinagar & Jammu Centre; Attention to emphasis of matter is drawn by their auditors towards certain matters, reference to such reports can be made.

### **Other Matter**

We did not audit the financial statements (referred as returns) of Aizawl, Aurangabad, Calicut, Chandigarh, Chennai, Gorakhpur, Guwahati, Gangtok, Imphal, Itanagar, Kolkata, Kohima, SriNagar & Jammu, Agartala, Shillong, New Delhi, Ajmer, Patna, Ranchi, Shimla, Haridwar & Leh, as considered in the consolidated financial statements.

These financial statements have been audited by other auditors whose reports have been furnished to us by the Management and our opinion on the consolidated financial statements, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these center's is based solely on the reports of the other auditors.

In case of Shimla Centre, New Delhi Centre, Calicut Centre, Chennai Centre and Srinagar & Jammu Centre; Attention to emphasis of matter is drawn by their auditors towards certain matters, reference to such reports can be made.





### **Responsibilities of Management and Those Charged with Governance for the Financial Statements**

The Society Management is responsible for the preparation of these consolidated financial statements in accordance with applicable Law and bye laws for such internal control as management determines is necessary to enable the preparation of the consolidated financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing these consolidated financial statements, management of the Society is responsible for assessing the society's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the society or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the society's financial reporting process.

### **Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements**

Our objectives are to obtain reasonable assurance about whether these consolidated financial statements as a whole are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error, and to issue an auditor's report that includes our opinion. ## ANNEXURE-A

### NIELIT, Haridwar Centre:

**1. Government Grant:** We noted that amount of Rs.6,12,234/- under Grant in Aid for Aspirational District Project booked as an income during the year however the grant is not utilized during the year. The amount booked as an income need to be reversed.

We noted that amount of Rs.19,55,865/- under Grant in Aid for IT for Masses booked as an income during the year however the grant is not utilized during the year. The amount booked as an income need to be reversed.

2. Income as per books of accounts, GSTR-1 & GSTR-3B is not reconciled.
3. Security Deposits from students are outstanding for more than five years.
4. TDS amount of Rs.6,49,850/- is recoverable from NIELIT, Head Quarters.
5. Fixed assets register is not maintained and updated regularly.

### NIELIT, Delhi Centre:

**Fixed Assets:** The management of Centre is responsible for the identification and proper valuation of fixed assets in the financial statements. During our audit, we encountered limitations and were unable to obtain sufficient appropriate audit evidence to verify the existence and condition of fixed assets, which significantly affected the reliability of the information presented in the financial statements.

**Government Grant:** We noted that the Centre has recognized government grants in the name of Artificial Intelligence Grant, Social & Mobile Grant and Cloud Computation Grant in its financial statements and received a grant of Rs, 20,00,000 each for capital expenditure and Rs, 54,00,000 for recurring expenses for each grant in current year and last two financial years, but the relevant documentation and details pertaining to whether grant is being used for intended purpose or not were not provided to us by the management. As a result, we were unable to determine the appropriateness of the grant's recognition and its impact on the financial statements.





## **NIELIT, Head Quarter:**

**GST Input Tax Credit: GST Input Tax Credit:** The GST Input Credit of Rs. 42,58,600 for F.Y. 2021-22 and Rs.54,29,774/- for F.Y. 2022-23 which is part schedule 12 regarding Deferred Input Tax Credit. This amount pertains to M/s Umang Services, who has not deposited the GST amount collected from the NIELIT HQ and failed to furnish their GST returns as per the GST law and their GST registration get suspended as verified from the GST portal. Since this GST Input tax credit not reflecting in GSTR-2B, NIELIT HQ is not eligible to claim the same. As per the information provided by the management necessary actions has been taken for the recovery of the aforesaid amount. The recovery of this amount is uncertain as on the date.

**Amount Recoverable (Assets):** The amount of Rs.61,53,614 in schedule 12 regarding Amount recoverable from MEITY. This amount is recoverable for more than the period of 5 years. The recovery of this amount is uncertain.

### **SCHEDULE 24 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The National Institute of Electronics & Information Technology (here-in-after referred as NIELIT), an Autonomous Scientific Society (re-named with effect from 10.10.2011 from DOEACC Society) under the administrative control of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India was set up during November, 1994 to carry out Human Resource Development and related activities in the area of Information & Communications Technology (ICT). The society is registered with Income Tax Department u/s 12A and has been formed exclusively for the purpose to generate quality manpower and develop skilled professionals in the area of Information, Electronics & Communications Technology (IECT) and allied fields, by providing world class education & training and accreditation services. The Society is engaged both in the formal & Non-formal Education in the area of Information & Communications Technology (ICT) besides development of Industry oriented quality education and training in the state-of-art areas establish standards to be the Country's premier Institution for Examination and Certification in the field of ICT. It is also a National Examination Body which accredits institutes/organizations for conducting courses particularly in the Non-formal Sector of IT Education & training. NIELIT is working through its 22 centres i.e.- Aizwal, Aurangabad, Agartala, Ajmer, Calicut, Chandigarh, Chennai, Delhi, Gangtok, Gorakhpur, Guwahati, Haridwar, Itanagar, Imphal, Kolkata, Kohima, Patna, Ranchi, Shillong, Shimla, Srinagar & Jammu and Leh.

The following policies represent the consolidated accounting policies of NIELIT including its various centers and also include various material information and material notes to accounts specifically mentioned in various center's audited financials becoming part of this consolidated financial statements of NIELIT

#### 1. **ACCOUNTING CONVENTION:**

##### a) **Method of Accounting**

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention and unless otherwise stated below on the accrual method of accounting.

##### b) **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of financial statements and the reported amount of revenues of expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/ materialize.

#### 2. **INCOME RECOGNITION**

All the NIELIT Centers are following accrual method of accounting except:

- a) NIELIT recognized Grant actually received from Government of India on cash basis.
- b) Srinagar/Jammu Center recognized course fees on receipt basis.
- c) Registration Fee, Accreditation Fee, Variable Accreditation Fee (VAF) and Awareness Creation Fund (ACF) have been recognized on receipt basis.





3. The revenue Grant-in-Aid released by the MeitY to Centers for meeting of Recurring Expenditure has been accounted as income by respective centers, as detailed below:

4. **Investments**

Funds of the Society invested in Short Term Fixed Deposits with nationalized banks have been shown as per guidelines of the Society for “Treasury Management of Surplus”.

Interest on Fixed Deposit kept for Earmarked/Endowment Fund received during the year, is being credited to respective Earmarked/ Endowment Fund. Interest on GIA also refunded to MeitY.

5. **Inventory**

Stocks are valued at lower of cost or net realizable value.

6. **Fixed Assets**

Fixed Assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition. In respect of project involving construction, related pre- operational expenses, form part of the value of the Assets capitalized.

a) In case of Kolkata centre Fixed Assets are stated at cost (Gross) less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes: cost of acquisition, installation, which is inclusive of freight and duty, taxes, incidental expenses. Leasehold Land for 999 years at Sector 1 of Bidhannagar (Salt Lake, Plot No. 267, Block-BF) has been shown under the head "Building" in the Fixed Asset schedule.

b) In case of Chandigarh there was a major fire incident in June, 2014 in the building occupied by NIELIT Chandigarh (formerly Regional Computer Centre) at SCO 114-116, Sector 17B, Chandigarh. Appropriate accounting entries regarding losses/write-offs in respect thereof have been recorded in the year 2015-2016. In the said incident, the Centre lost almost all the records till that date, including Fixed Asset Register.

c) In respect of Agartala Centre, 15 Acres of Land for building the permanent campus has been allotted by Govt. of Tripura at free of cost, the same has been shown at the Nominal Value of Re. 1/- under the Fixed Assets Schedule.

d) The Government of Rajasthan has allotted 16.33 Hectares of land at Village Khoda near Kekri Distt. Ajmer for 99 years lease at free of cost has been shown at the nominal value of Re.1/-

e) In case of NIELIT Guwahati (City center) expenditure incurred on renovation of building (Civil & Electricals) taken on rental basis for a period of 10 years has been shown as deferred Expenditure to be written off over the period of occupancy.

7. **Depreciation**

Depreciation is provided on W.D.V. method as per rates specified in the Income Tax Act 1961.

Depreciation for current year on “Grant related Assets” is debited to Income & Expenditure Account and also credited to Income & Expenditure Account as per AS-12 and deducted from “Capital Grant-in-Aid” during the year.

8. **Government Grants**

During the financial year 2022-23 NIELIT has not received GIA (Plan) and (Non Plan) from MeitY.

9. **Change in Accounting Policy**

During the year no such changes take place.

10. **Employee’s Benefits**

- Provision for Gratuity is accounted for on actuarial valuation as per AS -15 and employees are covered under “Payment of Gratuity Act 1972”.
- The liability of Gratuity in respect of Chandigarh has been covered by the policy obtained in favor of the respective Employee’s Trust under Group Gratuity cash accumulation from LIC of India.
- Provision of Leave Encashment is accounted for on actuarial valuation basis as per AS-15.
- Bonus will be accounted on Cash Basis.
- NIELIT HQ and Centers have been covered under EPF w.e.f. 01.01.2003 with the approval of the Competent Authority. NIELIT has also adopted NPS Scheme for regular employees, joined after 1<sup>st</sup> September, 2014

#### (ii) Other Litigations:

- NIELIT Chandigarh initiated arbitration proceedings against Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) for recovery of dues amounting Rs. 15,66,021 for providing instructors for School project, appropriate provision in respect of which had already been made in the books as Provision for Doubtful Debts. KVS not has only refuted the claim of the centre but has also filed



a counter claim of Rs. 2,68,650/- as over payment of the Centre (formerly RCC). Arbitration proceedings are yet to be concluded.

- ESI had issued demand notice for Rs. 11,22,702/- and Rs. 3,03,947/- for non-compliance of ESI Scheme for the period from Oct 2002 to March 2003. Dy Director, ESI vide Order No. PB.17000399790001013/245 dated 21.07.2011 has directed the Centre for payment of the demand. However, the centre has preferred an appeal and accordingly Civil Writ Petition (CWP) No. 5441 of 2013 and CWP No. 5367 of 2013 are pending with Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, Chandigarh, though the Hon'ble High Court has granted stay against the recovery of demand as an interim relief. Case is on argument stage and stay has been granted. Last date of hearing was 01.09.2023 and next date of hearing on the matter is fixed on 04.10.2023.
- Against the orders of Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal dated 2<sup>nd</sup> May,2014, this Centre filed Civil Writ Petition No. 15204 of 2014 before Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court Chandigarh for recovery of balance amount of wrongly drawn HRA with penal interest amounting to Rs. 3,89,642.00 by Ms. Manjit Kaur, Ex. Data Entry Operator 'E'. Proceedings in the matter are in process. The said amount of Rs. 3,89,642/- was recovered from the amount of leave encashment payable on her retirement. Ms. Manjit Kaur, Ex-Data Entry operator 'E' of this Centre has again filed O.A. No. 60/129/2018 before the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Chandigarh Bench for release of withheld amount of Rs. 3,89,642/- which was dismissed as withdrawn on 10.10.2018 by the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Chandigarh. Proceedings are in process. Last date of hearing in the case 03.07.2023 and next date of hearing is not received yet.

Till such time the matter is decided by Hon'ble, the said amount of Rs.3,89,642/- has been treated as Contingent liabilities.

- A sum of Rs. 43,24,045/- was shown recoverable against Municipal Corporation Chandigarh against Land allotted vide letter No. MC/ESTATE/2002/4732 dated 29-01-2002 which was subsequently surrendered by the Centre. In the absence of any relief provided by Chief Administrator, Chandigarh and UT Administration, Chandigarh, writ petition was filed before the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh, which was also dismissed in default, against which, another writ petition was filed for restoration of the case. The said Writ petition was also dismissed as withdrawn with liberty to file afresh on the same cause of action. Based upon the representation sent to Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh regarding re-consideration for allotment of land at Mani majra by adjusting initial payment of Rs.43.24 lacs already released by this Centre in favour of Municipal Corporation Chandigarh and non-applicability of demand note raised towards interest on delayed payment of premium, Ground Rent and forfeiture amount of consideration money, fresh Writ Petition has been filed through Central Govt. Counsel. Notice of motion was issued to counsel for Chandigarh Administration and Municipal Corporation. The reply affidavit has been filed by the Counsel of Municipal Corporation Chandigarh on 23.09.2019 after being given last opportunity by the Hon'ble High Court.

Proceedings are under process and next date of hearing in the matter is 29.01.2024. Appropriate provision had already been made in the books of accounts of the Centre in this regard.

- Sh. V. K. Jain, Ex Director In charge, NIELIT Chandigarh along with fifteen other Ex-employees of NIELIT Chandigarh who retired after 01.01.2016 and before 29.03.2018 i.e. the date of issue of Gazette Notification by Ministry of Labour and Employment, Govt. of India vide which maximum amount of gratuity payable to an employee under "The Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972" has been increased from Rs. 10 lacs to Rs. 20 lacs., have filed O.A. No. 60/1144/2018 before the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Principal Bench, Chandigarh for grant of revised gratuity to the applicants @ maximum of Rs. 20 lacs along with interest @ 12% p.a. from respective dates of retirements of the applicants till the actual

date of realization. Reply on behalf of Respondents was filed before the Hon'ble CAT. Further Proceedings are under process and next date of hearing in the matter is 20.10.2023.

b) Kolkata Centre

- i. RCC Employees Contributory Provident Fund Trust with Income Tax recognition is maintaining PF of employees who have joined NIELIT before 01.01.2004. However, PF of employees who have joined on or after 01.01.2004 is maintained at NIELIT Head Quarter under EPR & MP Act, 1952. The centre has received a notice on 11.07.2006 and order u/s. 7A dt. 09.07.2008 and u/s 7B dtd. 30.01.2009 from Regional EPF authority that NIELIT will cover under EPF & MP Act. 1952 from August 1982. Against the above-mentioned orders, the centre has filed an appeal to the EPF Appellate Tribunal, Delhi (appropriate authority) that our Head Quarter is covered under CPF Act. 1925 as per Gol Gazette Notification dt. 26.07.1997. However, the EPF Appellate Tribunal, Delhi has dismissed the appeal by order dated 3rd August, 2011. The Centre has there after filed on appeal with the Honourable High Court, Kolkata against the aforesaid order, on 21<sup>st</sup> March, 2012. ON 17.08.2012 Honourable High Court Calcutta has issued Judgement that "until further orders, the respondents are restrained from proceeding in manner on the basis of the order dated August 03.2011 passed by EPF Appellate Tribunal".

NIELIT Kolkata has paid a sum of Rs. 1,56,854/- under protest against demand of Rs. 6,27,413/- from Employees' State Insurance Corporation West Bengal Region. The demand has been disputed by the Centre.

- ii. There is contingent liability of service tax for Rs. 9,82,620/- (Rs. 4,87,425/- for Cenvat Credit availed on common input service for which assessment is pending till Balance Sheet date and Rs. 4,95,195/- under Rule 6(3) and Rule 14 of CCR Rules, 2004 for which Appeal is pending with Service Tax Authority out of which Rs. 4,95,195/- was set aside by the Commissioner of CGST &C. Ex, Howrah Commissionerate vide his order no. 219/S. Tax-11/Ko1/2018 dt. 20.03.18.

c) Shimla Centre

- i) Service Tax paid on self-assessment basis:

Rs. 2,50,81,223/- has been paid on account of Service Tax on self-assessment basis and booked as expenses during the current year i.e. 2019-20. However, some interest or penalty may be imposed by Service Tax Department which presently cannot be quantified.

Further, NIELIT has charged Service Tax on the services provided to Department of Higher Education, Himachal Pradesh in the earlier years when such services were exempted from Service Tax, for this amount of Service Tax paid to the Service Tax Department an appeal for the refund has been filed with the authorities.



- ii) Services provided to Director Higher Education, Himachal Pradesh was considered as exempted from GST till October, 2018 and after that GST was collected and paid to the Department of GST. Now State Taxes and Excise had issued a notice under Section 73 of CGST/HPGST Act, 2017 for Rs. 4,00,43,034/- Out of which Rs. 1,80,00,000/- was paid till 31st March 2023.
  - iii) Some interest or penalty may be imposed by the Employees' State Insurance, on account of delay in employee's registration on ESIC Portal. However, interest or penalty cannot be quantified presently.
- d) **NIELIT HQ**
- i. South Delhi Municipal Corporation has assessed the property tax with regards to NIELIT HQ Dwarka building by applying use factor 4 (being business building) and conveyed the assessment demand of Rs. 1,84,06,741/- vide its Assessment Order dated 17.02.2021. However, NIELIT has deposited property tax amounting to Rs. 32,72,727/- on 18.03.2021 and Rs. 5,64,910/- dated 29.07.2021 by applying factor 1.
  - ii. NIELIT has filed a writ petition in the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide WP(C) 4128/2021 on 26.03.2021, requesting Hon'ble court to quash Assessment order dated 17.02.2021, warrant of distress dated 18.03.2021 & 24.03.2021 issued by respondent, direct the respondent to pass a fresh assessment order by treating the subject premises under use factor 1 and allow the benefit of ongoing Amnesty Scheme (2021). Hon'ble High Court vide its order dated 26.03.2021 has granted stay to NIELIT. The case is under subjudice and next date of hearing is 30.10.2023.

## 2. **Capital Commitment:**

- a) Building is constructed at Lunglei extension Centre of NIELIT Aizawl with total estimated construction cost is Rs 7,18,00,000/- out of which Rs 5,58,76,338/- has been paid till 31.03.2023.
- b) In case of HQs, Office space at NBCC Tower, Kidwai Nagar has been acquired for Rs.47.01 crores out of which Rs. 46.26 crores have been paid till 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2023.
- c) NIELIT Bhawan for housing HQ has been constructed at Dwarka, Delhi. In this regard, NIELIT has released Rs. 46.86 crore till 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2023.

## 3. **Current Assets, Current liabilities, Provisions and Loans and Advances**

In the opinion of the management, the current assets, loans and advances have been stated at the value which will be realizable in the ordinary course of business, except in the case of debtors where provision for Bad & doubtful debts provided for.

### a) **In case of Delhi Centre**

- i) A provision of Rs. 28,60,720/- has been made towards doubtful debts against recoverable of Rs. 1,12,71,327/- from Director of Education, Jhandewalan. This amount is due since 2004-05. The matter is under arbitration. An arbitrator gave an Award dated 27.12.2017 for an amount of Rs. 78,98,437/- and interest @ 8% p.a. w.e.f.23.03.2011. The Directorate of Education, Jhandewalan released the payment of Rs. 78,98,437/- and Rs. 9,00,000/- as interest on 27.04.2023. NIELIT Delhi centre also communicate vide letter No. NIELIT/NDL/Legal/616 dtd 16.06.2023 to release the balance interest amount immediately. In the opinion of the management quantum of provision made is reasonable.





b) In case of Chandigarh Centre

- i) Amounts aggregating to Rs. 12,54,781/- received during the year from debtors could not be credited to the appropriate debtor's account for want of relevant information. The said consolidated amount has been reduced from total debtors reflected in the Balance Sheet and its notes to Accounts.
- ii) As per HQ Order No. NIELIT/HQ/ADT/38/2019 dated 13.05.2019, books of accounts of NIELIT Ropar were merged with books of accounts of NIELIT Chandigarh w.e.f. 1.04.2019 and consolidated Final Accounts had been prepared for the F.Y. 2019-20. The figures of all fixed assets of erstwhile NIELIT Ropar were shown in "Additions" column on written down value in the last year balance sheet, as was shown in balance sheet of NIELIT Ropar for the F.Y. 2018-19. The respective original cost of all fixed assets has now been shown in "Original Cost as on 01.04.2020" column in Schedule 5(B) of current year balance sheet.
- iii) There was a major fire incident in June, 2014 in the building occupied by NIELIT Chandigarh (formerly Regional Computer Centre) at SCO 114-116, Sector-17B, Chandigarh. Appropriate accounting entries regarding losses/write-offs in respect thereof have been recorded in the year 2015-16. In the said incident, the Centre lost almost all the records till that date, including Fixed Asset Register.
- iv) During F.Y. 2019-20, Office Building at Ropar was engulfed in floods damaging Building, Hardware, Furniture & Fixtures, Electrical connections, vehicles etc. Insurance claim was lodged with the New India Assurance Co. Ltd. immediately under the insurance policies issued by it, on the basis of assessment of reinstatement value given by various OEM's in respect of destroyed/damaged assets.  
 Despite providing all requisite documents and information in the prescribed formats several times to the surveyor and aggressive correspondence made with the Insurance company, no communication has been conveyed by the Insurance company regarding the assessment or settlement of claim till date. Consequently, after serving a legal notice in this regard, a complaint has been filed before the District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, Chandigarh on 15<sup>th</sup> June 2021 for expeditious settlement of the pending claim. The next hearing in the case is listed on 25<sup>th</sup> Sep. 2023. As the settlement of the claim is under litigation and the admissibility of the claim is yet to be finalised by the insurance company, no income could be booked as the amount of claim receivable as it is still not ascertainable.  
 Depreciation has been charged during the current financial year on IT equipment & other assets which were fully destroyed in floods on 18.08.2019 and these assets have been marked separately in Schedule 8, 8A & 8B, till the approval of their writing off is accorded by the competent authority.
- v) Other payable towards services and others represent cheques issued but not presented whose validity has expired as of the close of the year. The said amount is yet to be credited to appropriate personal/party accounts pending conclusion of the procedure stipulated in this regard. Further, cheques in transit includes Rs. 1,77,517/- relating to past years were under inquiry, which has been concluded but accounting entries shall be passed on receipt of relevant records from the concerned center.

c) In case of HQ

- i) Delhi Development Authority has allotted a plot measuring 4277.88 sq. mtr to NIELIT at Sector 8, Dwarka, New Delhi for construction of its HQ's. Final Cost of the land is yet to be finalized by DDA.



- ii) A Complaint is being filed by Shri Subodh Raj & Ramniwas Sharma in the District Consumer Dispute Redressal Forum, Jaipur. NIELIT has deposited Fixed Deposit amounting to Rs. 21,000/- in the District Forum. Now the matter is pending in the National Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission New Delhi vide Case No. RP/1957/2019. As per NCDRC Portal, date of hearing was fixed for 03.06.2021, but the matter could not be heard on that date due to COVID-19 restrictions. The next date of hearing is 13 Feb 2024.
- iii) There is advance fee received amounting Rs. 1,51,68,120/- which is shown under head current liabilities, this amount is related to the F.Y. 2017-18 to 2022-23.
- iv) GIA (3<sup>rd</sup> instalment of Rs.68,37,000/-) for DoNER project is still receivable from North East Council, therefore amount of Rs. 10,05,419/- is showing under the said head under GIA
- v) GIA for Construction of centre at Roper amounting Rs.6,57,41,280/- remains unutilized for the few years.
- vi) Advance received from CSC/VLE's, Institute, Ministry of Corporate Affairs and Bill Desk Receipts ACCR amounting Rs.77,413/-, Rs.46,645/-, Rs.7,01,559/- and Rs.1,20,800 respectively remains unchanged for the last few years.
- vii) An amount of Rs.6,53,587/- is EPF recovery from employees (Credit Balance).
- d) In case of Aurangabad Centre
- i) From the accounts it is noted that in respect to TDS Receivable accounts there are very old balances from the financial year 2013-14, 2014-15 and 2019-20 to 2021-22, necessary entries are required to be passed Total amount is Rs. 96,12,948/-. Necessary action in this regard to be taken in consultation with Head Office.
- ii) It is observed that in earnest money deposit account and security deposit account balances of various parties are laying in their names since long time. Necessary action required in the matter.
- iii) Aurangabad Centre is to act as mentor centre to look after all the activities to be performed by the Daman & Bikaner Centres. Accordingly, all the financial transactions pertaining to Daman & Bikaner Centre are recorded in the books of accounts of Aurangabad Centre. Separate disclosure provided in the financial statements. Further, Bikaner Centre activities monitored by Aurangabad Centre till Nov. 2022 and thereafter unutilized funds transferred to Head office.
- e) In case of Ajmer
- i) Amount of Rs.4,21,820/- shown as 'Accrued Income' "O level" under Current Assets were pending since F.Y 2015-16.
- ii) Long outstanding liability of Earnest Money Deposit for Rs. 2,30,000/-, Book Fees RET ST SC for Rs. 26,184, Exam Exp payable for Rs. 30,300/-, Training expenses payable since 31.03.2013 on MOPR project Rs.3,32,000/-. Rural Youth Project Rs. 4,96,800/-, Advance from others Rs.25,550/- and BCC exam expense were not explained to us hence remained unverified by us.
- f) In case of Guwahati Centre
- i) TDS, under the IT Act 1961, on interest earned from fixed deposits with banks amounting to Rs 27,08,583/- and TDS from DGET receipts amount to Rs. 15,57,232/- has been shown under other current assets. The same has not yet been transferred to NIELIT (HQ).



g) In case of Imphal Centre

- i) There is one case which is pending before the Civil Judge Junior Division, Imphal East being original suit no. 15 of 2013 in respect of boundary land of the institute.

h) In case of Aizawl Centre

- i) Total liability booked for Gratuity during the Financial Year is Rs. 1,28,79,182/-, out of this Rs. 1,16,28,000/- relates to previous years

i) In case of Shimla Centre

- i) A sum of Rs.2,18,814/- booked under the head of Sundry Creditors is outstanding since 2010 through march 2023. This amount pertains to claim of students under category (SC/ST). The same was not been paid/collected by some students till date and the likelihood of the payment of the same is also not there, and after administrative approval the same needs to be reversed. A sum of Rs. 58,031/- is standing in the name of M/s Sunrise Facilitators Pvt. Ltd., since May,2020 and as per correspondence furnished the party has sent an email to the effect that he has no records with him, and such again administrative approval needs to be taken and the amount reversed.
- ii) An amount of Rs. 7,10,45,971/- stands in the asset side of Balance Sheet under the Head TDS Receivable. An amount of Rs. 2,03,87,077/- pertains to current Year, as per 26AS and the remaining amount of Rs. 5,06,58,894/- is of different previous years.

j) In case of Itanagar Centre

- i) In the month of April 2022, ITC shown in GSTR-2B related to construction of Pasighat Building (Immovable Property) has not been claimed under GSTR-3B because as per taxability of Work Contract under GST, Input tax Credit not available for construction of immovable property, except where the input service is used for further supply of work contract services, which is not the case here.



#### 4. National Population Register (NPR)

##### (a) Contingent Liabilities:

i) Arbitration Petition was filed by M/S SREI Infrastructure Finance Limited before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi at New Delhi against NIELIT for release of payment for data digitization work without deducting the cost of LRUR corrections @4.3% of the digitized rate quoted by the MSP's, as decided by the Governing Council of NIELIT in its 35<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 26<sup>th</sup> September, 2017. The arbitrator pronounced the award on 23<sup>rd</sup> April, 2020 in favor of the claimant for a sum of Rs 11,23,31,726/- together with interest thereon @ 11% per annum from 04.06.2015 till date .

Under Section 34 of Arbitration & Conciliation Act 1996, Arbitration Petition have already been filed by NIELIT to obtain stay and challenge the Arbitration Award dated 23.04.2020. Next date of hearing in the above matter has been fixed on 10.11.2022.

Further, M/S SREI Infrastructure Finance Ltd has also filed a petition before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi at New Delhi against NIELIT seeking execution of Arbitration award dated 23.04.2020 by the sole Arbitrator. The last date of hearing in the case was 04.02.2021 and the Hon'ble court has adjourned the case sine die.

##### In case of Chandigarh Centre

(ii) Civil Writ Petition had been filed by M/s Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd. in Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court at Chandigarh regarding release of outstanding payment of Rs. 6,01,26,368/- in respect of Data Digitization Work of the allotted three Zones i.e. 52, 56 and 57, payment of which was processed by NIELIT Chandigarh, but withheld as per order of Hon'ble Debt Recovery Tribunal, Vishakhapatnam. The final due payment of Rs. 6,01,26,368/- was released to M/s Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd on 03.11.2020 in accordance with orders of Hon'ble Debt Recovery Tribunal, Vishakhapatnam dated 23.10.2020, vide which the attachment orders in IA 327/2018 were vacated. Legal opinions in this matter were also sought from Advocates before release of payment.

M/s Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd has not withdrawn the said case and has filed application in Court to claim balance amount in accordance with a total estimated cost mentioned in Work Contract Letter i.e. Rs. 11,02,16,360/-. M/s Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd has been paid a sum of Rs. 7,11,48,004/- (Rs. 1,10,21,636/- as an advance payment and Rs. 6,01,26,368/- on 03.11.2020) in accordance with decisions of Governing Council, NIELIT in its meeting dated 26.09.2017 in regard to Capping of penalties and quantifying LRUR correction cost. Further, on the last date of hearing i.e. on 04.09.2023, matter has been disposed of in view of the disputed questions of the facts. Also, court added that the parties shall, however, be at liberty to take recourse to the alternative remedies provided under the contract/statute. All the pending miscellaneous application(s), if any, are also disposed of.





Further a Demand/Recovery Notice has been received from Shri Balady Shekhar Shetty, Insolvency Resolution Professional from Bangalore on behalf of M/s. Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd. on 28.09.2021 for release of payment of Rs. 2,81,91,612/- appearing in the Corporate Debtors account of M/s. Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd. Reply of the same was given to Shri Balady Shekhar Shetty, Insolvency Resolution Professional, Bangalore by Shri Shobit Phutela, Advocate, Central Govt. Counsel on 08.10.2021 stating that NIELIT Chandigarh and M/s. Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd. had already settle the issues and there are no outstanding dues against M/s. Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd. by NIELIT towards NPR data digitization work done in year 2013-14. Accordingly, NIELIT cannot comply with the Demand/Recovery Notice and requested to withdraw the said Demand/Recovery Notice.

(iii) M/s Virgo Softech Limited, New Delhi has filed Arbitration Petition Nos. 248,252,255 and 289 of 2019 against NIELIT Chandigarh before the Hon'ble High Court of Punjab and Haryana at Chandigarh for appointment of Sole Arbitrator to adjudicate all disputes, controversy or claim arising out of the Agreement dated 5th January, 2012 signed between NIELIT Chandigarh and M/s Virgo Softech Limited for Demographic Data Digitization for Usual Residents of Urban areas of Zone 6 Panchkula, Zone 23 Moradabad, Zone 24 Agra and Zone 27 Jalandhar. In the above said Arbitration Petitions they have mentioned that NIELIT has arbitrarily imposed penalty @ 25% and withheld a sum of Rs. 3,36,76,262/- and no reason has been given for the deduction. NIELIT had already provided the details of Zone wise payment released to M/s Virgo Softech vide this Centre letter No. NIELIT/CH/NPR-402/2018/8853 dated 01.06.2018. The last date of hearing in the matter was 2.09.2022. The case has been dismissed with liberty to file the same before the court of competent jurisdiction.

Further M/s Virgo Softech Ltd has file Arbitration Petition Nos. 1285,1286,1288 and 1289 before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi for appointing Arbitrator to adjudicate all disputes, controversy or claim arising out of the agreement dated 05.01.2012 executed between the parties after withdrawing the same petition in Punjab and Haryana High Court with Liberty to File Fresh. Matter was first listed on 25.07.2023 (Reply Submitted on 24.07.2023 with advance copy to the petitioner, Petitioner have to file Rejoinder within 2 weeks if any). Last date of hearing in the matter was 14.09.2023. It has been mentioned in the court orders dated 14.09.2023 that the present petitions deserve to be allowed and justice Poonam A. Bamba, a former Judge is accordingly with the consent of the parties appointed as the Sole Arbitrator for adjudication of disputes between the parties arising out the agreement dated 05.01.2022. The fees of the learned Arbitrator will be governed as per Schedule IV of the Act. Before entering upon reference, the learned Arbitrator will comply with Section 12 of the Act.

(iv) Arbitration Petition No. 8 of 2023 filed by M/s Strategic Infra before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi under Section 11 of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act for appointing Arbitrator to adjudicate all disputes, controversy or claim arising out of the agreement dated 19.06.2012 executed between the parties. Justice Pradeep Nandrajog (Retired), appointed as an arbitrator on 06.07.2023 to adjudicate the dispute between the parties. The petition stands disposed of along with all pending application(s). The Claimant has to file claim till 15.09.2023. The next date of hearing in the matter is 20.12.2023

#### In case of Gorakhpur Centre

(v) NIELIT Gorakhpur is respondent in the matter of arbitration between M/S SREI Infrastructure Finance Limited and NIELIT before Hon'ble Arbitration Tribunal of sole Arbitrator Justice G. Rohini against claim of Rs 7,24,77,407.00 which may result in payment of liability in future.



(vi) The liabilities toward NPR project include amount payable to MSP's based on their bills/ invoices. However, the penalties calculated/imposed against the invoices of MSPs amounting to ₹64818991/- kept as liabilities under schedule-8 as Liabilities toward Penalties charged to MSP's as per penalty clause of terms of RFP.

In case of Aurangabad Centre

(vii) As per the agreement dated 09<sup>th</sup> January, 2012 entered with Virgo Softech Limited, New Delhi for the job work of Data Digitization of Zone – 11 Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh and Zone-12, Jabalpur, Madhya Pradesh. However, Virgo Softech Limited, New Delhi has given notice for settlement of dispute and claimed sum of Rs.1,64,77,738/- as amount receivable from NIELIT (NPR), Aurangabad.

In case of Guwahati Centre

(viii) In respect of dispute out of contract dated 15.06.2012 in respect of Zone 2,3 & 4 of Assam for NPR Project, whereby the learned Sole Arbitrator has passed an award in favour of the claimant M/s SREI Infrastructure Limited for a sum of Rs 3,93,29,485/- together with interest thereon @ 11% per annum on the aforesaid amount from 04.06.2015 till award date

However, NIELIT Guwahati filed application against the above judgement in the Court of District Judge, Kamrup (M) for relaxation of interest. The judgement is still pending in the Court of District Judge.

**(b) Current Assets, Loans and Advances:**

In the opinion of the management, the current assets, loans and advances have been stated at the value which will be realised in the ordinary course of business.

(c) Department of Electronics, Information & Technology (now MeitY) vide its letter bearing No: FNo7(2)2011-EG-1 dated 05/04/2011 has entrusted the work of Demographic Data Digitisation & Biometric data collection for creating National Population Register (NPR) in respect of 17 States & 2 Union Territories. RGI vide its DO No;9/83/2010-CRD(NPR) dated 27.06.2012 has withdrawn the work of Bio-Metric data digitisation from NIELIT.

(d) Office of the Registrar General of India had released an advance of Rs 522.24 crore to the NIELIT for execution of National Population Register Project. Total cost towards Data Digitisation (NPR Project) stands at approx. Rs 580.71 crore.

(e) The work of Data digitisation has been completed. The last Digitised Data has been handed over to RGI during October, 2013. However, payment to MSP's (Managed Service Provider) could not be made earlier, because NIELIT had imposed penalty as per the terms of RFQ (Request for Quotation) against the bills submitted by MSP's, which was disputed by MSP's. Further the work of LRUR (Local Register of Usual Residents) correction was also withdrawn by RGI (Registrar General of India). The matter relating to settlement of penalty and LRUR correction cost were taken up before the competent authority of NIELIT. The competent authority had accorded approval, as under:

- (i) That the payments is to be released to MSP's in a transparent and accountable manner after deduction of LRUR correction cost, which has been quantified @ 4.3% of the digitised rate quoted by the MSP's.
- (ii) The cost deducted on account of LRUR corrections to be returned back to RGI.
- (iii) To revise the agreement signed with MSP's on account of change in the scope of work and also terms and conditions related to payment because of withdrawal of LRUR.



(f) In accordance with the decisions of the competent authority, the cost deducted on account of LRUR corrections have been accounted for under sub head Liabilities-LRUR (NPR) under “Current Liabilities and Provisions”.

(g) Interest amounting to Rs 384.32 Crore Earned/ Accrued on unutilised Advance has been earmarked under Liabilities and not accounted for as Interest Income in the absence of guidelines from RGI.

(h) Major fire broke out during June 2014 in the office building occupied by NIELIT Centre Chandigarh at SCO 114-116 Sector 17B, Chandigarh. Appropriate accounting entries regarding loss/write-off in respect thereof have been recorded in the FY 2015-2016. Due to fire, Centre lost all the infrastructures including NPR records/assets.

(i) The work involved in execution of the Project has been completed in 2013 but the payments to the MSP's (Managed Service Provider) could not be made because the penalties levied by NIELIT as per the terms of RFQ (Request for Quotation) against bills submitted by MSP's had been disputed by MSP's. Further, the work of Local Register of Usual Residents (LRUR) connection was later withdrawn by RGI (Register General of India). The matter relating to settlement of penalty an LRUR correction cost were taken up before the Management Board.

On the recommendations of Management Board, the governing council of NIELIT in its 35th meeting held on 26th September 2017 had given the following decisions with regard to NPR projects: -

- a) The Governing Council agreed in-principal to cap the penalties due to delay at 25% of the contract value after subtracting the amounts for LRUR corrections and that other penalties for poor quality of work shall be levied as per existing provisions of contract.
- b) The Governing Council further approved that the payments be released to MSP's in a transparent and accountable manner, after deduction of LRUR correction cost, which has quantified @4.3% of digitized rate quoted by the MSP's. The cost deducted on account of LRUR corrections to be returned back to RGI.

In accordance with the decisions of Governing Council, payments have been made to the MSP's in FY 2017-18 and FY 2018-19 after re-calculating the amount payable keeping in view the capping of penalty due to delay in completion of work by MSP's and direction of LRUR correction cost. The cost deducted on account of LRUR corrections required to be returned back to RGI has been accounted for and shown under the sub-head “Other Liabilities-LRUR Payable to RGI” under “Current Liabilities and Provision” and the amount of penalties deducted while making payment to the MSP's has been booked under the sub-head “Retention Money – Penalty” and “Current Liabilities and Provisions” as per directions received from Headquarters.

(j) In case of NIELIT Chandigarh, Cheques issued but not presented amounting to Rs.8,63,182 represent cheques whose validity has expired as at the close of the year. The said amount is yet to be credited to appropriate personal/party accounts pending conclusion of procedure stipulated in this regard.

(k) Separate Books of Accounts have been maintained by all the NPR participating NIELIT Centres w.e.f. 01.04.2012 in respect of NPR Project & prepared separate Annual Account from the FY 2012-2013.

5. We hereby confirm that the society is not having any amount payable to any party covered under micro, small & medium enterprises as defined in section 7(1) of the micro small & medium enterprises Act, 2006, to the extent such parties identified on the basis of information collected by the management.



6. Debtors & Creditors, loans and advances, current assets and current liabilities are stated in the books at the value which is recoverable/ payable. However, the confirmations from the parties are under process.
7. Figures have rounded off to the nearest Rupee.
8. Previous Year Figures have been regrouped/re-classified, wherever necessary to make it comparable from the parties are under process.
9. During consolidation of various centres, heading/groups has been re-arranged for better and fair presentation.
10. Only material notes as per the understanding of the management in relation to various centre's audited financial statements have been presented in these consolidated financial statements, for non-material notes a reference can be made to individual centre audited financial statements.
