NIELIT being one of the major stakeholders in the FutureSkills PRIME project has also trained nearly eight thousand candidates in various emerging technologies through its resource centres. Currently, twenty eight of NIELIT's courses at various levels are aligned to the NSQF guidelines which cater to the various job roles as per Industry requirements.

Considering the fact that the pandemic has brought digitisation into sharp focus and organisations have been challenged by workforce limitations on their digital transformation journeys, NIELIT is playing a crucial role in bridging the demand gap for digital skills in India, which is expected to grow 20 times by 2024. Keeping in line with the modernising of skilling mode of delivery, NIELIT is also pro-actively working towards creation of a Virtual Academy which will address the demand and supply needs for manpower with requisite Digital Skills to commensurate with the Industry requirements.

To further enhance the skilling delivery ecosystem, NIELIT has been investing in creating modern state-of-the-art lab infrastructure to both develop various indigenous products like Colour Doppler Ultrasound Scanner, IoT Smart Switch Controller among other things and to provide quality training.


It is also worthy to mention about the NIELIT Centres in the North-East where state-of-the-art Digital Forensic Lab in Kohima, Medical Electronics Lab & Solar Energy Lab in Shillong, IoT lab in Gangtok etc have been setup for the benefit of all the NE States.

NIELIT is force multiplying its efforts towards creation of a knowledge based society by forging collaborations with various institutes / organisations of national and international repute like Gautam Buddha University, Greater Noida & IIT Ropar for joint training programs, III Taiwan for joint training program in the field of Electronics, ni-MSME, Border Security Forces for training of BSF personnel in IECT courses, etc.

It is also a matter of pride to mention that various NIELIT Centres like Aurangabad, Kolkata, Kohima, Imphal, Agartala, Calicut, Aizawl and others are implementing / executing various prestigious projects like NIELIT-CII Centre of Excellence for Skills, Skill Development of SC/ST/EWS youths in sixty Aspirational districts across the country. During the year, despite the pandemic constraints, NIELIT continues its commitment towards grass-root digital literacy and completed all the assigned assessments for the candidates of PMGDISHA through the unique remote proctored examination system.

Finally, it is my pleasure to share that despite the various challenges posed by the COVID19 pandemic which impacted the training and capacity building most severely, NIELIT has still achieved a healthy revenue of Rs. 368.87 Cr. with a modest overall surplus during the FY 2021-21. 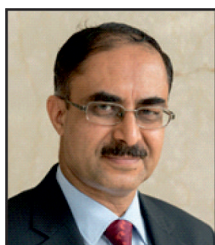

ORGANIZATION MANDATE

National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT), is an autonomous scientific society under the administrative control of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India. NIELIT is actively engaged in Capacity Building and Skill Development in the areas of IECT, FutureSkills; Cyber Law; Cyber Security; GIS; Cloud Computing; ESDM; e-Waste; e-Governance and related verticals. It offers courses both in the Formal as well as the Nonformal sectors and is also one of the National Examination Bodies which accredits institutes/ organizations for the conduct of courses in the Non-Formal Sector. NIELIT is also rolling out IT Literacy Programmes for many State Governments for its employees and the masses.

NIELIT is functioning under the overall control and guidance of the Governing Council. The Hon'ble Union Minister for Electronics and Information Technology (E&IT) is the Chairperson of the Council whereas Hon'ble MoS (E&IT) is the Deputy Chairperson with its members from Government, Industry, Academia and representatives of various professional bodies.

The **Management Board** of NIELIT is chaired by the Secretary, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India. Each NIELIT Centre has an Executive Committee consisting of representatives from respective State Governments, academic institutions and industry for the effective implementation of the decisions of the Board and the Council.

The Finance & Accounts (F&A) Committee of NIELIT is chaired by the Director General, NIELIT and the Committee assists the Governing Council by recommending the Budget Estimates / Revised Estimates and other finance related matters. The Committee is also mandated to scrutinize the Audited Annual Accounts before its submission to the Governing Council for adoption, besides appointment of Auditors. Director General NIELIT is the Chief Executive Officer of the organization. He is supported by Registrar, CFO, CoE and Joint Directors of Technical Wing at HQs and Executive Directors/Directors at Centres level.

The Academic Advisory Committee (AAC) is chaired by an eminent Academician with its members drawn from Academic and Industries and is the Advisory Body on the academic activities of NIELIT.

The Vigilance department of NIELIT is headed by the **Chief Vigilance Officer (CVO)**, a senior officer from MeitY. The CVO is assisted by Vigilance Officers at all Centres and also at NIELIT Headquarters.

In order to promote transparency and accountability, mandatory provisions of the Right to Information Act (RTI) have been implemented in the Institute with effect from July 2005. **The Public Information Officer (PIO)** at Headquarters, as well as, PIOs at all NIELIT Centres have been appointed, as per the requirement spelled out under RTI Act. To deal with the requests under RTI Act, internal procedures have been formulated and the mandatory information has been hosted on the NIELIT website (www.nielit.gov.in). With a view to bring excellence in public service delivery and to redress grievances of citizens in a meaningful manner, NIELIT has also appointed a Public Grievance Officer (PGO), in line with the guidelines promulgated by Department of Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances.

NIELIT has forty-three (43) centers located at Agartala, Aizawl, Ajmer, Alawalpur, Aurangabad, Bhubaneswar, Calicut, Chandigarh, Chennai, Chuchuyimlang, Churachandpur, Delhi, Dibrugarh, Gangtok, Gorakhpur, Guwahati, Haridwar, Imphal, Itanagar, Jammu, Jorhat, Kohima, Kolkata, Kokrajhar, Kurukshetra, Lakhanpur, Leh, Lucknow, Lunglei, Majuli, Mandi, Pasighat, Patna, Pali, Ranchi, Senapati, Shillong, Shimla, Silchar, Srinagar, Tezpur, Tura and Tezu with its Headquarters at New Delhi.

ORGANIZATION HIGHLIGHTS

A. SKILL DEVELOPMENT, CAPACITY BUILDING AND EMPLOYABILITY

The National Policy on Skill Development is aimed towards empowering all individuals through improved skills, knowledge and nationally and internationally recognized qualifications to gain access to decent employment and to ensure India's competitiveness in the global market. NIELIT plays an important role for skilling of youth in the area of IECT, especially in rural sectors. The wide repertoire of NIELIT Courses includes: (a) Courses in the Formal Sector offered by the NIELIT Centres in association with State Universities/Technical Board such as ME/ M.Tech, BE/B.Tech, MCA, BCA programmes; Aurangabad Centre is also facilitating PhD Program in the area of Electronics (b) Courses in the Non Formal Sector in IT, Hardware, etc., under four levels, namely O, A, B and C Level; (c) Short Term Courses in niche areas; and (d) IT Literacy Programmes for the proliferation of Digital Literacy in the country; besides specialized programmes in e-Governance, e-Waste, GST etc. targeted towards empowering the employees of the State Governments and Departments of Central Line Ministries. In addition, NIELIT has also created expertise for the roll out of customized skill development programmes, as per specific needs of public and private sector firms.

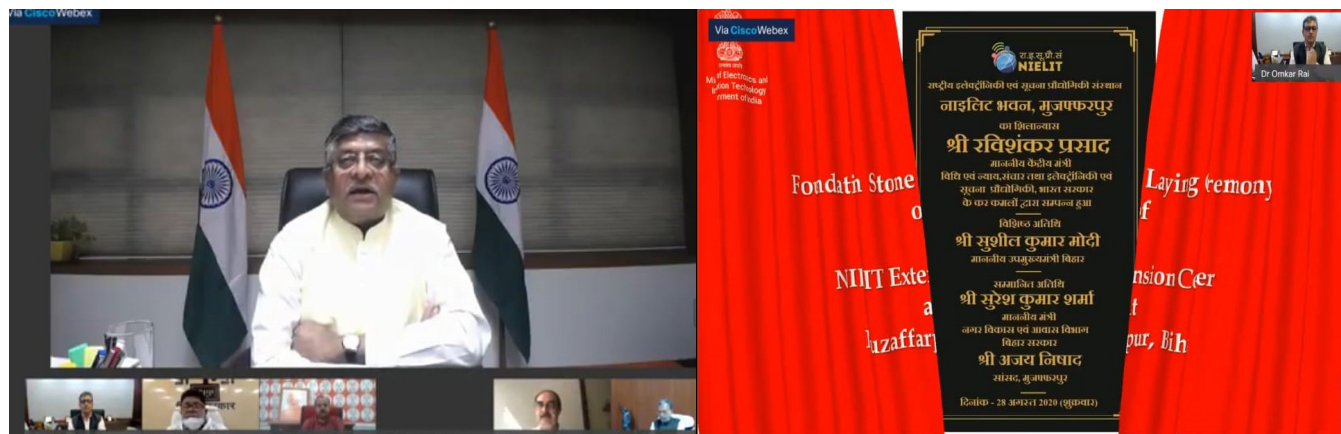

C. BUILDING AND INFRASTRUCTURE OF NIELIT CAMPUSES DURING 2020-2021

With a vision to provide an excellent infrastructure with residential facilities for the benefit of the students from far flung areas, Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India has approved the setting up of permanent campuses of NIELIT Centres in different parts of the country. The new Centres have helped in expanding the NIELIT's reach to the remote areas where other institutes of good repute are not present in the areas of Electronics & Information Technology. Apart from setting up of permanent campuses, efforts are also made to set up Extension Centers in remote areas under monitoring of respective NIELIT Centre at the state. In vision of PAN India presence of NIELIT, efforts are also being made with respective State Governments for soliciting support in form of rent-free built-up space/land.



The **foundation stone of NIELIT Extension Centre at Muzaffarpur** was laid by Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad, Union Minister, Electronics and Information Technology, Communications, Law and Justice, through a webinar on 28th August, 2020 in the presence of Shri Sushil Modi, Deputy Chief Minister of Bihar, Shri Suresh Kumar Sharma, Hon'ble Minister, Urban Development and Housing Department, Govt of Bihar, Secretary MeitY Govt. of India, Shri Ajay Prakash Sawhney and Director General NIELIT, Shri Jaideep Kumar Mishra.

D. DIGITAL LITERACY

Digital India is a campaign launched by the Government of India to ensure the Government's services are made available to citizens electronically by improved online infrastructure and by increasing Internet connectivity or by making the country digitally empowered in the field of technology. Digital Literacy refers to an individual's ability to find, evaluate, produce and communicate clear information through various digital platforms such as smart phone, laptops, desktops etc. Digital Literacy helps people to use technology in complementing their daily routine and become more productive.

NIELIT as the HRD arm of MeitY, is making efforts to bridge the 'digital divide' through its IT Literacy Courses leading to employability of youth, especially for the marginalized section of the society. NIELIT has a range of Digital Literacy courses, namely Awareness in Computer Concepts (ACC – 20 Hours), Basic Computer Course (BCC – 36 Hours), Course on Computer Concept (CCC – 80 Hours), Course on Computer Concepts Plus (CCC Plus – 126 Hours), Expert Computer Course (ECC – 200 Hours) which are recommended for effective proliferation of Digital Literacy in the country and many State Governments have also recognized these courses for employment/ promotion/ increment purposes. Recently, the ACC, BCC and CCC courses have been revised in line with the market demand.

To enable 24x7 learning, the e-Content of CCC course in 25 languages has been developed and made available at the website of NIELIT. As far as Classroom teaching is concerned the course is being delivered by about 10,000+ Facilitation Centres throughout the Country. Besides every month examination for the courses are being held at more than 150 Examination Centres across the country. The course is governed by a complete online system i.e. registration of candidate for examination, receipt of examination fee, conduct of examination, declaration of results and issue of digitally signed e-Certificates. On an average more than 60,000 candidates appear for online examination cycle of digital literacy courses that are conducted on monthly basis.

E. SIGNIFICANT EVENTS/ACHIEVEMENTS DURING 2020-2021:

Adoption of Technology enabled Teaching amid COVID 19

The covid 19 pandemic has forced educational institutions in the country to temporarily suspend the conventional mode of class room teaching. While the pandemic has thrown unprecedented challenges to most of us, NIELIT have handled this disruption in the academic sector by deploying different modes of learning through a mix of technologies and adopting work from home culture.

NIELIT Centres have been actively engaging the students through various mode of online classes like Cisco Webex, Google Classrooms, Moodle, BigBlueButton etc. The practical sessions are conducted on

virtual labs. In order to avoid any apathetic approach towards online learning, the Centres have come up with various features to make online classes friendly and interactive thereby keeping boredom at bay and introducing active learning. Apart from live online video classes, various e-content training material are regularly uploaded in the virtual class room, periodic assessments, assignments, attendance monitoring are done using the Moodle Learning Management System. Query resolution sessions are also scheduled with students. The technology enabled learning has made the student-teacher interaction more productive and effective as the students can login to the e-classes and participate in the lectures in a free and flexible environment. It was observed that in some batches, students average attendance was also increased. Apart from teaching its regular students through online mode, some NIELIT Centres were also helping other educational institutes to start e-classes for their students.

Digital Empowerment of Senior Citizens amid pandemic

NIELIT Centre Haridwar has come forward to digitally empower the senior citizens and homemakers so that they do not have to rely on human interaction and use technology at their convenience as the pandemic has prompted to embrace digital transformation in order to reduce human involvement. The Centre has conducted multiple batches of "One Week Awareness Programme" for Senior Citizens/Homemakers on "Use of Mobile Applications for Digital Payment and e-Governance services". The programme was designed to make senior citizens/housewives aware about the various e-Governance services like e-hospital, various apps launched by Government of India for the benefit of the citizens like Aargya Setu, Jeevan Pramaan, Umang, Bhim, use of social media etc. The participants learnt about different government and non-government online platforms as well as about the precautions and security features necessary for safeguarding against common cyber frauds. The programme is offered for absolutely free of cost and many senior citizens/homemakers have benefitted from the programme and appreciated this initiative.

Online Inauguration of "Awareness Campaigns/Events for Empowerment of Senior Citizens in e-Services through ICT Tools" at NIELIT Aurangabad

Awareness campaigns/events for Empowerment of Senior Citizens in e-Services through ICT Tools at NIELIT Aurangabad was inaugurated online by Shri Sanjay Dhotre, Hon'ble Union Minister of State for Electronics & IT, HRD and Communication, Govt. of India in the presence of Dr. Jaideep Kumar Mishra, Director General NIELIT on 30.07.2020. Under this program, senior citizens are trained in the use of smart phones, online money transactions, awareness about government rules and schemes for senior citizens and other online transactions like IRCTC, MSRTC, Ola etc. The programme is sponsored by MeitY



Schemes for Skill Development in ESDM Sector

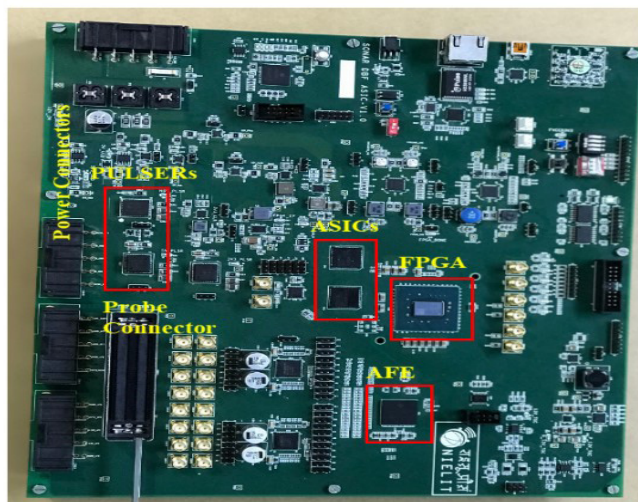
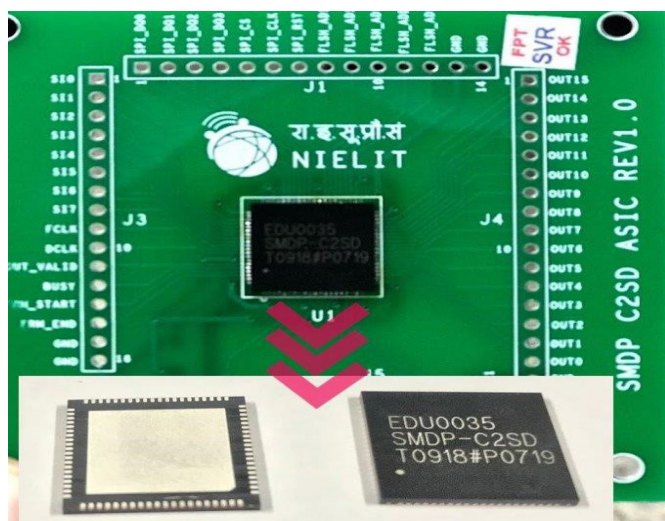
MeitY has approved 2 Schemes for Skill Development in ESDM Sector viz. 'Scheme for Financial Assistance to select States/UTs for Skill Development in Electronics System Design and Manufacturing (ESDM) sector' (Scheme-1) and 'Skill Development in ESDM for Digital India' (Scheme-2). The schemes are aimed towards facilitating creation of an eco-system for development of ESDM sector through skill development of total 4,18,000 persons (90,000 for Scheme-1 and 3,28,000 for Scheme-2). Under these Schemes, skill development training in electronic sector is provided to students and unemployed youth through Training Partners affiliated to Key Implementing Agencies (KIAs) viz. ESSCI, TSSC, NIELIT, HSSC.

NIELIT is one of the KIA. To implement the project, Programme Management Unit (ESDM-PMU) is set-up

by NIELIT which is working under administrative control of HRD Division, MeitY to monitor the project at ground level. Under both the schemes, a total of 3.93 Lakh candidates are enrolled, out of which 3.81 Lakh candidates trained, out of which 2.51 Lakh no. of candidates are certified and 29,997 no. of candidates are placed cumulatively till 31st March 2021. The Scheme duration has been extended up to 31.03.2023.

Processor for Medical Ultrasound Imaging Application

NIELIT Calicut has successfully developed a Processor (Array Signal Processor) or an Application Specific Integrated Circuit (ASIC) for the underwater acoustic/medical ultrasound imaging application. The processor is developed under Special Manpower Development Programme (SMDP) Chip to System Design (C2SD) project of MeitY and is the central processing unit of medical ultrasound/underwater imaging systems. This development is a step forward for India in complex semiconductor integrated circuit design and development. The complexity of the developed processor is 1.6 Million gates in an area of 5mm x 5mm and it operates up to 50MHz frequency. The developed processor is successfully tested on an electronic system board. The developed processor helps the indigenization of medical ultrasound diagnostic/underwater imaging systems and also used for underwater imaging systems targeting defense applications.



Prototype on Indigenous Medical Ultrasound System

NIELIT Calicut has developed & successfully demonstrated the lab prototype of a indigenous Color Doppler Ultrasound System. The prototype system has a touch-based control and display panel. The system supports three ultrasound array geometries (linear, phased, and convex), and based on the application any one of the arrays can be attached to the system and the imaging can be performed. The necessary software for control and display panel configuration is developed using QT/QML. The hardware boards like 128 channel Ultrasound Transceiver, Digital Beamformer and Power Management and Debugger Board Design & Development etc were completed. The 128 Channel Transceiver and DBF board integration is completed and basic B-mode imaging was performed. It is funded by MeitY through a R & D project titled "Indigenous Color Doppler Ultrasound Scanner with PNDT Compliance".



Launch of Online PG Diploma Programmes with Virtual Lab Facility

NIELIT Chennai has launched 3 PG Diploma programs in online mode with Virtual Lab Facility in Data

Science and Analytics, Cloud computing, Information Security and Embedded Real Time Systems. A total of 246 candidates are trained/undergoing training.

Capacity Building on E-Waste Management at NE States

NIELIT Gangtok Centre was awarded a project titled "Capacity Building through Skill and Entrepreneurship Development on E-Waste Management by MeitY. Under the project, state-of-the-art infrastructure for dismantling and segregation of e-waste has been setup at NIELIT Gangtok. Standard Operating Procedures for segregation and dismantling of e-waste items given in Schedule-I of e-waste Management Rules 2016 has also been developed. The infrastructure is being used for hands on training and capacity building of youths from North Eastern States.

Regional Resource Centre in Cyber Forensic (RCFRC) at Kohima

NIELIT Kohima has established Digital Forensic Data Center for sharing of resources such as forensic tools through private cloud and making available the Data Centre on 24X7 basis for NE States with the facilities established offering specialized forensic services. A web based Virtual Training environment was developed to provide hands-on training to LEAs and other stakeholders in the area of digital forensics and cyber security. Further, live Web Acquisition Tool was developed to acquire fake webpages as digital evidence including automated screen capturing. A web based helpdesk to provide and assist the police while performing cybercrime investigations at the crime scene was set up. Also, a web based Cyber Crime Case Management Systems has been developed for storing, preservation, documentation of cybercrime cases that are forwarded by police.

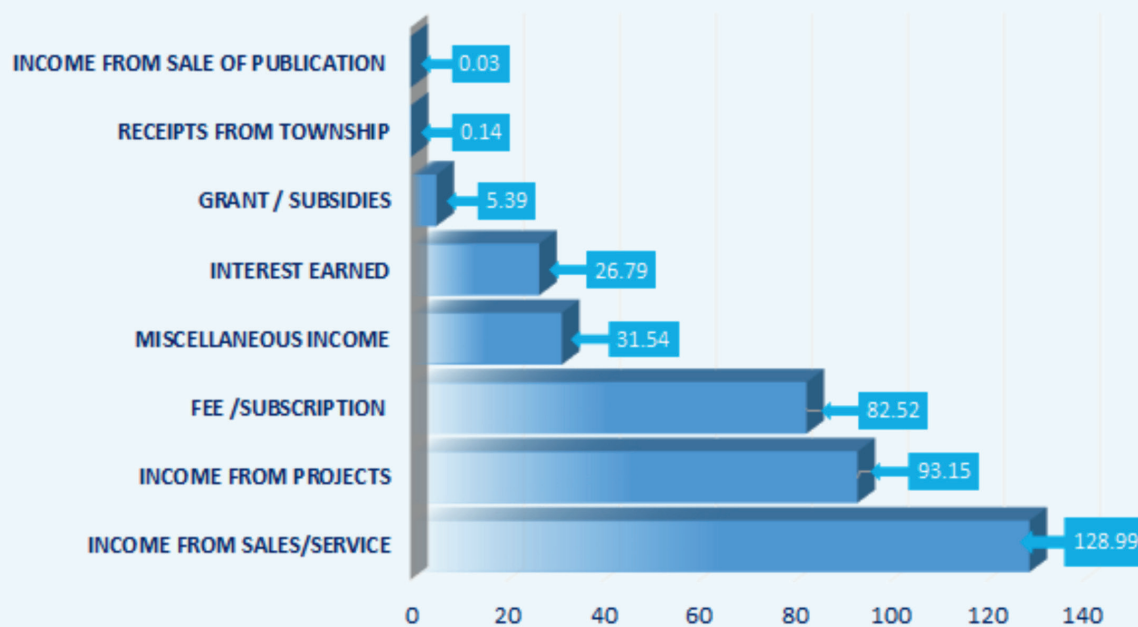

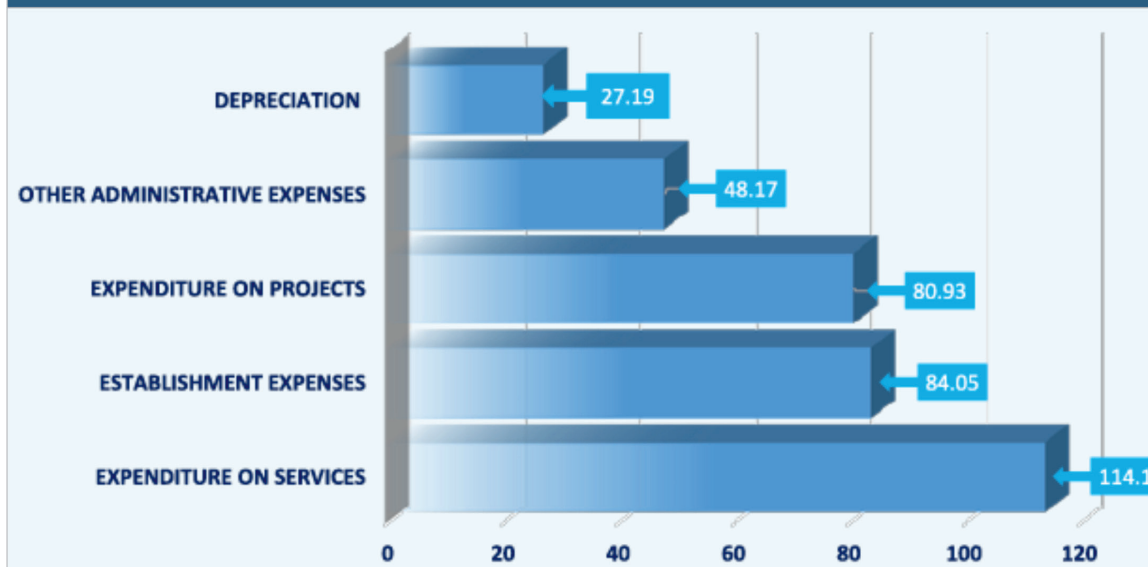
ACTIVITY WISE REVENUE GENERATION FOR THE YEAR 2020-21

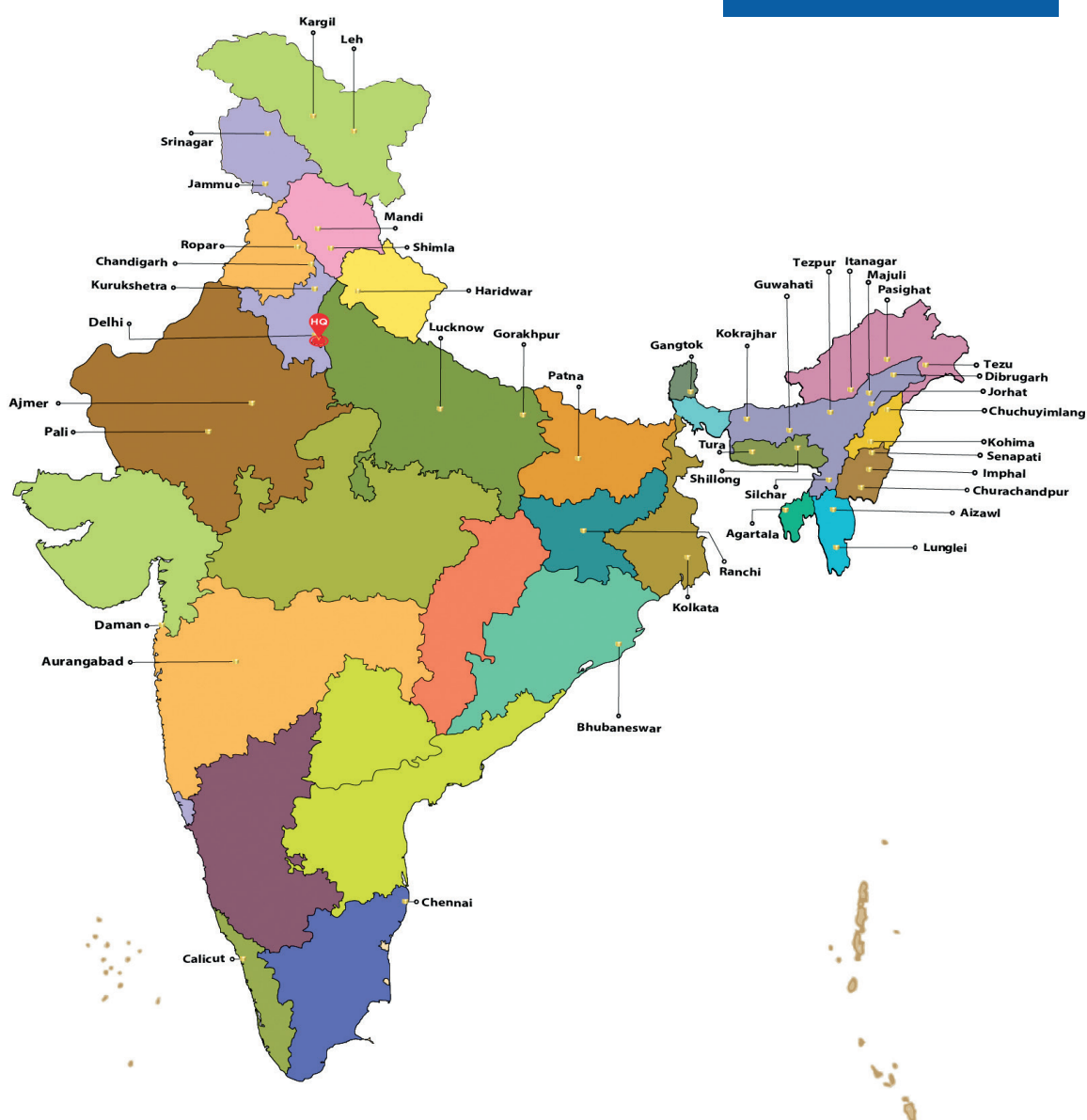

These financial statements have been audited by other auditors whose reports have been furnished to us by the Management and our opinion on the consolidated financial statements, in so far as it relates to the amounts and disclosures included in respect of these centres is based solely on the reports of the other auditors.

In case of Chandigarh centre, New Delhi center, Srinagar and Jammu center, and Shimla center; Attention to Other Matter is drawn by their auditors towards certain matters, reference to such reports can be made.

SCHEDULE 24 - SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The National Institute of Electronics & Information Technology (here-in-after referred as NIELIT), an Autonomous Scientific Society (re-named with effect from 10.10.2011 from DOEACC Society) under the administrative control of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India was set up during November, 1994 to carry out Human Resource Development and related activities in the area of Information & Communications Technology (ICT). The society is registered with Income Tax Department u/s 12A and has been formed exclusively for the purpose to generate quality manpower and develop skilled professionals in the area of Information, Electronics & Communications Technology (IECT) and allied fields, by providing world class education & training and accreditation services. The Society is engaged both in the formal & Non-formal Education in the area of Information & Communications Technology (ICT) besides development of Industry oriented quality education and training in the state-of-art areas establish standards to be the Country's premier Institution for Examination and Certification in the field of ICT. It is also a National Examination Body which accredits institutes/organizations for conducting courses particularly in the Non-formal Sector of IT Education & training. NIELIT is working through its 43 centers. Accounting is being done by Headquarters and its 21 main Centers i.e.- Aizwal, Aurangabad, Agartala, Ajmer, Calicut, Chennai, Gangtok, Chandigarh, Gorakhpur, Guwahati, Haridwar, Itanagar, Imphal, Kolkata, Kohima, New Delhi, Patna, Ranchi, Shillong, Shimla and Srinagar & Jammu.

The following policies represent the consolidated accounting policies of NIELIT including its various centers and also include various material information and material notes to accounts specifically mentioned in various center's audited financials becoming part of this consolidated financial statements of NIELIT

1. **ACCOUNTING CONVENTION:**

a) **Method of Accounting**

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention and unless otherwise stated below on the accrual method of accounting.

b) **Use of Estimates**

The preparation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of financial statements and the reported amount of revenues of expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/ materialize.

2. **INCOME RECOGNITION**

All the NIELIT Centers are following accrual method of accounting except:

- a) In case of Agartala Centre Income from 'ISEA Project-II and DONER Projects are accounted on cash basis.
- b) Calicut Centre- Income from Student Projects is recognized on completion basis.
- c) New Delhi & Guwahati Centre recognized Grant actually received from Government of India on cash basis.
- d) Srinagar/Jammu Center recognized course fees on receipt basis.
- e) In case of HQs, Registration Fee, Accreditation Fee, Variable Accreditation Fee (VAF) and Awareness Creation Fund (ACF) have been recognized on receipt basis.





3. The revenue Grant-in-Aid released by the MeitY to Centers for meeting of Recurring Expenditure has been accounted as income by respective centers, as detailed below:

4. **Investments**

Funds of the Society invested in Short Term Fixed Deposits with nationalized banks have been shown as per guidelines of the Society for "Treasury Management of Surplus Funds".

Interest on Fixed Deposit kept for Earmarked/Endowment Fund received during the year, is being credited to respective Earmarked/ Endowment Fund. Interest on GIA also refunded to MeitY.

5. **Inventory**

In case of Aurangabad Center, it has valued and shown closing stocks of material, components, publications, consumables etc. as per the revised and modified policy of head office New Delhi. The valuation has been made on the basis of cost or net realizable value whichever is lower.

In case of Calicut Center, Store and Spares, Stock of Printing and Stationery, Lab Equipment and Course Material are physically verified during the year management and valued at least of cost and net realizable value.

In case of Chandigarh, Stocks are valued at lower of cost or net realizable value.

6. **Fixed Assets**

Fixed Assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition. In respect of project involving construction, related pre- operational expenses, form part of the value of the Assets capitalized.

- In respect of Calicut Centre, the value of equipment's consisting of 17 numbers of items given as grant to the Centre by UNDP have been shown at a notional value of Rs.1/- on both liability and asset side.
- In case of Kolkata centre Fixed Assets are stated at cost (Gross) less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes \ cost of acquisition, installation, which is inclusive of freight and duty, taxes, incidental expenses. Leasehold Land for 999 years at Sector 1 of Bidhannagar (Salt Lake, Plot No. 267, Block-BF) has been shown under the head "Building" in the Fixed Asset schedule.
- In case of Chandigarh there was a major fire incident in June, 2014 in the building occupied by NIELIT Chandigarh (formerly Regional Computer Centre) at SCO 114-116, Sector 17B, Chandigarh. Appropriate accounting entries regarding losses/write-offs in respect thereof have been recorded in the year 2015-2016. In the said incident, the Centre lost almost all the records till that date, including Fixed Asset Register.
- In respect of Agartala Centre, 15 Acres of Land for building the permanent campus has been allotted by Govt. of Tripura at free of cost, the same has been shown at the Nominal Value of Re. 1/- under the Fixed Assets Schedule.





- e) The Government of Rajasthan has allotted 16.33 Hectares of land at Village Khoda near Kekri Distt. Ajmer for 99 years lease at free of cost has been shown at the nominal value of Re.1/.
- f) In case of NIELIT Guwahati (City Center), expenditure incurred on renovation of building (Civil & Electricals) taken on rental basis for a period of 10 years has been shown as deferred Expenditure to be written off over the period of occupancy.

7. **Depreciation**

Depreciation is provided on W.D.V. method as per rates specified in the Income Tax Act 1961.

Depreciation for current year on "Grant related Assets" is debited to Income & Expenditure Account and also credited to Income & Expenditure Account as per AS-12 and deducted from "Grant-in-Aid - Plan" during the year.

8. **Government Grants**

During the financial year 2020-21, NIELIT has not received GIA (Plan) and (Non Plan) from MeitY.

9. **Change in Accounting Policy**

During the year no such changes took place.

10. **Employee's Benefits**

- Provision for Gratuity is accounted for on actuarial valuation as per AS -15 and employees are covered under "Payment of Gratuity Act 1972".
- The liability of Gratuity in respect of Chandigarh has been covered by the policy obtained in favor of the respective Employee's Trust under Group Gratuity cash accumulation from LIC of India.
- Provision of Leave Encashment is accounted for on actuarial valuation basis as per AS-15.
- Bonus is accounted on Cash Basis.
- NIELIT HQ and Centers have been covered under EPF w.e.f. 01.01.2003 with the approval of the Competent Authority. An amount of Rs 4,03,06,734/- has been deposited during the year FY 2020-21 with RPFC towards NIELIT contribution for regularization of EPF arrears for the period from 01.01.2003 to 31.03.2013 in respect of 219 employees. The balance lying in NIELIT CPF, is being reconciled.
- NIELIT has adopted NPS Scheme for regular employees, joined after 1st September, 2014.

ii) **Other Litigations:**


- a) NIELIT Chandigarh initiated arbitration proceedings against Kendriya Vidyalya Sangathan (KVS) for recovery of dues amounting to Rs.15,66,021/- for providing instructors for School project, appropriate provision in respect of which had already been made in the books as Provision for Doubtful Debts. KVS has not only refuted the claim of the Centre but has also filed a counter-claim of Rs.2,68,650/- as over-payment to the Centre (formerly RCC). Arbitration proceedings are yet to be concluded.
- b) ESI had issued demand notice for Rs.11,22,702/- and Rs.3,03,947/- for non-compliance of ESI scheme for the period from October 2002 to March 2003. Dy. Director, ESI vide Order No. PB.17000399790001013/245 dated 21.07.2011 has directed the Centre for payment of the demand. However, the Centre has preferred an appeal and accordingly Civil Writ Petition (CWP) No. 5441 of 2013 and CWP No. 5367 of 2013 are pending with Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, Chandigarh, though the Hon'ble High Court has granted stay against the recovery of demand as an interim relief.
- c) Against the orders of Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal dated 2nd May, 2014, this Centre filed Civil Writ Petition No. 15204 of 2014 before Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court Chandigarh for recovery of balance amount of wrongly drawn HRA with penal interest amounting to Rs.3,89,642.00 by Ms. Manjit Kaur, Ex. Data Entry Operator 'E'. Proceedings in the matter are in process. The said amount of Rs.3,89,642/- was recovered from the amount of leave encashment payable on her retirement. Ms. Manjit Kaur, Ex-Data Entry Operator 'E' of this Centre had again filed O.A. No. 60/129/2018 before the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Chandigarh Bench for release of withheld amount of Rs.3,89,642/- which was dismissed as withdrawn on 10.10.2018 by the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Chandigarh.

Till such time, the matter is decided by the Hon'ble Court, the said amount of Rs.3,89,642/- has been treated as contingent liability.

- d) A sum of Rs. 43,24,045/- is shown recoverable against Municipal Corporation Chandigarh against Land allotted vide letter No.MC/ESTATE/2002/4732 dated 29-01-2002 which was subsequently surrendered by the Centre. In the absence of any relief provided by Chief Administrator, Chandigarh and UT Administration, Chandigarh, writ petition was filed before the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh, which was also dismissed in default, against which, another writ petition was filed for restoration of the case. The said writ petition was also dismissed as withdrawn with liberty to file afresh on the same cause of action. Based upon the representation sent to Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh regarding re-consideration for allotment of land at Manimajra by adjusting initial payment of Rs.43.24 lacs already released by this Centre in favour of Municipal Corporation Chandigarh and non-applicability of demand note raised towards interest on delayed payment of premium, Ground Rent and forfeiture amount of consideration money, fresh Writ Petition has been filed through Central Govt. Counsel. Notice of motion was issued to Counsel for Chandigarh Administration and Municipal Corporation. The reply affidavit has been filed by the Counsel of Municipal Corporation Chandigarh on 23.09.2019 after being given last opportunity by the Hon'ble High Court.

Proceedings are under process. Appropriate provision had already been made in the books of accounts of the Centre in this regard.

- e) Sh. V. K. Jain, Ex Director Incharge, NIELIT Chandigarh alongwith fifteen other Ex- employees of NIELIT Chandigarh who retired after 01.01.2016 and before 29.03.2018 i.e. the date of issue of Gazette Notification by Ministry of Labour and Employment, Govt. of India vide which maximum amount of gratuity payable to an employee under "The Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972" has been


increased from Rs. 10 lacs to Rs. 20 lacs., have filed O.A. No. 60/1144/2018 before the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Principal Bench, Chandigarh for grant of revised gratuity to the applicants @ maximum of Rs. 20 lacs alongwith interest @ 12% p.a. from respective dates of retirements of the applicants till the actual date of realization. Reply on behalf of Respondents was filed before the Hon'ble CAT. Further Proceedings are under process.

b) Kolkata Centre

- i. RCC Employees Contributory Provident Fund Trust with Income Tax recognition is maintaining PF of employees who have joined NIELIT before 01.01.2004. However, PF of employees who have joined on or after 01.01.2004 is maintained at NIELIT Head Quarter under EPF & MP Act, 1952. The centre has received a notice on 11.07.2006 and order u/s. 7A dt. 09.07.2008 and u/s 7B dtd. 30.01.2009 from Regional EPF authority that NIELIT will cover under EPF & MP Act. 1952 from August 1982. Against the above-mentioned orders, the centre has filed an appeal to the EPF Appellate Tribunal, Delhi (appropriate authority) that our Headquarter is covered under CPF Act, 1925 as per the GOI Gazette Notification dt. 26/07/1997. However, the EPF Appellate Tribunal, Delhi has dismissed the appeal by order dated 3rd August, 2011. The Centre has there after moved a writ petition with the Honourable High Court, Kolkata on 21 Mar 2012. On 17 Aug 2012, The Honourable high court of Kolkata has issued Judgement that "Until further orders, the respondents are restrained from proceedings in any manner on the basis of the order dated 03 Aug 2011 passed by EPF Appellate Tribunal".

NIELIT Kolkata has paid a sum of Rs. 156,854/- under protest against demand of Rs. 6,27,413/- from Employees' State Insurance Corporation West Bengal Region. The demand has been disputed by the Centre.

- ii. There is contingent liability of service tax for Rs. 9,82,620/- (Rs. 4,87,425/- for CENVAT Credit availed on common input service for which assessment is pending till Balance Sheet date and Rs. 4,95,195/- under Rule 6(3) and Rule 14 of CCR Rules, 2004 for which Appeal is pending with Service Tax Authority out of which Rs. 4,95,195/- was set aside by the Commissioner of CGST & C. Ex, Howrah Commission rate vide his order no. 219/S. Tax-11/Ko1/2018 dt. 20.03.18.



Rs. 2,50,81,223/- was paid on account of Service Tax on self-assessment basis and booked as expenses during the previous year i.e. 2019-20. However, some interest or penalty may be imposed by Service Tax Department which presently cannot be quantified.

Further, NIELIT has charged Service Tax on the services provided to Department of Higher Education, Himachal Pradesh in the earlier years when such services were exempted from Service Tax, for this amount of Service Tax paid to the Service Tax Department an appeal for the refund has been filed with the authorities.

- ii) Services provided to Director Higher Education, Himachal Pradesh was considered as exempted from GST till October, 2018 and after that GST was collected and paid to the Department of GST. So, there may be liability on account of GST for the period from April, 2018 to October, 2018.


iii) There are certain GST payments during the F.Y. 2019-20 under its GSTIN where GST amount was less paid or paid delayed along with the late fee as calculated by GSTN but interest as prescribed under section 50(1) of GST Act, 1961 has not been paid/accrued by the centre/in the books respectively, and the amount will be paid along with tax wherever applicable as and when demanded by the Authorities as final payment on cash paid basis.

iv) Some interest or penalty may be imposed by the Employees' State Insurance, on account of delay in employee's registration on ESIC Portal. However, interest or penalty cannot be quantified presently.

d) Head Quarter

South Delhi Municipal Corporation has assessed the property tax with regards to NIELIT(HQ) Dwarka building by applying use factor 4 (being business building) and conveyed the assessment demand of Rs 1,84,06,741/- vide its Assessment Order dated 17.02.2021. However, NIELIT has deposited property tax amounting to Rs 32,72,727/- on 18.03.2021 by applying factor 1.

NIELIT has filed a writ petition in the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi vide WP(C) 4128/2021 on 26.03.2021, requesting Hon'ble court to quash Assessment order dated 17.02.2021, warrant of distress dated 18.03.2021 & 24.03.2021 issued by respondent, direct the respondent to pass a fresh assessment order by treating the subject premises under use factor 1 and allow the benefit of ongoing Amnesty Scheme (2021). Hon'ble High Court vide its order dated 26.03.2021 has granted stay to NIELIT till the next date of hearing.

2. Capital Commitment:

a) (i) Building is constructed at Lunglei Extension centre and at Aizwal centre, total estimated construction cost is Rs 20,62,00,000/- out of which Rs 16,12,15,742/- has been paid till 31.03.2021.

(ii) In case of HQs, Office space at NBCC Tower, Kidwai Nagar has been acquired for Rs.47.01 crores out of which Rs. 46.26 crores have been paid till 31st March, 2021.

b) NIELIT Bhawan for housing HQ has been constructed at Dwarka, Delhi. In this regard, NIELIT has released Rs. 45.07 crore till 31st March, 2021.

3. Current Assets, Current liabilities, Provisions and Loans and Advances

In the opinion of the management, the current assets, loans and advances have been stated at the value which will be realizable in the ordinary course of business, except in the case of debtors where provision for Bad & doubtful debts provided for wherever applicable.


a) In case of Delhi Centre

i) A provision of Rs. 28,60,720/- has been made towards doubtful debts against recoverable of Rs. 1,12,71,327/- from Director of Education, Jhandewalan. This amount is due since 2004-05. The matter is under arbitration. An arbitrator gave an Award dated 27.12.2017 for an amount of Rs. 78,98,437/- and interest @ 8% p.a. w.e.f.23.03.2011 till the date of payment on the above amount to NIELIT by Directorate of Education. In the opinion of the management quantum of provision made is reasonable.

b) In case of Chandigarh Centre

i) Debtors

a) The Chandigarh Centre is having Debtors of Rs. 1103.59 Lacs, out of which Rs. 488.05 Lacs are outstanding for more than 3 years. The debtors outstanding relate to even for the Financial Year 2005-06 and before that. During the audit, it has been found that considering the amount outstanding and its period, some urgent steps for recovery/monitoring need to be taken. However, as the management is of the opinion that debtors are either from government departments or from public sector undertakings and are recoverable, and which includes existing parties also, so assessment for provision of doubtful debts could not be made.


b) Provision of 48.58 lacs had been provided in financial year 2019-20 against the Work Contract Tax (WCT) deducted by PSEB/PSPCL from 2006 to June 2017. The provision was created on the consideration that this amount was not deductible by the vendor as Centre was not registered under VAT and on the same lines no refund can be claimed now for this amount deposited by PSPCL on behalf of Centre. Accordingly, the chances of recovery of this amount are bleak.

ii) Security with Government Departments:

The amount outstanding as on 31.03.2021 is Rs. 15.30 Lacs. It includes certain old outstanding security deposits of Rs. 4.50 Lacs made with different government departments which are due/overdue for refund/recovery. Urgent necessary steps being taken for appropriate action in this regard.

iii) Balance Confirmation/Reconciliation:

Party accounts including debtors, creditors, advance received from students and others etc. remained subject to confirmation, reconciliation necessary adjustment consequent to reconciliation. Impact thereof, consequent to the said confirmation/reconciliation, on the income/ expenditure of the current /previous year(s) and assets/ liabilities, if any, is unascertainable.

iv) As the Centre is working with Govt. Deptts. /Autonomous bodies, so in the opinion of the management, old receivables, which are not provided for or written off, are hopeful of recovery. However, the balances remained unconfirmed as on 31st March, 2021.

v) Amounts aggregating to Rs. 3,99,207.10 received during the year from debtors could not be credited to the appropriate debtor's account for want of relevant information. The said consolidated amount has been reduced from total debtors.


vi) As per HQ Order No.NIELIT/HQ/ADT/38/2019 dated 13.05.2019, books of accounts of NIELIT Ropar were merged with books of accounts of NIELIT Chandigarh w.e.f. 01.04.2019 and consolidated Final accounts had been prepared for the Financial year 2019-20. The figures of all fixed assets of erstwhile NIELIT Ropar were shown in "Additions" column on Written Down value in last year balance sheet, as was shown in balance sheet of NIELIT Ropar for the financial year 2018-19. The respective original cost of all fixed assets has now been shown in "Original Cost as on 01.04.2020" column in Schedule 5(B) of current year balance sheet.

vii) There was a major fire incident in June, 2014 in the building occupied by NIELIT Chandigarh (formerly Regional Computer Centre) at SCO 114-116, Sector-17B, Chandigarh. Appropriate accounting entries regarding losses/write-offs in respect thereof have been recorded in the year 2015-2016. In the said incident, the Centre lost almost all the records till that date, including Fixed Asset Register.

viii) During Financial year 2019-20, Office Building at Ropar was engulfed in floods damaging Building, Hardware, Furniture & Fixtures, Electrical connections, vehicles etc. Insurance claim was lodged with New India assurance Co. Ltd. immediately under the insurance policies issued by it, on the basis of assessment of reinstate value given by various OEMs in respect of destroyed/damaged assets.

Despite providing all requisite documents and information in the prescribed formats several times to the surveyor and aggressive correspondence made with the Insurance company, no communication has been conveyed by the Insurance company regarding the assessment or settlement of claim till date. Consequently, after serving a Legal notice in this regard, a Complaint has been filed before the District Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission, Chandigarh on 15th June, 2021 for expeditious settlement of the pending claim. The case is listed for hearing on 14th December, 2021.

During the current financial year, an amount of Rs. 80,25,228.00 spent on repair of building, Sewage treatment plant, fire pumps & furniture etc. damaged in the floods, which was carried out to restore the capacity of assets to their original position, has been charged to Income & expenditure account. As the settlement of claim is under litigation and the admission of claim


is yet to be finalised by the Insurance company, no income could be booked as the amount of claim receivable is still not ascertainable.

Depreciation has not been charged during the current financial year on IT equipment & other assets which were fully destroyed in floods on 18.08.2019 and these assets have been marked separately in Schedule 5(B), till the approval for their writing off is accorded by the competent authority.


- ix) Stale Cheques – Rs.8,57,898/- represent cheques issued but not presented whose validity has expired as at the close of the year. The said amount is yet to be credited to appropriate personal/ party accounts pending conclusion of procedure stipulated in this regard. Further, cheques deposited but not cleared amounting to Rs.1,77,517.00 relating to past years were under inquiry, which has been concluded but accounting entries shall be passed on receipt of relevant records from the concerned centre.

c) In case of HQ

- i) Delhi Development Authority has allotted a plot measuring 4277.88 sq. mtr to NIELIT at Sector 8, Dwarka, New Delhi for construction of its HQ's and paid Rs 45.07 Crore. Final Cost of the land is yet to be finalized by DDA.
- ii) A complaint is being filed by Shri Subodh Raj & Ramniwas Sharma in the District Consumer Dispute Redressal Forum, Jaipur. NIELIT has deposited Fixed Deposit amounting to Rs. 21,000/- in the District Forum. Now the matter is pending in the National Consumer Dispute Redressal Commission New Delhi vide Case No. RP/1957/2019. As per NCDRC portal, date of hearing was fixed for 03 .06.2021, but the matter could not be heard on that date due to COVID-19 restrictions. The expected next date of hearing is Feb 2022.

d) In case of Shillong Centre

- i) The process for recovery of mobilization advance from Hindustan Steel Works Construction Limited (HSCL) has been stated during the year and actual amount of Rs 2,02,00,000/- has been recovered during the FY 2021-22 through encashment of Bank Guarantee No. 00364IG160000019 from Indian Bank, Russell Street Branch Kolkata.
- ii) The following amounts are receivable, and the matter is dealt with by NIELIT HQ so far as recovery is concerned:
- a) Rs 44,13,004/- (Rupees forty-four lacs thirteen thousand four only) is receivable from MietY against SC/ST claim for providing free training to SC/ST candidates under SCSP-TSP scheme. The financial year wise amount break is as under
FY 2019-20 – Rs 40,73,605/-
FY 2020-21 – Rs 3,39,399/-
- b) Rs 9,64,506/- (Rupees Nine Lakhs Four Thousand Five hundred six only) is receivable from National e-Governance Division (NeGD) for conduction of training programme of different level of officers/Officials of State Government of Meghalaya on Course on computer Concept (CCC) during the financial Year 2016-17.
- c) Rs 7,43,008/- (Rupees Seven Lacs forty-three thousand eight only) is receivable from Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MoDoNER) for conducting training on IT and digital services (including Digital payments and GST) under Capacity Building and Technical Assistant Scheme for State Government Personnel during the FY 2018-19.
- iii) An amount of Rs 48,557/- (Rupees forty-eight thousand five hundred and fifty seven only) is recoverable from 'Gayatri Enterprises' for hiring of computer lab of NIELIT Tura Extension Centre for conduction of JRDO examinations in November, 2019 and MSRLS Online examination in January, 2020.
- iv) An amount of Rs 73,965/- (Rupees Seventy three thousand nine hundred sixty five only) of Infotech solution has been withheld as per instructions of EPFO, Shillong and shall be released after getting the clearance letter from EPFO, Shillong.


- v) An amount of Rs. 40,00,000/- (Rupees Forty Lacs only) has been taken as advance from NIELIT HQ against amount receivable for ST/SC Claim for the FY 2019-20. This amount is reflecting in inter Centre Ledger of NIELIT HQ.
- vi) An amount of Rs. 9,94,030 (Rupees Nine Lakhs Ninety-Four Thousand Thirty Only) is payable to students for caution money collected from them.

f) In case of Aurangabad Centre

- i) From the accounts it is noted that in respect to TDS Receivable accounts there are very old balances from financial year 2013-14 to 2014-15 except for F.Y. 2015-16, necessary entries are required to be passed Total amount is Rs. 40,28,605/-. Necessary action in this regard to be taken in consultation with Head office.

During the year TDS refund received from Head Office total amounting Rs. 45,74,077/- for FY 2016-17, 2017-18 and 2018-19.

- iii) It is observed that in earnest money deposit account and security deposit account balances of various parties are laying in their names since long time. Necessary action required in the matter.

g) In case of Ajmer

- i) Amount of Rs.4,21,820/- shown as 'Accrued income "O level" under Current Assets were pending since F.Y 2015-16.
- ii) Long outstanding liability of training expenses payable since 31.03.2013 on MOPR project Rs. 3,32,000/-, Rural Youth Project Rs. 4,96,800/-, Advance from others Rs. 25,550/- and BCC exam expenses payable Rs.30,300/- and Book Fee return account SC ST (1601) were not explained to us hence remained unverified by us.
- iii) An amount of Rs. 2,25,512/- is outstanding under the head stale cheque account under current liabilities since long which requires suitable action.
- iv) DGET exam debtors includes Rs. 3,99,660/- which is outstanding for more than 3 years. No details for the same were produced before us, hence the same remained unverified by us. An amount of Rs.5,39,948/- is shown as recoverable from Aurangabad center. It is informed to us that nothing is recoverable from that that center.
- v) An amount of Rs. 26,05,325/- is shown under current assets as TDS receivable, which requires suitable adjustments, as TDS is claimed by HQ.
- vi) GST Audit for the F.Y. 2020-21 is under process and not completed till date.
- vii) GST amounting to Rs 5804/- shown as liability in balance sheet (Pali) is not paid till date.

h) In case of Agartala Centre

- i) Accumulated saving fund amounting to Rs 12,95,807/- (Rupees Twelve Lakh Ninety five thousand eight hundred seven only) has been utilized during the FY 2020-21 against the supply order placed for purchase of Capital goods during 2019-20. Due to COVID-19 supply chain was badly affected and goods received during FY 2020-21.



i) In case of Guwahati Centre

- i) TDS, under the IT Act 1962, on interest earned from fixed deposits with banks and TDS from DGET receipts amounting to Rs 15,03,884/- and Rs 10,20,335/- respectively has been shown under other current assets. The same has not yet been transferred to NIELIT (HQ).

4. Utilization of Accumulated Savings u/s 11 of Income Tax Act,1961

1. NIELIT had earmarked an amount of Rs 41,65,77,912.00 during Financial Year 2014-2015 under section 11 of the Income Tax Act,1961.

2. As per Audited Accounts of the concerned NIELIT Centers, against the earmarked Fund of Rs 41,65,77,912.00, NIELIT had utilized an amount of Rs 38,30,15,914/- (Rs Thirty Eight Crore Thirty Lakhs Fifteen Thousand Nine Hundred and Fourteen Only) upto 31.3.2020 (within stipulated period) and balance amount of Rs 3,35,61,998/- has been utilized during Financial Year 2020-2021 as per the details below –

4. In this regards, NIELIT had filed an application with the Income Tax Authorities on 06.01.2021 requesting therein to allow NIELIT to apply the Income of Rs 3,35,61,998/- for the purpose ,it was set aside in the following Financial Year i.e 2020-2021 under section 11(3)(c) of the Income Tax Act,1961 and not to compute it as deemed Income in the previous year 2019-2020,due to circumstances beyond the control of NIELIT(Lock down/COVID).

5. **National Population Register (NPR)**

(a) **CONTINGENT LIABILITIES:**

(i) Arbitration Petition was filed by M/S SREI Infrastructure Finance Limited before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi at New Delhi against NIELIT for release of payment for data digitisation work without deducting the cost of LRUR corrections @4.3% of the digitised rate quoted by the MSP's,as decided by the Governing Council of NIELIT in its 35th meeting held on 26th September,2017. The arbitrator pronounced the award on 23rd April, 2020 in favor of the claimant for a sum of Rs 11,23,31,726/- together with interest thereon @ 11% per annum from 04.06.2015 till date .



Under Section 34 of Arbitration & Conciliation Act 1996, Arbitration Petition have already been filed by NIELIT Chandigarh Centre to obtain stay and challenge the Arbitration Award dated 23.04.2020. Next date of hearing in the above said matter has been fixed on 01.12.2021.

Further, M/S SREI Infrastructure Finance Ltd has also filed a petition before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi at New Delhi against NIELIT seeking execution of Arbitration award dated 23.04.2020 by the sole Arbitrator. The last date of hearing in the case was 04.02.2021 and the Hon'ble court has adjourned the case sine die.

In case of Chandigarh Centre

(ii) Civil Writ Petition had been filed by M/s Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd. in Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court at Chandigarh regarding release of outstanding payment of Rs. 6,01,26,368/- in respect of Data Digitization Work of the allotted three Zones i.e. 52, 56 and 57, payment of which was processed by NIELIT Chandigarh, but withheld as per order of Hon'ble Debt Recovery Tribunal, Vishakhapatnam. The final due payment of Rs. 6,01,26,368/- was released to M/s Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd on 03.11.2020 in accordance with orders of Hon'ble Debt Recovery Tribunal, Vishakhapatnam dated 23.10.2020, vide which the attachment orders in IA 327/2018 were vacated. Legal opinions in this matter were also sought from Advocates before release of payment.


M/s Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd has not withdrawn the said case and has filed application in Court to claim balance amount in accordance with a total estimated cost mentioned in Work Contract Letter i.e. Rs. 11,02,16,360/-. M/s Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd has been paid a sum of Rs. 7,11,48,004/- (Rs. 1,10,21,636/- as an advance payment and Rs. 6,01,26,368/- on 03.11.2020) in accordance with decisions of Governing Council, NIELIT in its meeting dated 26.09.2017 in regard to Capping of penalties and quantifying LRUR correction cost. The next date of hearing in the said matter is 12.01.2022.

Further a Demand/Recovery Notice has been received from an Insolvency Resolution Professional from Bangalore on behalf of M/s Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd. on 28.09.2021 for release of payment of Rs. 2,81,91,612/- appearing in the Corporate Debtors account of M/s Avvas Infotech Pvt. Ltd. Reply of the same is under process.

In case of Gorakhpur Centre

(iii) NIELIT Gorakhpur is respondent in the matter of arbitration between M/S SREI Infrastructure Finance Limited and NIELIT before Hon'ble Arbitration Tribunal of sole Arbitrator Justice G.Rohini against claim of Rs 7,24,77,407.00 which may result in payment of liability in future.

(iv) The liabilities toward NPR project include amount payable to MSP's based on their bills/ invoices. However, the penalties calculated/imposed against the invoices of MSPs amounting to ₹64818991/- kept as liabilities under schedule-8 as Liabilities toward Penalties charged to MSP's as per penalty clause of terms of RFP.

(b) Current Assets, Loans and Advances:

In the opinion of the management, the current assets, loans and advances have been stated at the value which will be realised in the ordinary course of business.

(c) Department of Electronics, Information & Technology (Now MeitY) vide its letter bearing No: FNo7(2)2011-EG-1 dated 05/04/2011 has entrusted the work of Demographic Data Digitisation & Bio-metric data collection for creating National Population Register (NPR) in respect of 17 States & 2 Union Territories. RGI vide its DO No;9/83/2010-CRD(NPR) dated 27.06.2012 has withdrawn the work of Bio-Metric data digitisation from NIELIT.

(d) Office of the Registrar General of India had released an advance of Rs 522.24 crore to NIELIT for execution of National Population Register Project. Total cost towards Data Digitisation (NPR Project) stands at appx Rs 569 crore.

(e) The work of Data digitisation has been completed. The last Digitised Data has been handed over to RGI during October.2013. However, payment to MSP's (Managed Service Provider) could not be made earlier, because NIELIT had imposed penalty as per the terms of RFQ (Request for Quotation) against the bills submitted by MSP's, which was disputed by MSP's. Further the work of LRUR (Local Register of Usual Residents) correction was also withdrawn by RGI (Registrar General of India). The matter relating to settlement of penalty and LRUR correction cost were taken up before the competent authority of NIELIT. The competent authority had accorded approval, as under:

- (i) That the payments be released to MSP's in a transparent and accountable manner after deduction of LRUR correction cost, which has been quantified @ 4.3% of the digitised rate quoted by the MSP's.
- (ii) The cost deducted on account of LRUR corrections to be returned back to RGI.
- (iii) To revise the agreement signed with MSP's on account of change in the scope of work and also terms and conditions related to payment because of withdrawal of LRUR.

(f) In accordance with the decisions of the competent authority, the cost deducted on account of LRUR corrections have been accounted for under sub head Liabilities-LRUR (NPR) under "Current Liabilities and Provisions".





(g) Interest amounting to Rs 331.58 Crore Earned/ Accrued on unutilised Advance has been earmarked under Liabilities and not accounted for as Interest Income in the absence of guild lines from RGI.

(h) Major fire broke out during June 2014 in the office building occupied by NIELIT Centre Chandigarh at SCO 114-116 Sector 17B, Chandigarh. Appropriate accounting entries regarding loss/write-off in respect thereof have been recorded in the FY 2015-2016. Due to fire, Centre lost all the infrastructures including NPR records/assets.

(i) Separate Books of Accounts have been maintained by all the NPR participating NIELIT Centres w.e.f 01.04.2012 in respect of NPR Project & prepared separate Annual Account from the FY 2012-2013.

(j) The work involved in execution of the Project has been completed in 2013 but the payments to the MSP's (Managed Service Provider) could not be made because the penalties levied by NIELIT as per the terms of RFQ (Request for Quotation) against bills submitted by MSP's had been disputed by MSP's. Further, the work of Local Register of Usual Residents (LRUR) connection was later withdrawn by RGI (Register General of India). The matter relating to settlement of penalty an LRUR correction cost were taken up before the Management Board.

On the recommendations of Management Board, the governing council of NIELIT in its 35th meeting held on 26th September 2017 had given the following decisions with regard to NPR projects: -

- a) The Governing Council agreed in-principal to cap the penalties due to delay at 25% of the contract value after subtracting the amounts for LRUR corrections and that other penalties for poor quality of work shall be levied as per existing provisions of contract.
- b) The Governing Council further approved that the payments be released to MSP's in a transparent and accountable manner, after deduction of LRUR correction cost, which has quantified @4.3% of digitized rate quoted by the MSP's. The cost deducted on account of LRUR corrections to be returned back to RGI.

In accordance with the decisions of Governing Council, payments have been made to the MSP's in FY 2017-18 and FY 2018-19 after re-calculating the amount payable keeping in view the capping of penalty due to delay in completion of work by MSP's and direction of LRUR correction cost. The cost deducted on account of LRUR corrections required to be returned back to RGI has been accounted for and shown under the sub-head "Other Liabilities-LRUR Payable to RGI" under "Current Liabilities and Provision" and the amount of penalties deducted while making payment to the MSP's has been booked under the sub-head "Retention Money – Penalty" and "Current Liabilities and Provisions" as per directions received from Headquarters.

6. We hereby confirm that the society is not having any amount payable to any party covered under micro, small & medium enterprises as defined in section 7(1) of the micro small & medium enterprises Act, 2006, to the extent such parties identified on the basis of information collected by the management.
7. Debtors & Creditors, loans and advances, are stated in the books at the value which is recoverable/ payable. However, the confirmations from the parties are under process.
8. Figures have rounded off to the nearest Rupee.
9. Previous Year Figures have been regrouped/re-classified, wherever necessary to make it comparable with the current year figures.
10. During consolidation of various centres, heading/groups has been re-arranged for better and fair presentation.
11. Only material notes as per the understanding of the management in relation to various centre's audited financial statements have been presented in these consolidated financial statements, for non-material notes a reference can be made to individual centre audited financial statements.

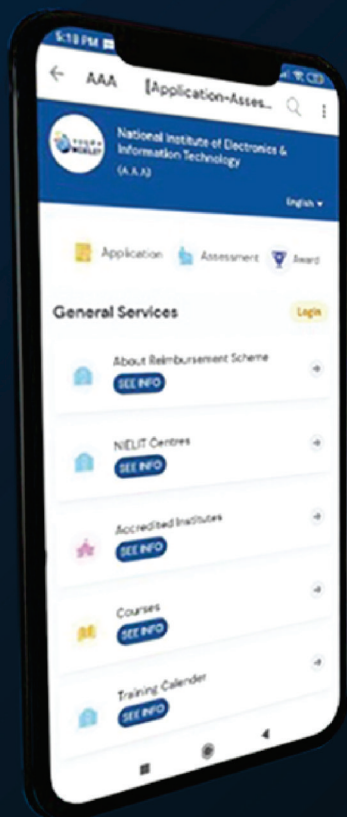
