NIELIT offers courses both in the formal and the non-formal sector of education and is also one of the National Examination bodies which accredit institutes/organizations for the conduct of courses in IT in the non-formal sector.

NIELIT has been mandated to undertake various projects under Capacity Building in ICT with the objective of creating human resources at various levels including development of employment and self-employment linked quality and cost effective training programmes for the masses, especially targeted towards the rural/underdeveloped areas in the country. NIELIT is also the preferred agency for many State Governments for rolling out IT Literacy programmes for their employees and the masses. NIELIT has, over these years, established itself as a premier organization having pan India presence through a network of 40+ own Centres/Extension Centres and a network of about 825+ accredited training institutions, besides a network of about 8770+ facilitation centres engaged in the proliferation and training of NIELIT's immensely popular IT Literacy Programmes, viz., Course on Computer Concepts (CCC) and Basic Computer Course (BCC). NIELIT, Calicut is one amongst the 40 Centres of NIELIT with its Head quarters at New Delhi.[‡]

NIELIT, Calicut is a key constituent unit of NIELIT involved in the Human Resource Development and related activities in the field of IECT, and is the only Institute of its kind in this region, offering professional training programmes for the working as well as fresh engineers to make them more adaptable to the professional requirement of the industry. The Institute also offers state-of-the-art training programmes in different sectors such as VLSI, Embedded System Design, Control & Instrumentation, Product Design & Power Electronics and other allied field in Electronics, apart from IT and related areas. The Institute is also executing various Government sponsored projects for capacity building and skill development of youth in the region with emphasis on employability. Formal courses offered by the institutes leading to award of University degree are affiliated to APJ Abdul Kalam Technical University(KTU), duly approved by AICTE.

The Executive Committee takes all necessary steps to carry out the assigned objectives of the Institute as set forth in the Memorandum of Association subject to the overall guidance and control of the Governing Council, Management Board and Director General, NIELIT. In the hierarchy of authority, below the Executive Committee is the Executive Director of the Centre who is responsible for the day to day activities of the Centre.
