MESSAGE

The Government of India has identified Skill Development as a priority area to reap the demographic dividend as about 65% of the population is below 35 years of age. The Indian IT/ITES industry has been one of the great success stories of modern India. The Department of Electronics and Information Technology (DeitY) has put in place many schemes for capacity building and development of skills in IT and Electronics and the schemes on Capacity Building and Skill Development are primarily being implemented by NIELIT.

NIELIT has not only sustained the high growth momentum but has also surpassed previous records by registering stupendous growth in all spheres. The turnover of NIELIT has risen from Rs. 155.45 Cr to Rs. 240.48 Cr. (excluding NPR) thus registering a growth of over 54% and surplus has also witnessed a growth of over 87%. About 9.6 lakh candidates have been skilled in the FY 2013-14 as against 4.5 lakh in the previous year.

It also gives me pleasure to inform that NIELIT has developed e-Content based training programmes for the Hon'ble Members of the Rajya Sabha.







OVERVIEW

ational Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT), an organisation of the Department of Electronics and Information Technology (DeitY), Ministry of Communications and Information Technology, Government of India, is actively engaged in skill development and development of human resources in the area of IT; Electronics; Communications Technologies; Hardware; Cyber Law; Cyber Security; IPR; GIS; Cloud Computing; e-Governance and related verticals. NIELIT is also the preferred agency for many State Governments for rolling out IT Literacy programmes for its employees and the masses.

NIELIT is mandated to undertake various projects under Capacity Building in ICT with the objective of creating human resources at various levels including designing and conducting Employment and Self-employment linked quality and cost effective education/ training besides conducting IT Literacy programmes for the masses, especially targeted towards the rural / underdeveloped areas in the country.

Over these 20 years, NIELIT has established itself as a premier organization having PAN-India presence through a network of 31 own offices and a network of about 900 accredited institutions and about 6000 CCC facilitation centers. NIELIT's own offices are located at Agartala, Aizawl, Ajmer, Aurangabad, Calicut, Chandigarh, Chennai, Chuchuyimlang, Churachandpur, Delhi, Gangtok, Gorakhpur, Guwahati, Imphal, Itanagar, Jammu, Jorhat, Kohima, Kolkata, Kokrajhar, Leh, Lucknow, Lunglei, Patna,

Ranchi, Senapati, Shillong, Shimla, Silchar, Srinagar, Tezpur with its Head quarters at New Delhi. Recently NIELIT has opened new Centre at Ranchi in Jharkhand which was inaugurated by Hon'ble PM. NIELIT is in the process of opening new Centres at Srikakullam in Andhra Pradesh and Ropar in Punjab.

The wide repertoire of NIELIT Courses includes: (a) Courses in the Formal Sector, being offered by the NIELIT Centres, in association with State Universities/ Technical Boards; (b) Courses in the Non-Formal Sector, being offered by NIELIT Centres and other training institutions that have been granted accreditation for the purpose; (c) Short Terms skill oriented courses by the NIELIT Centres depending on demographic demands; and (d) Training Programs or Corporate Training programs, which are tailor made programs, based on specific requirements.

NIELIT is functioning under the overall control and guidance of the Governing Council. The Hon'ble Union Minister for Communications and Information Technology is the Chairman of the Council. Members of the Council are from various fields / organizations such as Government Departments, Industry, Academia and representatives of various professional bodies.

The Institute also has a Management Board chaired by the Secretary, Department of Electronics & Information Technology (DeitY), Government of India. Each NIELIT Centre has an Executive Committee consisting of representatives from respective

State Governments, academic institutions and industries for the effective implementation of the decisions of the Management Board and the Governing Council.

The Finance & Accounts Committee chaired by the Managing Director, NIELIT assists the Governing Council by recommending the Budget Estimates/ Revised Estimates and Financial Issues/ Solutions of the Organisation. The Committee is also mandated to scrutinize the Audited Annual Accounts of the Institute before its submission to the Governing Council for adoption. The F&A Committee also advises the Institute from time to time in various financial matters and appointment of Auditors of the Institute.

The day to day activities of NIELIT are managed by the CEO designated as the Managing Director.

The vigilance activity in NIELIT is headed by a Chief Vigilance Officer (CVO), a senior officer from DeiTY. The CVO is assisted by a Vigilance Officer at each Centre and also at NIELIT Headquarters. The vigilance activities of NIELIT include the preventive measures which are required to create a healthy and transparent working environment.

In order to promote transparency and accountability, mandatory provisions of the Right to Information Act (RTI) have been implemented in the Institute with effect from July 2005. The Public Information Officers have been appointed at Headquarters, as well as at all the Centres of the Institute. To deal with the requests under RTI Act, internal

procedures have been formulated and the mandatory information has been hosted on the NIELIT website (www.nielit.gov.in). In addition, a Transparency Officer has also been appointed in the organization as per the requirement of RTI Act. Besides this, a Public Grievances Cell has been established at NIELIT to address the grievances and problems of the students and various stake holders.

The statutory instructions for use of Hindi are being complied in accordance with region wise locations of NIELIT Centres. Efforts are being made to use Hindi in day-to-day working by using Hindi computer software, promoting departmental correspondence in Hindi, encouraging staff to use Hindi in official work etc. For the purpose, several employees were deputed for Hindi training under Hindi Teaching Scheme and they were awarded incentives as per provisions. Hindi Divas was organized on 13th September, 2013 at NIELIT Headquarters and its Centres. On the occasion, several competitions were organized and employees were suitably awarded. Non Hindi speaking employees also participated in several activities and were encouraged to use Hindi in their day-today functions.

As per records there are a total of **653** employees on the roles of NIELIT as on 31.3.2014, out of which 5 employees are with Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) and the percentage of PwDs is **0.76**%.


Objective of the course

The 126 hours duration course is a certificate level course, with an aim to equip the workforce entering into/working in government sector with the vital skill set that is necessary to cope up with the ever-changing scenario in IT sphere. The course is designed in such a manner, it not only educate an individual with the basic skill set but also enhances the ability of individual to easily grasp the new changes in the dynamic TI field. The course is aimed at skill development in masses, student, employees in professional sectors at middle level. The course may also be considered as an ideal course for re-skilling of an individual and technological advancement. After going through the course, an individual is expected to be equipped with not only the office automation skills but also with the understanding of the latest technologies and e-Gov applications.

This 200 hours duration course is aimed to assist a prospective entrant into a professional stream with attaining the necessary skills and knowledge needed to compete in today's competitive scenario. The focus of the course is divided amongst the following 4 dimensions:

- Understanding Computer Hardware, Software and its maintenance
- Office Automation-Disposal of daily routine jobs using Office Automation Tools
- Exploring the wide world of Internet and latest technologies in Online services and e-Gov applications
- 4. Personality development with communication skills

The course emphasizes on skill development and latest advancements in the technological world that will help an individual to build up and upgrade skills thereby closing the technological gaps.








Breakup of Income from Internal Resources, Projects, GIA & Interest earned, and Surplus generated in the last five years




INCOME V/s EXPENDITURE

- 1. We have audited the attached Balance Sheet of National Institute of Electronics & Information Technology, Electronics Niketan, 6, C.G.O. Complex, New Delhi 110003, a society registered under the Society Registration Act 1860, as at 31st March, 2014 and also the Income Expenditure Account for the year ended on that date annexed thereto in which are incorporated the returns of NIELIT Scheme, National Population Register (NPR) and 18 centres Aizwal, Aurangabad, Calicut, Gorakhpur, Imphal, Srinagar & Jammu, Tezpur/Guwahati, Kolkata, Chandigarh, Kohima, Chennai, Agartala, Shillong, Gangtok, Ajmer, Patna & Itanagar audited by other auditors and the New Delhi centre audited by us, the material observation of whom have been appropriately considered. These financial statements are the responsibility of the society's management. Our responsibility is to express our opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.
- 2. We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standard generally accepted in India. Those standards required that we plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of misstatements. An audit includes examining on test basis, evidence supporting the amount and disclosure in the financial statements and audit also includes assessing the accounting principle used and significant estimates made by the management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statements presentation. We believe that our audit provides a reasonable basis for our opinion
- 3. We further report as under:.

i) As reported by the Branch Auditor of the NIELIT Chandigarh Centre:

"There was a major fire on 8th June 2014 in which the building at SCO 114-16 was completely destroyed and building at SCO 117-18 was declared unsafe and not accessible for entering. On account of this reason, all infrastructure and entire records relating to accounts and administration have been completely destroyed/are inaccessible. The final accounts of NIELIT Chandigarh for the financial year 2013-14 have been prepared on the basis of available Tally back up which was reportedly stored on the pen drive available with the accounts official and a few records which could be obtained from outside parties such as banks.

Since, no account book could be made available for our verification, we have carried out the audit on the basis of back up data made available to us and whatever records could be made available. All the vouchers, bank book, books of accounts could not be made available for audit as the same were destroyed in fire."

Due to loss caused by fire at NIELIT Chandigarh on 8th June 2014, the reliable estimate of the financial effect/Loss cannot be made as per AS-4. Further we are unable to comment upon the Impairment of Assets as per AS-28.

- ii) Party account(s) are subject to confirmation.
- iii) Provision for doubtful debts of Rs. 30,45,795/- only has been made in the books of Delhi Centre (earlier part of Chandigarh Centre) against total debts of Rs. 1,88,22,885/- and a sum of Rs. 25,66,547/- only in the books of Chandigarh Centre against total debts of Rs. 216.44 Lakhs, which are outstanding for more than three years.
- iv) While employing Consultants, the norms as stipulated by Manual of Policies and Procedures of Employment of Consultants issued by Ministry of Finance, Dept. of Expenditure dated 31.08.2006 are not being adhere to strictly.
- 4. Further to our comments in paragraph 3 above and Notes to the Accounts, we report o that:
 - A. We have obtained all the information and explanation, which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit.
 - B. In our opinion, proper books of accounts as required by law have been kept by the society so far as appears from our examination of those books.
 - C. The Society's Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of accounts maintained at the Head Quarter at New Delhi and at respective centres.
 - D. In our opinion, Balance. Sheet, Income & Expenditure Account dealt with by this report comply with the accounting standards issued by ICAL.
 - E. In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the said Balance Sheet and Income & Expenditure account read together with notes thereon, give a true and fair view:-
 - In the case of the Balance Sheet, of the state of affairs of the society as at 31st March, 2014 and
 - ii) In the case of the Income & Expenditure Account of the Excess of the Income over Expenditure of its accounting period ending on 31st March, 2014.
 - iii) In the case of Receipt and Payment account, of the receipts and payments for the period ending on 31st March, 2014.

SIGNIFICANCE OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1. a) Method of Accounting

The Accounts have been prepared under the historical Cost Convention and on accrual basis as per applicable Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.

b) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of financial statements and the reported amount of revenues of expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known / materialized.

2. Income Recognition

- i) The Income is derived from the following main activities:-
 - a) Conduct of Examination for DOEACC Computer Courses at O/A/B/C levels, Conduct of Examination of CCC Computer course and Accreditation fee from Accredited Institutes.
 - b) Conduct of Long Term and Short Term Courses in the area of Information Electronics & Communications Technology (IECT) by DOEACC Centres
 - c) Income from Services- Industrial/Educational Consultancy fee, Data processing Charges etc.
 - d) Income From Projects sponsored by Diety, DONER and other Agencies
- ii) Income is recognized on accrual basis as per AS-9 except Accreditation Fees, Variable Accreditation Fees (VAF) and Awareness Creation Fund (ACF) have been accounted for on cash basis.

3. Inventories

All goods, stores, stationery & consumables which are not consumed, are taken as closing stock at the year

end as per AS-2 i.e. cost or net realization value whichever is lower. All Centres have not followed the policy, except Aurangabad, Calicut, Chandigarh, and DOEACC Scheme

4. Fixed Assets

 Fixed Assets are stated at cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties & taxes and incidental & direct expenditure related to acquisition. Fixed Assets have been re-grouped and re-classified wherever necessary.

5. Depreciation

- a) Depreciation has been provided on written down value method as per the rate specified in Income Tax Act, 1961. In case of NILEIT HQ, depreciation is provided for full year on the additions made during the year.
- b) Depreciation on Assets purchased out of Capital Grant-in-Aid have been treated as Non Operating income and shown under "Miscellaneous Receipts".

6. Governments Grants

- a) Capital Grants-in-Aid are shown as net of depreciation on the Fixed Assets procured out of such Grant.
- b) Treatment of Grant-in-Aid received from DietY has been made in the Accounts as per Accounting Standard - 12 issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India.
- c) Government Grants/Subsidy is accounted on realization basis.
- d) Grant received for specific project is utilized for that project and unutilized grant is showing in the Balance Sheet.

Notes on Accounts

1. The NIELIT, an Autonomous Scientific Society (re-named with effect from 10.10.2011 from DOEACC Society) under the administrative control of Department of Electronics and Information Technology (Deity), Ministry of Communications and Information Technology, Government of India was set up during November, 1994 to carry out Human Resource Development and related activities in the area of Information & Communications Technology (ICT). The society is registered with Income Tax Department u/s 12A and has been formed exclusively for the purpose to generate quality manpower and develop skilled professionals in the area of Information, Electronics & Communications Technology (IECT) and allied fields, by providing world class education & training and accreditation services. The Society is engaged both in the formal & Non formal Education in the area of Information & Communications Technology (ICT) besides development of Industry oriented quality education and training in the state-of-art areas establish standards to be the Country's premier Institution for Examination and Certification in the field of ICT. It is also a National Examination Body which accredits institutes/organizations for conducting courses particularly in the Non formal Sector of IT Education & training.

2. Income Recognition

- a) The Calicut Centre is following accrual method of accounting except in case of Income from student Projects. The Itanagar Centre is following cash basis of Accounting for the course fee income. The Gorakhpur Cetre is following cash basis of accounting for Fees of SC/ST students at the time of reimbursement of Grant.
- b) The Chandigarh Centre has followed accrual method except in the case of work relating to data processing/billing, facility management and related expenditure thereto which are based on billing cycle.
- c) The Grant-in-Aid released by the DietY for setting up of New Centres for meeting of Recurring Expenditure has been accounted for, as detailed below:-

- a) Funds of the Society are invested in Short Term Fixed Deposits with different scheduled nationalized banks and are shown as per guidelines for - "Treasury Management of Surplus Funds" of the Society.
- b) Interest on Fixed Deposit kept for Earmarked/ Endowment Fund received during the year, is being credited in respective Earmarked/Endowment Fund.

4. Fixed Assets

a) Fixed Assets are shown at cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes etc. less depreciation.

All expenses relating to civil repairing, alteration electrical works and other miscellaneous expenses relating thereto has been shown as deferred expenditure to be written off over the period of occupancy and being amortized @ 20% w.e.f. Financial Year 2011-12
- g) In respect of Shillong Centre, Building for the initial training facility of the Centre has been allotted by the Govt. of Meghalaya State Housing and Financing Corporation Society Ltd. (MSHFCS) for four years. All expenses relating to civil repairing, alteration electrical works and other miscellaneous expenses relating thereto has been shown as deferred expenditure to be written off over the period of occupancy.
- h) In respect of Chandigarh, there was a major fire on 08th June, 2014 in which the building at SCO- 114-116 was completely destroyed and building at SCO-117-18 was declared unsafe and not accessible for entering. On account of this reason, all infrastructure and entire records relating to Accounts and Administration have been completely destroyed/ are inaccessible. The final

- i) In respect of Imphal Centre, the Govt. has approved for setting up of two extension Centres at Senapati and Churachandpur. The State Govt. of Manipur will provide 5 acres of land/ preferably built up space of 8000 sq ft. for each of the extension Centres. In case of non availability of such space, the same has been taken on rent for maximum 5 years and budgetary allocation of Rs. 12.00 lakhs per annum is provided.
 - For the Churachandpur extension Centre, the State Govt. has provided temporary space at Churchandpur High School free of cost. Rs. 2.93 lakhs has been spent on repair and renovation for making it useful to conduct classes. The expenditure has met out of balance GIA of Rs. 50.00 lakhs sanctioned and released during previous year. For Senapati Centre, an amount of Rs. 1.58 lakh has been spent on building rent.
- j) In respect of Guwahati Centre, the land allotted by the Govt. of Assam for construction of the permanent campus at free of cost at Guwahati Main (3 acres), Kokrajhar Ext. Centre (6 Acres) and Jorhat Ext. Centre (3 Acres) has been shown at nominal value of Re1 in each case.
- k) The Government of Rajasthan has allotted 16.33 Hectares of land at Village Khoda near Kekri Distt. Ajmer for 99 years lease at free of cost has been shown at the nominal value of Rs.1/-.
- The Vehicle have been transferred from Aurangabad Centre to HQ for official use in previous year. However, it's value has been shown in the books of Aurangabad Centre.
- m) The Aizwal Centre has deducted capital Expenditure of Rs.59,96,872/- from GIA received for Projects. A separate schedule of Fixed Assets has not been prepared.

5. Depreciation

 a) Depreciation for current year on "Grant related Assets" amounting to Rs. 7,31,95,123/- has been debited to

6. Government Grants

- a) The Grant-in-Aid (Plan) of Rs. 763.87 lakhs for the year 2013-14 has been accounted for on actual receipt basis. Capital Grants are credited to Capital Fund of the respective Centre.
- b) The Grant-in-Aid released by the DietY for setting up of New Centres for meeting of Expenditure (Capital/ Recurring) has been accounted for, as detailed below:-

- e) Capital Grants-in-Aid are shown as net of depreciation on the fixed Assets procured out of such Grant.

7. Employee's Benefits

- a) Provision for Gratuity is accounted for on actuarial valuation as per AS -15. The liability of Gratuity in respect of Calicut, Chandigarh and has been covered by the policy obtained in favor of the respective Employee's Trust under Group Gratuity cash accumulation from LIC of India. DOEACC Scheme employees covered under the existing Gratuity scheme as on 14.12.2002 i.e. on month emoluments (Pay + Grade Pay) for each employee, for each completed year of Service.
- b) Provision of Leave Encashment is accounted for on actuarial valuation basis as per AS-15.
- c) NIELIT HQ and Centres have been covered under EPF w.e.f. 01.01.2003 with the approval of the Competent Authority. EPF Contributions from April, 2013 onwards

have been deposited paid to EPF Office. The arrears of EPF for the period from 01.01.2003 to 31.03.2013 are being processed/calculated for deposit to EPF Office. The balances lying in DOEACC CPF Trust will be adjusted towards payment arrears of EPF for the period from 01.01.2003 to 31.03.2013.

8. Current Assets, Loans and Advances

- The current assets, loans and advances have a value on realization, in the ordinary course of business, equal to aggregate amount shown in the Balance Sheet.
- b) Debit and credit balances of parties are subject to confirmation.
- c) Advances Recoverable includes a sum of Rs. 15,69,24,605/- is refundable from Income Tax Department.
- d) The Deity has released GIA of Rs.6,41,92,000/- to NIELIT for implementation of the project "Setting up of Intranet of NIELIT and Smart Virtual class rooms at NIELIT Centres for quality training to students in remote areas" jointly by NIELIT Centres and ERNET India, New Delhi and interest earned thereon of Rs.9,61,644/- till 31.03.2013. The NIELIT has also released advance of Rs.6,44,00,000 to ERNET for completion of Project.
- 9. No vendor has informed to us regarding their status under "The Micro, Small and medium Enterprises Development Act,2006." And hence disclosures regarding amounts unpaid as at the year end together with interest payable, if any, under this Act has not been given.
- 10. The Chandigarh Centre has filed writ petition with the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh for obtaining sufficient financial relief for getting refund of Rs.43,24,045/- deposited with Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh, against surrender of land allotted to the Centre, which is still pending.
- The HQ is taking efforts to adjust advance of Rs.99,319/pertaining to CPWD.
- 12. There are no Assets impaired during the year as per AS-28 except in case of Aurangabad centre.
- 13. In respect of Gangtok Centre, salary amounting to Rs. 8,39,272/- and manpower expenses amounting to Rs. 82,074/- borne by the Centre for the employees of

Kolkata Centre devoted their time for the Gangtok Project. Thus the same amount of salary and manpower expenses is to be debited to Gangtok Centre and credited to Kolkata Centre.

14. During the year 2013-14, Patna Centre has been incorporated and demerged from the Gorakhpur Centre.

15. Contingent Liability:

a) Aurangabad Centre

M/s DVIIT, Aurangabad has lodged the claim of Rs. 72.00 lakhs against the Centre. The Hon'ble CJSD, Aurangabad has passed orders dismissing the case. However, we understand that M/s DVIIT is in the process of filing appeal against the Court Orders.

- ii) Claim filed by Kurukeshetra University for recovery of Rs. 41,62,000/- in the Civil Court at Kurukeshetra regarding appointment of Arbitrator for adjudication.
- iii) Amount of Rs. 2,68,650/- claimed by KVS regarding disputed over-payment made by them to the Centre (Formerly RCC) for providing instructors for school project.
- iv) The Centre had signed MoU in July, 2003 with National Council for Promotion of Urdu Language, New Delhi, (NCPUL) for implementing One year Course on Diploma in Computer Applications and Multilingual DTP. An amount of Rs. 32.14 lakhs is receivable for the year 2006-07, which includes service tax of Rs.17.14 lakhs. Since the matter in pending before arbitrator, the centre liability is to the extent of service tax of Rs.17.14 lakhs. The total amount payable to agencies is Rs.125.00 lakhs. The Centre has received a notice on 11.07.2006 and order u/s.7A dated 09.07.2008 and u/s 7B dated 30.01.2009 from Regional EPF authority that DOEACC will be covered under EPF & MP Act. 1952 from August 1982. Against the above mentioned orders the Centre has filed an appeal to the EPF Appellate Tribunal, Delhi (appropriate authority) that our Head quarter is covered under CPF Act.1925 as per GOI Gazette Notification dated 26.07.1997. However, the EPF Appellate Tribunal, Delhi has dismissed the appeal by order dated 03rd August, 2011. The Centre has there after filled an appeal with the Honorable High Court, Kolkata against the aforesaid order, on 21st March, 2012. The said appeal is still pending.

NIELIT Kolkata has paid a sum of Rs. 1,56,854/- under protest against demand of Rs. 627413/- from Employees State Insurance Corporation West Bengal Region. The demand has been disputed by the Centre.

There is a contingent liability of Rs. 19,67,385/-regarding Service Tax as per show cause notice dated 21/10/2013 received from Additional Commissioner of Service Tax which has been disputed by the centre vide letter dated 21/04/2014.

18. National Population Register (NPR)

- (1) Department of Electronics, Information & Technology vide its letter bearing No: FNo7(2)2011-EG-1 dated 05/04/2011 has entrusted the work of Demographic Data Digitisation & Bio-metric data collection for creating National Population Register(NPR) in respect of 17 States & 2 Union Territories. RGI vide its DO No;9/83/2010-CRD(NPR) dated 27.06.2012 has withdrawn the work of Bio-Metric data digitisation from NIELIT.
- (2) Office of the Registrar General of India had released an advance of Rs.522.24 crore to the NIELIT for execution of

National Population Register Project. Total liability towards Data Digitisation (NPR Project) stands at approximately of Rs 571.00 crore. As per payments terms of RFQ, balance 30% payment of MSP's will be released after completion of LRUR corrections, which may take 2-3 years of time. As on 31.03.2014, an amount of Rs 220.35 crore has already been utilized. The balance amount of Rs 428.74 crore is available (including interest of Rs 104.47 Crore Earned/ Accrued at HQ.) in various bank Accounts (Saving/Current) and in the form of Deposits.

- (3) The work of Data digitisation has been completed. The last Digitised Data has been handed over to RGI during October.2013.
- (4) Separate Books of Accounts have been maintained by all the NPR participating Nielit Centres w.e.f 01.04.2012 in respect of NPR project & prepared separate Annual Account from the Financial Year 2012-13.
- (5) Penalty amounting to Rs 29,98,19,281/-has been calculated against the Invoices of MSP's in respect of Rural Zones of Aurangabad centre by M/S CSC-SPV. In the books of Aurangabad Centre an amount of Rs 1,49,86,724/- has been accounted for as penalty, since penalty amount is disputed.
- (6) An Amount of Rs. 4,35,33,628/- deducted in current year on account of Penalties out of MSPs' invoices by NPR participating NIELIT centres has been shown under the head Retention Money-Penalty in Schedule 7 resulting reducing the income by said amount. The total amount outstanding as on 31st March 2014 is Rs. 17,50,45,375/-.
- 19. Financial statements have been revised based upon the recommendation of Finance and Accounts committee that the surplus and interest earned from NPR project funds should not be utilized for any other purpose till completion /closure of the project. Accordingly, amount of surplus of Rs. 17.18 crores in respect of Chandigarh Centre has now been shown as Current Liabilities by reducing the Corpus Fund of the main Chandigarh Centre's Account.
