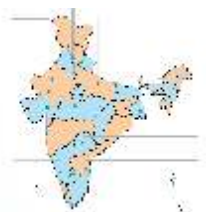

HIGHLIGHTS

A. ORGANIZATION MANDATE

National Institute of Electronics and Information Technology (NIELIT) is an autonomous scientific society under the administrative control of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India. NIELIT is actively engaged in Capacity Building and Skill Development in the areas of Information Technology (IT); Electronics; Communication Technologies; Hardware; Cyber Law; Cyber Security; Geographic Information System (GIS); Cloud Computing; Electronics System Design & Manufacturing (ESDM); e-Waste; Internet of Things (IoT); Big Data; Block Chain; Data Analytics; e-Governance and related verticals. It offers courses both in Formal as well as Non-Formal Sectors and is also one of the National Examination Bodies. NIELIT accredits institutes/ organizations for the conduct of courses in the Non-Formal Sector. NIELIT is also rolling out IT Literacy Programmes for many State Governments for its employees and the masses.

NIELIT came into existence in the year 1995 as erstwhile DOEACC Society. In December 2002, RCC, Chandigarh; RCC, Kolkata; and CEDTIs located at Aurangabad, Gorakhpur, Calicut, Imphal, Aizwal, Tezpur/Guwahati and Srinagar/Jammu were merged with the DOEACC Society. After the merger, the mandate of the Society was to carry out HR development and related activities in the area of Information, Electronics and Communication Technology (IECT), as the HRD arm of MeitY. The DOEACC Society was renamed as NIELIT in October 2011.

NIELIT is functioning under the overall control and guidance of the **Governing Council**. The Hon'ble Union Minister for Electronics and Information Technology (E&IT) is the Chairperson of the Governing Council and the Hon'ble MoS (E&IT) is the Deputy Chairperson. The other members of the Governing Council are drawn from Government, Industry, Academia and representatives of various professional bodies.

The **Management Board** of NIELIT is chaired by the Secretary, Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India. Each NIELIT Centre has an **Executive Committee** consisting of representatives from respective State Governments, Academic Institutions and Industry for the effective implementation of the decisions of the Management Board and the Governing Council.

The **Finance & Accounts (F&A) Committee** of NIELIT is chaired by the Director General, NIELIT and the Committee assists the Governing Council by recommending the Budget Estimates / Revised Estimates and other finance related matters. The Committee scrutinize the Audited Annual Accounts before its submission to the Governing Council for adoption, besides appointment of Auditors. Director General NIELIT is the Chief Executive Officer of the organization. He is supported by Registrar, CFO, CoE and Director(Tech) at HQs and Executive Director/Director at Centres level.

The Vigilance Section of NIELIT is headed by the **Chief Vigilance Officer (CVO)**, a senior officer from MeitY. The CVO is assisted by Vigilance Officers at all Centres and also at NIELIT Headquarters.

In order to promote transparency and accountability, mandatory provisions of the Right to Information Act (RTI) have been implemented in the Institute with effect from July 2005. The **Public Information Officer (PIO)** at Headquarters, as well as, PIOs at all NIELIT Centres have been appointed, as per the requirement spelled out under RTI Act. To deal with the requests under RTI Act, internal procedures have been formulated and the mandatory information has been hosted on the NIELIT website (www.nielit.gov.in). With a view to bring excellence in public service delivery and to redress grievances of citizens in a meaningful manner, NIELIT has also appointed a **Public Grievance Officer (PGO)**, in line with the guidelines promulgated by Department of

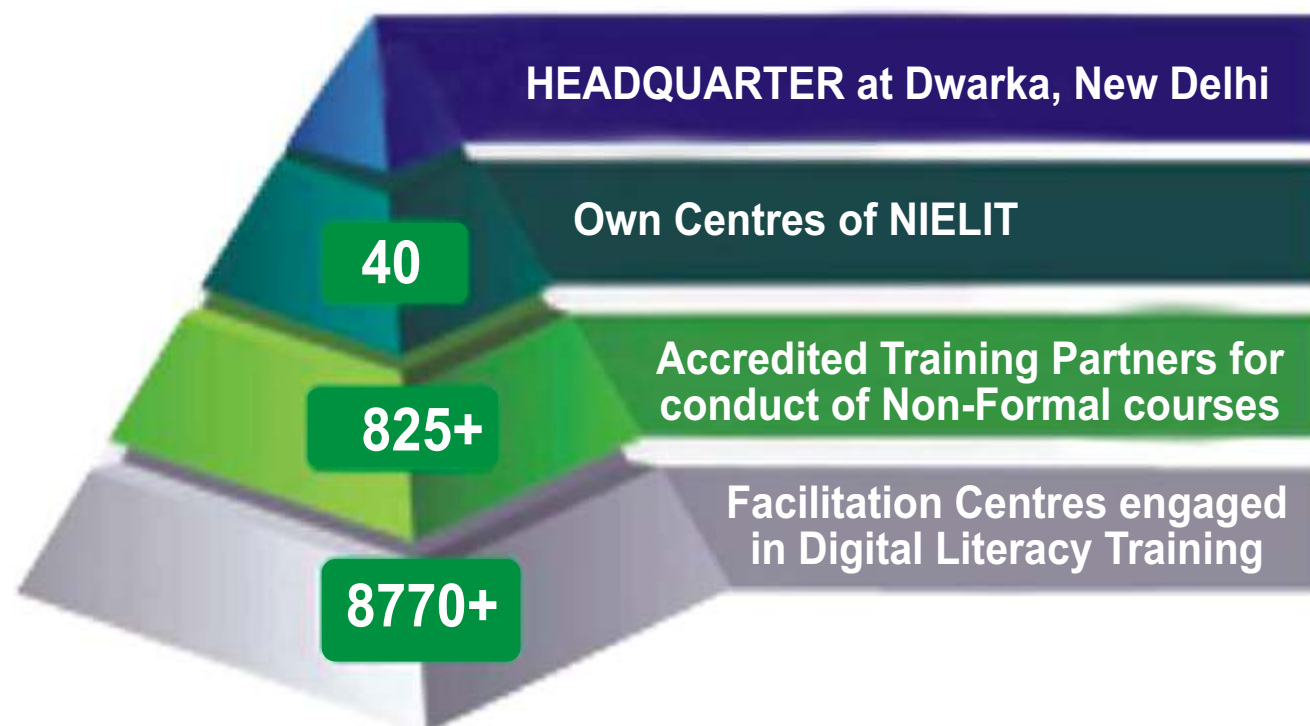
Administrative Reforms & Public Grievances. The statutory instructions for use of Hindi are being complied in accordance with region wise locations of NIELIT Centres.

As on April 2018, NIELIT has pan-India presence through a network of **40 own Centres** at Agartala, Aizwal, Ajmer (Kekri), Alawalpur, Aurangabad, Bhubaneshwar, Calicut, Chandigarh, Chuchuyimlang, Churachandpur, Chennai, Delhi, Dibrugarh, Gangtok, Gorakhpur, Guwahati, Haridwar, Imphal, Itanagar, Jammu, Jorhat, Kohima, Kokrajhar, Kolkata, Kurukshetra, Leh, Lucknow, Lunglei, Pali, Pasighat, Patna, Ranchi, Ropar, Senapati, Shillong, Shimla, Silchar, Srinagar, Tezpur and Tura, with its Head quarters at New Delhi. It is also well networked throughout and a network of about 825+ **accredited training institutions** for training of O/A/B/C level courses, besides a network of about 8770+ **facilitation centres** engaged in training of digital literacy courses.

The wide repertoire of NIELIT Courses includes: (a) Courses in the **Formal Sector** offered by the NIELIT Centres in association with State Universities/Technical Board such as **ME/ M.Tech, BE/B.Tech, MCA, BCA** programmes; Aurangabad Centre is also conducting **Ph.D** Program in the area of Electronics (b) **Courses in the Non Formal Sector** in IT, Hardware, etc., under four levels, namely 'O' (Foundation); 'A' (Advance Diploma); 'B' (MCA equivalent); and 'C' (designed to be M.Tech equivalent); (c) **Short Term Courses** in niche areas; and (d) **IT Literacy Programmes** for the proliferation of Digital Literacy in the country; besides specialized programmes in e-Governance, e-Waste, GST etc. targeted towards empowering the employees of the State Governments. In addition, NIELIT has also created expertise for the roll out of **customized skill development programmes** as per specific needs of public and private sector firms.

Efforts have been made to broaden the scope of courses being offered by NIELIT with the primary objective of empowering youth and enhancing their livelihood in line with 'Digital India,' 'Make in India' and 'Skill India' mission of Government of India. Emphasis has been made to ensure that any new course developed by NIELIT is in sync with industry requirements so that students undergoing training under these courses are readily absorbed in the industry. In order to ensure that NIELIT Courses are up to date and aligned with industry requirements, proactive measures are being taken to align these courses with government regulation and framework. **NIELIT is amongst the front-runners that has aligned 75 courses (43 in Electronics and 32 in Information Technology) with NSQF (National Skills Qualifications Framework).** {NSQF is a competency-based quality assurance framework that organizes qualifications in terms of aptitude, knowledge, skills and Learning outcomes; whether they are obtained through formal, non-formal or informal learning.}

Efforts to create a “win-win” situation where collaborations have been made purely on non-exclusive and non-financial basis has provided an enabling framework for embracing specialized technology and better employment opportunities for NIELIT students. Some of the collaborations and MoUs are as follows:

MoU with Google Inc.: NIELIT has signed a MoU with Google Inc. USA on 19.05.2017 for imparting training on Android in order to create skilled Android Developers aimed at enhancing Android App development skills in India.

MoU with D-Link Academy: NIELIT has signed a MoU with M/s D-Link (India) Limited on 14.03.2018 for cooperation in the field of skilling manpower. The MoU aims at setting-up of Networking Labs at designated NIELIT Centres by D-Link to provide training to trainers of NIELIT faculty in D-Link Certified Specialist (DCS) course. The collaboration between NIELIT and D-Link will benefit the students, job seekers & professionals, who want to enhance their knowledge and employability in networking field.

MoU with Malabar Cancer Centre, Thalassery: NIELIT Calicut signed MoU with Malabar Cancer Centre (MCC), Thalassery on 18.01.2018 for R&D in Medical Electronics equipments, enabling IT software for cancer patients.

MoU with Govt. College Sikkim: With an attempt to take IT literacy across all districts of Sikkim, NIELIT Gangtok entered into an agreement with Namchi Government College under Directorate of Higher Education, Human Resource and Development Department (HRDD), Government of Sikkim on 01.11.2017.

The collaboration aims at research and capacity building in the areas of specialized electronics domains such as bio medical hardware, medical ultra sound imaging, etc. through effective utilization of resources available with both institutions.

MoU with Defense Institute of Advanced Technology (DIAT), Pune: NIELIT Calicut has signed an agreement with the Defense Institute of Advanced Technology (DIAT), Pune on 21.04.2017 for conduct of M. Tech. course in VLSI & Embedded Systems.

MoU with CMIA: A MoU was signed between NIELIT Aurangabad and CMIA on 16.09.2017 for adoption of eligible Business Startup ideas emerging from the Undergraduate, Post-Graduate and Ph.D Projects of the students of NIELIT Aurangabad as per the criteria mutually set out by both CMIA and NIELIT for incubation and acceleration at MAGIC facilities.

MoU with Goods and Services Tax Network (GSTN): NIELIT has signed a MoU with GSTN on 24.07.2017 for making joint efforts to coordinate training of NIELIT Officials on GST Portal. Officials of various NIELIT Centres have been trained on GST Portal to become Master Trainers who are now training Tax Payers.

D. INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION AND GLOBAL EXHIBITIONS

At the international arena the capacity building activities of NIELIT have been highlighted through proactive participation in bilateral meetings and industry visits. This has resulted in greater visibility of NIELIT in reputed countries around the world. Some of these initiatives are as follows:

Training on Smartphone Design in Taiwan: NIELIT has implemented a Smartphone Design Training Program in collaboration with Indian Cellular Association (ICA) and MediaTek India as part of the “Make in India” Initiative of Government of India. Under this program, 04 Officers of NIELIT attended 3 weeks training session in Taiwan during 12th March, 2018 to 2nd April, 2018.

Participation in GCCS 2017: NIELIT was entrusted with the responsibility of mentoring a Plenary Session titled ‘Digital Technologies: Enabler for the differently-abled’ with the focus area on IT as an enabler for differently-abled at the Global Conference on Cyber Space (GCCS) held during 23-24 November, 2017 at Aerocity, New Delhi. During the event, NIELIT exhibit was also put up to showcase various skill development and capacity building activities in IT & Electronics.

Training on Cloud Computing in Singapore: NIELIT had signed a MoU with Amazon for training of master trainers on cloud computing using AWS (Amazon Web Services) Educate programme. In pursuance of the MoU, 04 Officers from NIELIT had undergone 03 Days intensive training on AWS in Singapore during 10th April, 2017 to 14th April, 2017.

Conference on Emerging and Innovative Trends: NIELIT Jammu participated in 5th National Conference & Exhibition on Emerging and Innovative Trends in Engineering Technology (NEEITET) organized by Govt. College of Engineering & Technology (GCET), Jammu in collaboration with IIT Kharagpur on 19th February, 2018.

E. BUILDING & INFRASTRUCTURE OF NIELIT CAMPUSES DURING 2017-2018

With a vision to provide an excellent infrastructure with residential facilities for the benefit of the students from far flung areas, Ministry of Electronics & Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India has approved the setting up of permanent campuses of NIELIT Centres in different parts of the country. Apart from MeitY approved projects for NIELIT Centres, NIELIT has also constructed its headquarters building- NIELIT Bhawan with its own corpus funds at Dwarka, New Delhi. The new Centres have helped in expanding the NIELIT’s reach to the remote areas where other institutes of good repute are not present in the areas of Electronics & Information Technology. The building projects completed/ongoing during 2017-18 are as follows:

NIELIT Patna – The project was approved in October 2012 and the cost was revised in December 2014. The building was inaugurated for IECT related skill development and capacity building activities by Shri Nitish Kumar, Hon’ble Chief Minister, Bihar in the august presence of Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad, Hon’ble Union Minister (E&IT, L&J) on February 26, 2018. The Centre has started operations in new building since July 2018.



NIELIT Headquarter's Building at Dwarka, New Delhi – NIELIT Headquarters was allotted a land in 2002 at Dwarka, New Delhi and the construction work was awarded to CPWD in 2007. The construction work for the building was started in 2015. **'NIELIT Bhavan', the new building of Headquarters was inaugurated by Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad, Hon'ble Union Minister (E&IT, L&J) on May 06, 2017.** It is noteworthy that the foundation stone of the building was laid in May 2015 and as such the construction of the "NIELIT Bhawan" has been successfully completed within a very short span of less than 2 years. NIELIT HQ has started operating from the building since September 2017.



NIELIT Agartala- The project was approved by MeitY in March 2008 however the project cost was revised in January 2013. After the cost revision the construction was taken up and the building got ready. The centre has started operations in new building since January 2016. The building was dedicated to the Nation for IECT related skill Development and Capacity Building Activities by Shri P.P. Chaudhary, Hon'ble Union MoS (E&IT, L&J) on April 26, 2017.



NIELIT Kolkata – The project was approved by MeitY in February 2009, the construction of building was started in July 2013. NIELIT Kolkata is operational from this building since October 2017 and the building is now ready for dedication to nation.



F. IN-HOUSE LABORATORIES

The strength of NIELIT's training system lies in its state-of-the-art infrastructure. NIELIT Centres have state-of-the-art laboratories owing to which it has created a reputation of its own in the respective state. Well equipped laboratories with top notch facilities serve as an added boon for the students which help them in exploring their subjects at a greater depth. The aim is to provide students a conceptual as well as practical understanding of the subject through hands-on training. A brief of some well established laboratories fully equipped with the latest systems and development tools at some of NIELIT Centres are as under:

Medical Electronics R&D Laboratory: The State-of-the-art Medical Electronics R&D Laboratories have been set up at **NIELIT Kohima, Agartala and Shillong** in order to provide repair and maintenance services of medical electronics equipment of hospitals in the States. NIELIT is also providing training to paramedical and medical staff at government and private hospitals so as to ease problems arising due to non-operable defective hospital equipments.

Indigenous Color Doppler Ultrasound Scanner with PNDD Compliance:

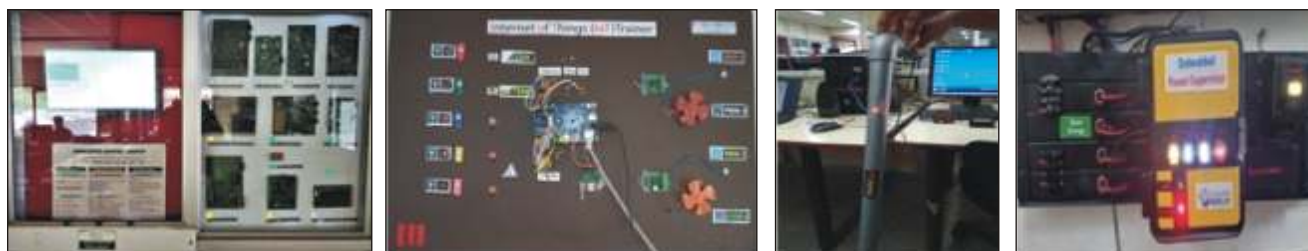
NIELIT Calicut is developing an Indigenous Color Doppler Ultrasound Machine with Prenatal Diagnostic Technique (PNDD) Compliance. In India due to unnoticeable female fetus abortion, the percentage of female population is going down and this causes very serious social imbalance. The machine will generate PNDD compliance reports using which authorities can look for patterns of female feticide. The machine has unique ID and any movement of the machine will be automatically tracked with inbuilt GPS facility. The machine also supports Aadhaar based authentication of doctor and patient undergoing scanning. The development of the project will be a boon for health sector of rural India.



Ultrasound Research Lab: NIELIT Calicut has set up ultrasound research lab with ultrasound research plant from M/s Verasonics USA to validate complex ultrasound signal processing algorithms. The lab also has a test bench with all the system boards to test the data acquisition and its processing for Ultrasound Receiver & Transmitter Systems. The test set up includes AFE board, high voltage variable Power supply, TGC board, Pulsar EVM, PM Bus EVM etc. The set up can be used to validate end-to-

end signal chain from sensor to display and can test high speed interfaces like LVDS, PCIe etc. The test set up also supports configuration of different boards from PC based GUI.

Embedded Systems & IoT Lab: NIELIT Calicut is having state of art Embedded Systems & IoT lab. The Lab is well equipped with various variety of Hardware & software tools like Micro-controllers Development boards, Microchip, NXP semiconductors, DSP Development boards, Micro-controller based Trainer Kits- Arduino UNO-Mega series, ESP8266, ESP-32, TI- MSP-430 series, Intel Galileo, BBB, Raspberry Pi etc. The Lab is also equipped with rich set of software tools & IDE's such as WISE-51, WISE-196 (In-house developed), ARM- Keil, MPLab, ARM-DS-5, TI's CCS, Analog devices- Visual DSP++ etc. Similarly the commercial RTOS licenses- VxWorks, RTLinux and open RTOS- FreeRTOS, ChibiRTOS, Contiki, mbedOS.



NIELIT GORAKHPUR

3D Printing Lab: 3D Printing Lab at NIELIT Gorakhpur is equipped with 3D Printer machine, 3D Scanner and Creo 3.0 Design Software Tool. The 3D Printer machine is used for rapid prototyping whereas 3D Scanner and CREO tool is used for 3D designing & Reverse Engineering.



Robotics & IoT Lab: Robotics & IoT lab is well equipped with various software tools like Proteus, OrCAD, MATLAB with Simulink & Modelsim. The lab is also equipped with Hardware tools like ARM Cortex Trainer Kit, ARM 9 Trainer Kit, ARM 7 Trainer Kit, PIC Microcontroller based Trainer Kit, AVR Series Micro-controller Evaluation Board etc.



NIELIT KOHIMA

Cyber Forensics R&D Lab: The first of its kind in Nagaland, State-of-the-art Cyber Forensics R&D Lab and Training Facilities at NIELIT Kohima serves as the Resource Centre for NE region providing training and forensics analysis services to the law enforcement agencies. So far 404 Law Enforcement Agencies have been trained in digital forensics and IT Act. So far, 80 Cybercrime cases forwarded to the Forensics Lab have been solved. Cybercrime Case Management System is also developed and deployed for management of cases like case details, status, types and number of exhibits, IO details, etc.



NIELIT PATNA

OrCAD Lab: OrCAD LAB is for PCB Design and examination that incorporates a schematic manager (Capture), analog/mixed-signal circuit simulator (PSpice) and a PCB board Layout arrangement (PCB Designer Professional).



Electronics Lab: Electronics Lab has been established to provide hands on training in areas of Electronics Hardware & Productions as per present Industrial practices. The latest equipments and facilities are available for Circuit designing, testing, repairing and maintenance of various Consumer Electronics products.

NIELIT GUWAHATI

Anti-Spam Coordination Centre: An anti-spam facility has been established with a framework for collection, analysis and exchange of information about spam mails. For this purpose, distributed spam-bots emulating open relay mail servers has been set up. The spam mails collected are analyzed to find out the origin of such mails and classified into categories. Based on the analysis, a shareable database as per the international practices has been prepared.



NIELIT AGARTALA

Information & NW Security Lab: NIELIT Agartala has a well-equipped infrastructure of Information Security and Cisco Lab. The Lab is equipped with high end HP Blade Server, CISCO 2960 L3 managed switch, CISCO Router 1940 Series, ASA 5506 Server, Server Rack, NAS, nComputing infrastructure, VMWare virtualization server with vCentre, Licensed Microsoft Server, Laptops with portable Virtual Training Environment servers.



NIELIT AURANGABAD

CAD/CAM Lab: CAD/CAM Lab is equipped with the latest Machines and also has flagship CAD/CAM software packages and high end CAD/CAM workstations to meet the present industrial requirements. The lab is aimed at enhancing the knowledge and skills of engineers involved in the operational use of CNC machines, CAD packages and for those who want to provide training to others in this area. It gives exposure and on hand experience in the field of CAD/CAM and CNC machines, 3D printing, reverse engineering, Computer Integrated Manufacturing and Industrial Robots.



NIELIT IMPHAL

Mechanical Workshop: NIELIT Imphal has a well-equipped infrastructure for Mechanical workshop. The workshop is equipped with various machines such as Lathe, Milling machine, Radial drilling machine, Hydraulic

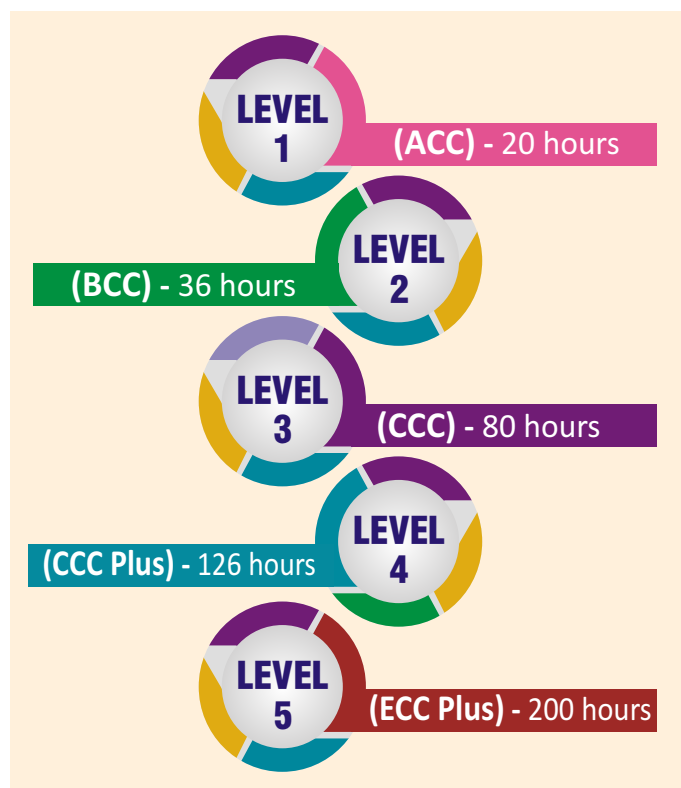


sheet metal bending machine, welding machine etc. Apart from imparting hands on Training to Diploma Engineering students, NIELIT Imphal has designed and manufactured small turning machines of brass and aluminium for artisans. The Centre has also designed and manufactured metal enclosures as per demand of entrepreneurs and small scale industries. Preparation and repairing of moulds, dies etc. are also done. The Centre has also signed a MoA with local Industries to design and develop the existing machines of the local Industries.

G. DIGITAL LITERACY

Digital India is a campaign launched by the Government of India to ensure the Government's services are made available to citizens electronically by improved online infrastructure and by increasing Internet connectivity or by making the country digitally empowered in the field of technology. Digital Literacy refers to an individual's ability to find, evaluate, produce and communicate clear information through various digital platforms such as smart phone, laptops, desktops etc. Digital Literacy helps people to use technology in complementing their daily routine and become more productive.

NIELIT as the HRD arm of MeitY, is making efforts to bridge the 'digital divide' through its IT Literacy Courses leading to employability of youth, especially for the marginalized section of the society. NIELIT has a range of Digital Literacy courses, namely Awareness in Computer Concepts (ACC – 20 Hours), Basic Computer Course (BCC – 36 Hours), Course on Computer Concept (CCC – 80 Hours), Course on Computer Concepts Plus (CCC Plus – 126 Hours), Expert Computer Course (ECC – 200 Hours) which are recommended for effective proliferation of Digital Literacy in the country and many State Governments have also recognized these courses for employment/ promotion/ increment purposes. **The digital literacy courses of NIELIT have also been retrofitted with about 1.5 hrs module on Financial Inclusion (developed by Department of Financial Services, MoF, GoI).**



The digital literacy courses of NIELIT especially, BCC/ CCC are accepted by the various State Governments/ Government Departments such as Arunachal Pradesh, Bihar, Chandigarh, Daman & Diu, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Mizoram, Rajasthan, Sikkim, Tripura, Uttar Pradesh, O/o the CGA, DGE&T etc. for recruitment/ in-service promotions/ incentives etc.

To enable 24x7 learning, the e-Content of CCC course in 25 languages has been developed and made available at the website of NIELIT. As far as Classroom teaching is concerned the course is being delivered by about 8770+ Facilitation Centres throughout the Country. Besides every month examination for the courses are being held at more than 150 Examination Centres across the country. The course is governed by a complete online system i.e. registration of candidate for examination, receipt of examination fee, conduct of examination, declaration of results and issue of digitally signed e-Certificates. On an average more than 60,000 candidates appear for online examination cycle of digital literacy courses that are conducted on monthly basis.

H. SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMENTS DURING 2017-18

- NIELIT is implementing a project entitled "Capacity Building in IT and Digital Services (including Digital payments and GST) for State Govt. officials of NE States". In this regard, **Ministry of Development of North Eastern Region (MDoNER)** has sanctioned Rs.6,83,70,000/- for training 10000 No. of State Govt. Officials in NE State out of which Rs.3,41,85,000/- have already been released. The objective is to enhance the IT skills of

State Govt. officials of North East Region by providing them with digital skills viz. digital literacy, digital payments, e-governance services and GST training and to facilitate adoption as well as regular use of IT and



digital Services as a way of life, and especially in official work. 1663 State Government Employees have been trained in all the Eight (08) participating NE states as on 31st March 2018.

- A one day workshop for creating awareness in Administrative and Financial matters was held at NIELIT Bhavan, New Delhi on June 26, 2017. The workshop was attended by around 30 Officials of Administration & Finance wings of various NIELIT Centres.
- Under Chip to System Design C2SD project of MeitY to design/ fabricate an IC and use the same in building an application, NIELIT Calicut successfully completed the Tape Out of the Array Signal Processor at Semi-Conductor Laboratory (SCL) Mohali. The chip is expected to be available for testing in another 3 months.
- After attending training on e-Yantra and to explore the possibilities for setting up the Robotics Lab, NIELIT Gorakhpur has set-up a Lab under e-Yantra Lab Setup Initiative (e-LSI) Program. Various short-term course on "Robotics" with duration of 2-Weeks, 4-Weeks & 6-Weeks, were launched at NIELIT Gorakhpur.
- NIELIT Srinagar conducted a month long training program on Computer Hardware, Repair and Services from 19th Feb to 10th March 2018 for local youth under Indian Army's **Operation Sadhbhavana**. 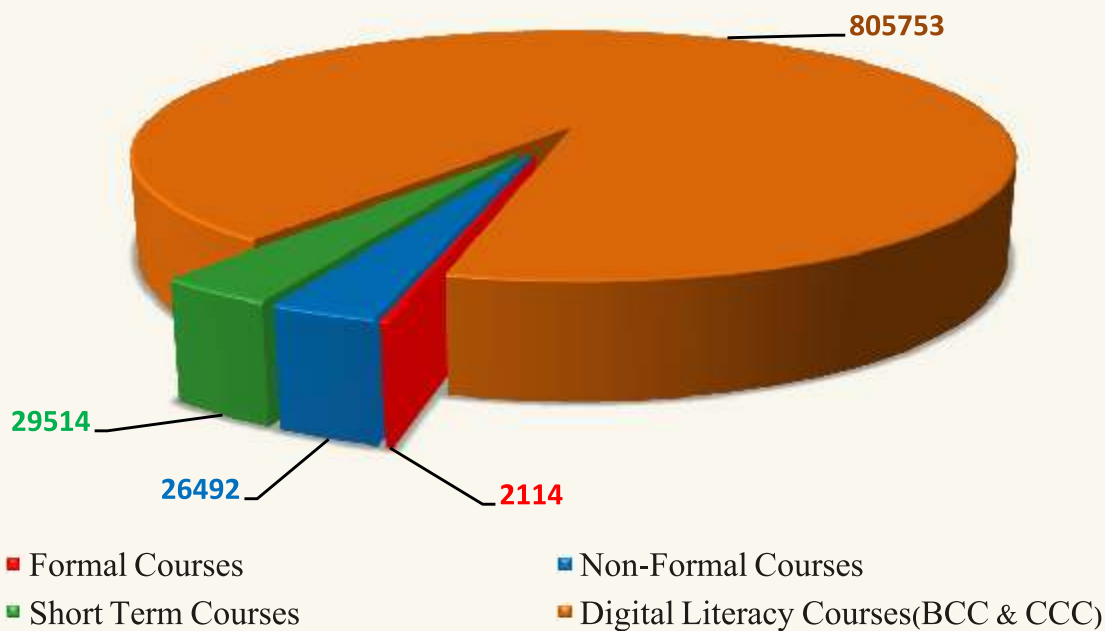

SKILLING BY NIELIT DURING 2017-18



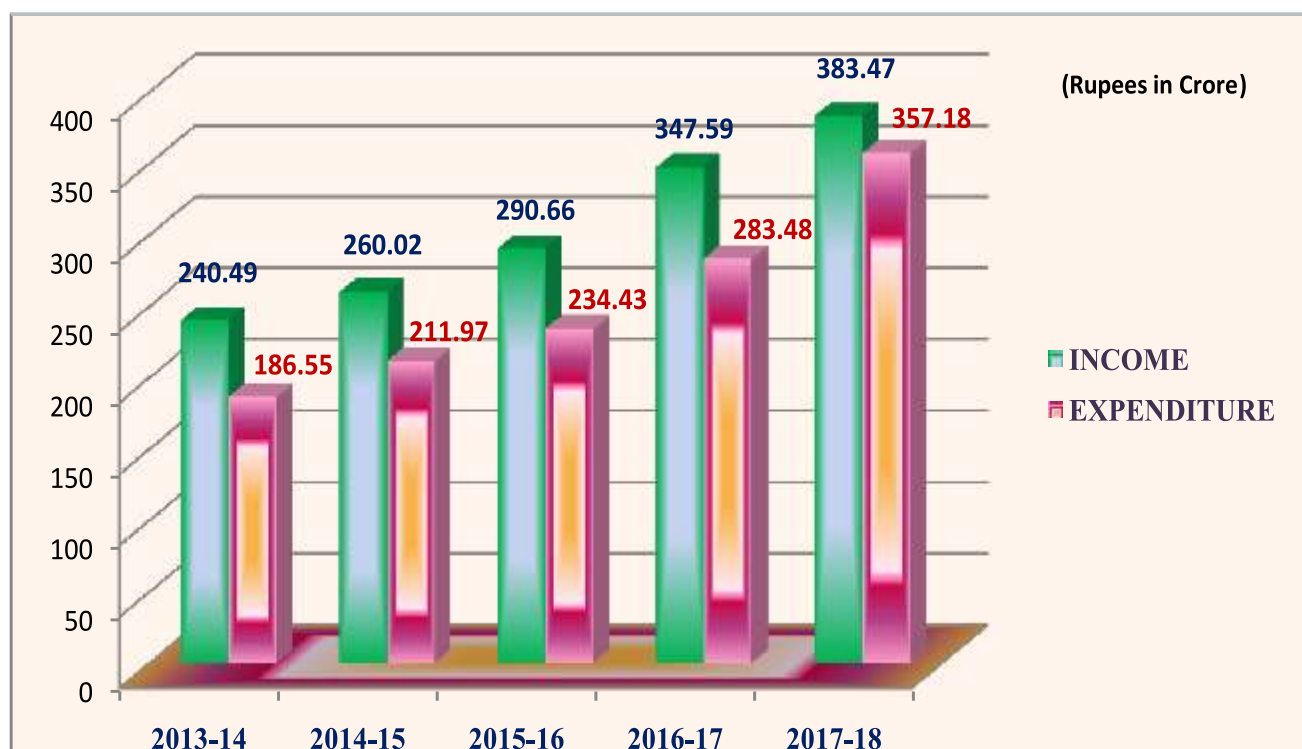

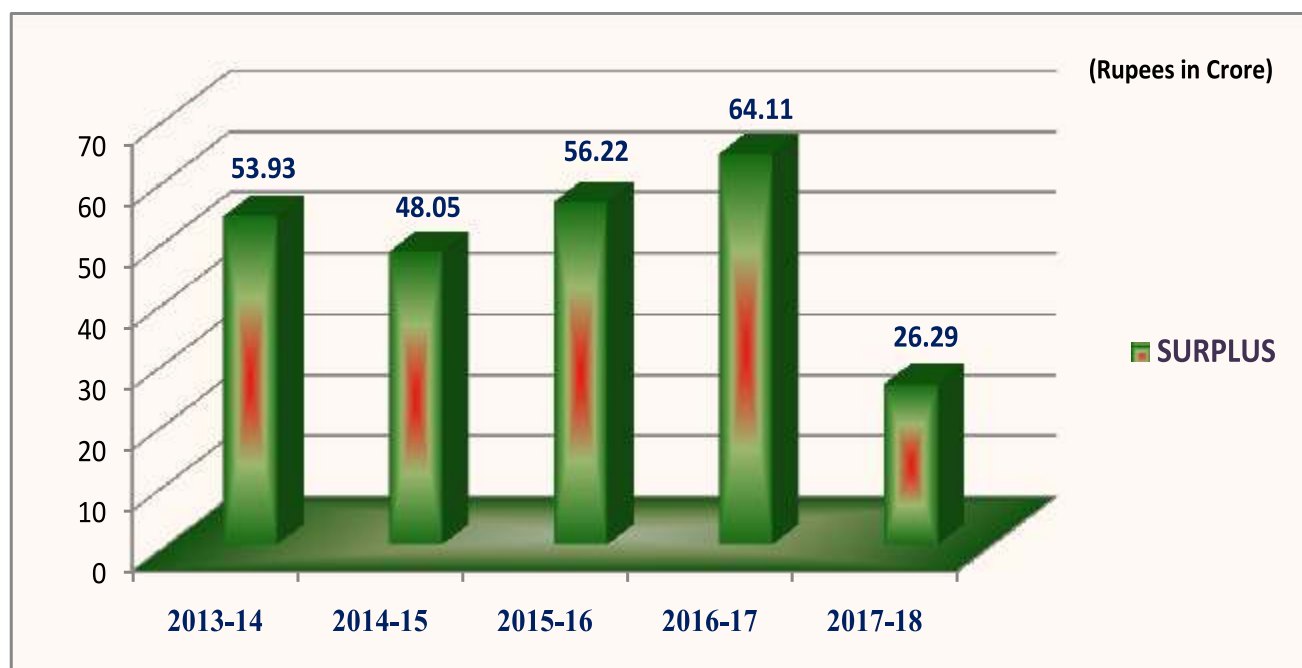

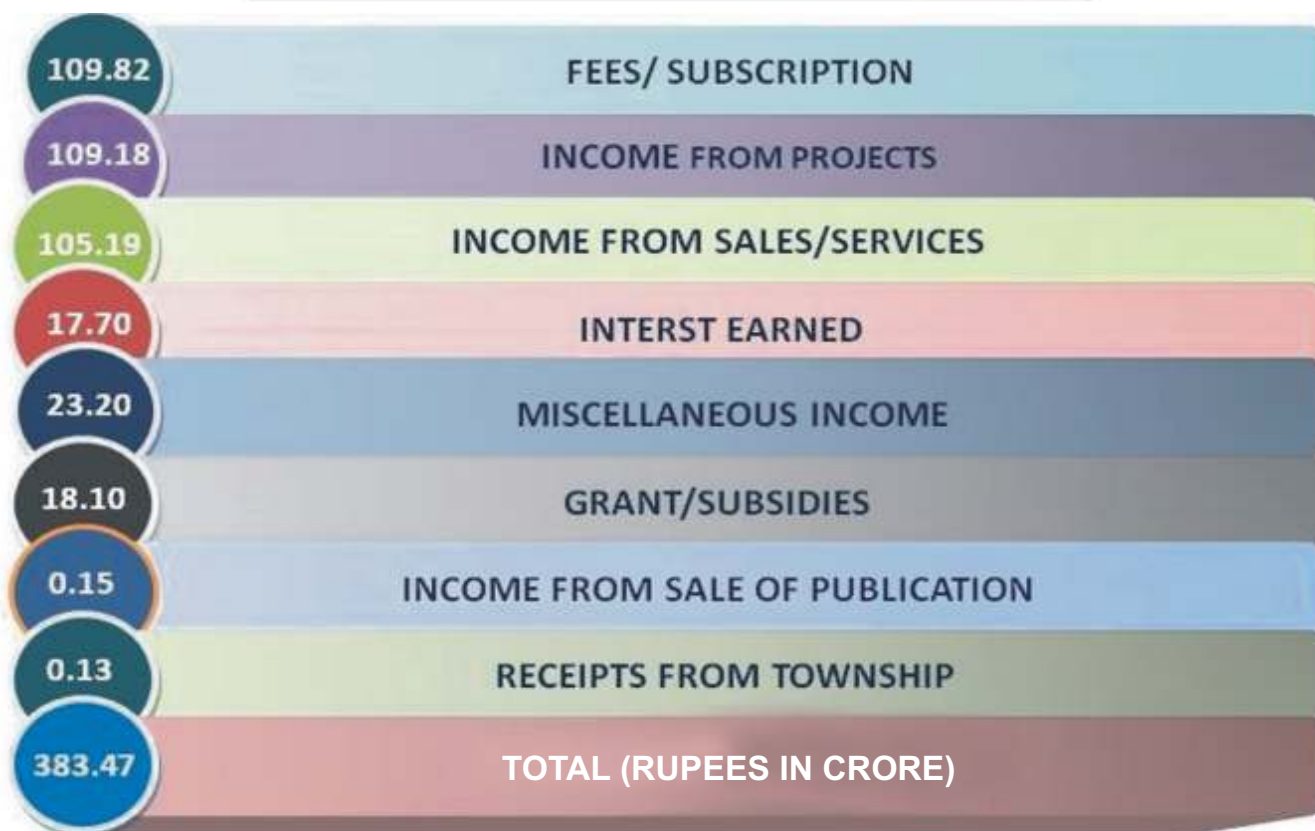
INCOME V/s EXPENDITURE EXCLUDING NPR PROJECT



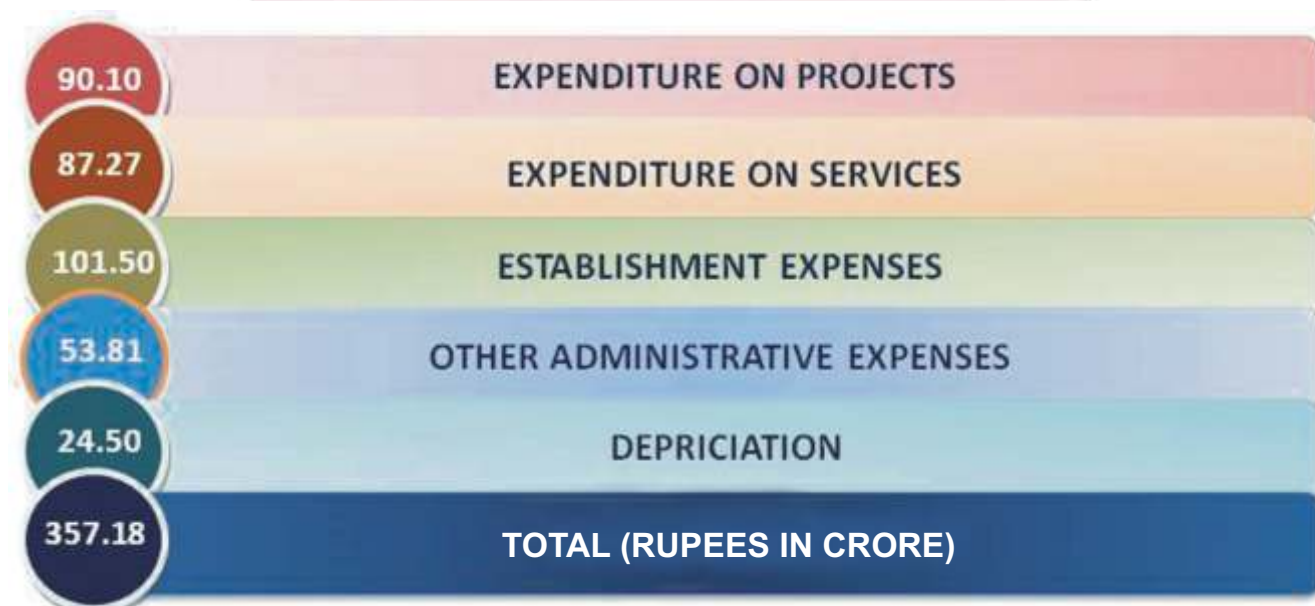
SURPLUS EXCLUDING NPR PROJECT

History of the Centre :

Set-up in Dr. BAM University campus by Department of Electronics, GoI, (now MeitY) jointly with Marathwada Industrial corporation, Government of Maharashtra and christened as CEDT on 19th September 1986 with the following objectives:

- To train manpower for product design, development, manufacturing maintenance and information technology.

SCHEDULE 24 :

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The National Institute Of Electronics & Information Technology (here-in-after referred as NIELIT), an Autonomous Scientific Society (re-named with effect from 10.10.2011 from DOEACC Society) under the administrative control of Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology (MeitY), Government of India was set up during November, 1994 to carry out Human Resource Development and related activities in the area of Information & Communications Technology (ICT). The society is registered with Income Tax Department u/s 12A and has been formed exclusively for the purpose to generate quality manpower and develop skilled professionals in the area of Information, Electronics & Communications Technology (IECT) and allied fields, by providing world class education & training and accreditation services. The Society is engaged both in the formal & Non formal Education in the area of Information & Communications Technology (ICT) besides development of Industry oriented quality education and training in the state-of-art areas establish standards to be the Country's premier Institution for Examination and Certification in the field of ICT. It is also a National Examination Body which accredits institutes/organizations for conducting courses particularly in the Non formal Sector of IT Education & training. NIELIT is working through its 20 centres- Aizwal, Aurangabad, Agartala, Ajmer, Calicut, Chandigarh, Chennai, Delhi, Gangtok, Gorakhpur, Guwahati, Itanagar, Imphal, Kolkata, Kohima, Patna, Ranchi, Ropar, Shillong, Srinagar & Jammu. The following policies represent the consolidated accounting policies of NIELIT including its various centers and also include various information and notes to accounts specifically mentioned in various center's audited financials becoming part of this consolidated financial statements of NIELIT

1. ACCOUNTING CONVENTION:

a) Method of Accounting

The financial statements are prepared on the basis of historical cost convention and unless otherwise stated below on the accrual method of accounting.

b) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of financial statements and the reported amount of revenues of expenses during the reporting period.

Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/ materialize.

2. INCOME RECOGNITION

All the NIELIT Centers are following accrual method of accounting except:

- Chennai Centre is following cash basis of accounting for some items and others on accrual basis.
- In case of Agartala Centre Income from 'ISEA Project-II, NeGD project BCC, & CCC share of exam fees receipts and receipts from students other than fees under SCSP & TSP scheme are accounted on cash basis.
- Gangtok Center recognized income from courses on accrual basis however in case the fees paid in installments, the same is accounted on cash basis.
- Ajmer centre is following cash basis of accounting in respect of BCC/CCC share of Exam fee.
- Calicut Centre- Income from Student Projects is recognized on completion basis.
- Itanagar and New Delhi center recognized grant actually received from Government of India on cash basis.
- Srinagar/Jammu Center recognized course fees on receipt basis.
- Gorakhpur center recognized reimbursement of fees of SC/ST students on cash basis.
- Registration Fee, Accreditation Fee, Variable Accreditation Fee (VAF) and Awareness Creation Fund (ACF) have been recognized on receipt basis.

3. The revenue Grant-in-Aid released by the MeitY to Centers for meeting of Recurring Expenditure has been accounted as income by respective centers, as detailed below:

4. Investments

Funds of the Society invested in Short Term Fixed Deposits with nationalized banks have been shown as per guidelines of the Society for "Treasury Management of Surplus".

Interest on Fixed Deposit kept for Earmarked/ Endowment Fund received during the year, is being credited to respective Earmarked/ Endowment Fund.

5. Fixed Assets

Fixed Assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Cost of acquisition inclusive of inward freight, duties and taxes and incidental and direct expenses related to acquisition. In respect of project involving construction, related pre- operational expenses, form part of the value of the Assets capitalized.

- a) In respect of Calicut Centre, the value of equipments consisting of 17 numbers of items given as grant to the Centre by UNDP have been shown at a notional value of Rs.1/- on both liability and asset side.
- b) In case of Kolkata center Fixed Assets are stated at cost (Gross) less accumulated depreciation. Cost includes \ cost of acquisition, installation, which is inclusive of freight and duty, taxes, incidental expenses. Leasehold Land for 999 years at Sector 1 of Bidhannagar (Salt Lake, Plot No. 267, Block-BF) has been shown under the head "Building" in the Fixed Asset schedule.
- c) In case of Chandigarh there was a major fire incident in June, 2014 in the building occupied by NIELIT Chandigarh (formerly Regional Computer Centre) at SCO 114-116, Sector 17B, Chandigarh. Appropriate accounting entries regarding losses/write-offs in respect thereof have been recorded in the year 2015-2016. In the said incident, the Centre lost almost all the records till that date, including Fixed Asset Register.
- d) In respect of Kolkata center fixed assets register requires updating.
- e) In respect of Agartala Centre, 15 Acres of Land for building the permanent campus has been allotted by Govt. of Tripura at free of cost, the same has been shown at the Nominal Value of Re. 1/-. Under the Fixed Assets Schedule.
- f) The Government of Rajasthan has allotted 16.33 Hectares of land at Village Khoda near Kekri Distt. Ajmer for 99 years lease at free of cost has been shown at the nominal value of Re.1/-.
- g) In case of Guwahati center: in respect of NE Capacity Building Project of Silchar & Jorhat Extension Centre, expenditure incurred on renovation of building (Civil & Electricals) taken on rental basis for a period of 4 years has been shown as deferred expenditure to be

written off over the period of occupancy. Further in respect of NIELIT Guwahati (City Centre), expenditure incurred on renovation of building (Civil & Electricals) taken on rental basis for a period of 10 years has been shown as deferred Expenditure to be written off over the period of occupancy.

- h) During the year, Fixed Assets with WDV of Rs 25,40,172.43 have been transferred from NIELIT Ajmer to NIELIT Kurukshetra & NIELIT Chandigarh. All these Fixed Assets have been acquired with Grant-in-aid, as confirmed from NIELIT Ajmer. Accordingly, equal amount of Grant-in-aid as has also been transferred from NIELIT Ajmer to NIELIT Kurukshetra and NIELIT Chandigarh. Depreciation on these assets has been written back.

6. Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on W.D.V. method as per rates specified in the Income Tax Act 1961.

Depreciation for current year on "Grant related Assets" is debited to Income & Expenditure Account and also credited to Income & Expenditure Account as per AS-12 and deducted from "Capital Grant-in-Aid" during the year.

7. Government Grants

During the financial year 2017-18 NIELIT has not received GIA (Plan) and (Non Plan) from MeitY.

8. Change in Accounting Policy

During the year no such changes taken place.

9. Employee's Benefits

- Provision for Gratuity is accounted for on actuarial valuation as per AS -15. The liability of Gratuity in respect of Calicut and Chandigarh has been covered by the policy obtained in favor of the respective Employee's Trust under Group Gratuity cash accumulation from LIC of India. NIELIT employees are covered under the existing Gratuity scheme as on 14.12.2002 i.e. on month emoluments (Pay + Grade Pay) for each employee, for each completed year of Service.
- Provision of Leave Encashment is accounted for on actuarial valuation basis as per AS-15.
- Bonus is accounted on Cash Basis.
- NIELIT HQ and Centers have been covered under EPF w.e.f. 01.01.2003 with the approval of the Competent Authority. EPF Contributions from April, 2013 onwards are being deposited with RPFC. The arrears of EPF for the period from 01.01.2003 to 31.03.2013 has been deposited with EPF Office. The balance lying in NIELIT CPF, is being reconciled.

(ii) Service Tax refund claim:

- i. NIELIT Chandigarh Center has filed a claim with Service Tax department for refund of service tax Rs. 74.86 Lacs erroneously deposited against the bills raised to Department of Higher Education (DHE), Govt of HP, Shimla for the period from March 2013 to Jan 2014.

However, the adjudicating authority has rejected the claim vide order dated 30.01.2018. Accordingly, the said amount of Rs. 74.86 Lacs is recoverable from the service tax department and payable to DHE Shimla who has already raised dispute against payment of aforesaid service tax.

- ii. Another refund application filed for the period from June 2014 to Aug 2015 for Rs. 2,57,77,696/- on the similar facts and grounds has also been rejected vide order dated 30.01.2018. Center has filed appeals before Central Excise and Service Tax Appellate Tribunal (CESTAT), Chandigarh against the order of Commissioner (Appeals) for seeking refund of Service Tax in both the cases.

(iii) Other Litigations:

- NIELIT Chandigarh initiated arbitration proceedings against Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan (KVS) for recovery of dues amounting Rs.15,66,021 for providing instructors for School project, appropriate provision in respect of which had already been made in the books as Provision for Doubtful Debts. KVS not has only refuted the claim of the center but has also filed a counter claim of Rs. 2,68,650/- as over payment of the Center (formerly RCC). Arbitration proceedings are yet to be concluded.
- ESI had issued demand notice for Rs. 11,22,702/- and Rs. 3,03,947/- for non compliance of ESI Scheme for the period from Oct 2002 to March 2003. Dy Director, ESI vide Order No. PB.17000399790001013/245 dated 21.07.2011 has directed the Centre for payment of the demand. However, the centre has preferred an appeal and accordingly Civil Writ Petition (CWP) No. 5441 of 2013 and CWP No. 5367 of 2013 are pending with Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, Chandigarh, though the Hon'ble High Court has granted stay against the recovery of demand as an interim relief.
- Against the orders of Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal dated 2nd May, 2014, this Centre filed Civil Writ Petition No. 15204 of 2014 before Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court Chandigarh for recovery of balance amount of wrongly drawn HRA with penal interest amounting to Rs. 3,89,642.00 by Ms. Manjit Kaur, Ex. Data Entry Operator 'E'. Proceedings in the matter are in process. The said amount of Rs. 3,89,642/- was recovered from the amount of leave encashment payable on her retirement. Ms. Manjit Kaur, Ex-Data Entry operator 'E' of this Centre has again filed O.A. No. 60/129/2018 before the Hon'ble Central Administrative Tribunal, Chandigarh Bench for release of withheld amount of Rs. 3,89,642/- and proceedings are under process.

Till such time the matter is decided by Hon'ble , the said amount of Rs.3,89,642/- has been treated as Contingent liabilities.

- This Centre had rendered Consultancy Services to the Rajasthan State Co-Operative Bank Jaipur for procurement of Hardware Infrastructure for which this Centre received advance of Rs. 17.15 Lacs. The Rajasthan State Co-Operative Bank Jaipur did not finally place the supply order and has filed Recovery Suit No. 60/2007 before the Hon'ble Additional District and Session Judge, Fast Track – 13, Jaipur City claiming Rs. 23.58 Lacs (Rs.17.15 plus Rs. 6.43 Lacs as interest). Proceedings before the Additional District and Session Judge Fast Track-13, Jaipur City are in process are going on and pending for disposal.
- A sum of Rs. 43,24,045/- was shown recoverable against Municipal Corporation Chandigarh against Land allotted vide letter No. MC/ESTATE/2002/4732 dated 29-01-2002 which was subsequently surrendered by the the Centre. In the absence of any relief provided by Chief Administrator, Chandigarh and UT Administration, Chandigarh, writ petition was filed before the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh, which was also dismissed in default, against which , another writ petition was filed for restoration of the case. The said Writ petition was also dismissed as withdrawn with liberty to file afresh on the same cause of action. Based upon the representation sent to Municipal Corporation, Chandigarh regarding re-consideration for allotment of land at Manimajra by adjusting initial payment of Rs.43.24 lacs already released by this Centre in favour of Municipal Corporation Chandigarh and non-applicability of demand note raised towards interest on delayed payment of premium, Ground Rent and forfeiture amount of consideration money, fresh Writ Petition has been filed through Central Govt. Counsel. Appropriate provision had already been made in the books of accounts of the Centre in this regard.

b) Kolkata Centre

- (i) RCC Employees Contributory Provident Fund Trust with Income Tax recognition is maintaining PF of employees who have joined NIELIT before 01.01.2004. However PF of employees who have joined on or after 01.01.2004 is maintained at NIELIT Head Quarter under EPF & MP Act, 1952. The centre has received a notice on 11.07.2006 and order u/s. 7A dt. 09.07.2008 and u/s 7B dt. 30.01.2009 from Regional EPF authority that NIELIT will cover under EPF & MP Act. 1952 from August 1982. Against the above mentioned orders the centre has filed an appeal to the EPF Appellate Tribunal, Delhi (appropriate authority) that our Head

Quarter is covered under CPF Act. 1925 as per GOI Gazette Notification dt. 26.07.1997. However the EPF Appellate Tribunal, Delhi has dismissed the appeal by order dated 3rd August, 2011. The Centre has there after filed on appeal with the Honorable High Court, Kolkata against the aforesaid order, on 21st March, 2012. The said appeal is still pending.

NIELIT Kolkata has paid a sum of Rs. 156,854/- under protest against demand of Rs. 6,27,413/- from Employees' State Insurance Corporation West Bengal Region. The demand has been disputed by the Centre.

- ii. There is contingent liability of service tax for Rs. 9,82,620/- (Rs. 4,87,425/- for Cenvat Credit availed on common input service for which assessment is pending till Balance Sheet date and Rs. 4,95,195/- under Rule 6(3) and Rule 14 of CCR Rules, 2004 for which Appeal is pending with Service Tax Authority out of which Rs. 4,95,195/- was set aside by the Commissioner of CGST & C.Ex, Howrah Commission rate vide his order no. 219/S.Tax-11/Ko1/2018 dt. 20.03.18.

2. Capital Commitment:

- a) Building is constructed at Lunglei extension Centre and at Aizawl centre, total estimated construction cost is Rs 19,22,21,002/-, out of which Rs 8,13,69,015/- has been paid till 31.03.2018.
- b) In case of HQs, Office space at NBCC Tower, Kidwai Nagar is being purchased for Rs.47.01 crores out of which Rs.35.23 crores has been paid till 31st March,2018.
- c) During the year, the construction of NIELIT HQs' building at Dwarka has been completed. NIELIT HQs' has been shifted from Electronics Niketan, 6, CGO Complex to NIELIT Bhawan, Plot No. 3, PSP Pocket, Sector-8, Dwarka, New Delhi – 110 077. An amount of Rs.31.92 crore has been transferred from scheduled Capital Working Progress to Fixed Assets under Building Head.
3. Current Assets, Current liabilities, provisions and Loans and Advances

In the opinion of the management, the current assets, loans and advances have been stated at the value which will be realizable in the ordinary course of business, except in the case of debtors where provision for Bad & doubtful debts provided for.

a) In Case of Delhi Centre

A Provision of Rs, 1,73,352/- only for doubtful debts has been made in respect of sundry debtors amounting

to Rs1,91,43,753/- (Apart from stated below) which are outstanding for more than three years. (i.e. before 31.03.2012 which in the opinion of the management is reasonable.

A provision of Rs. 28,11,468/- only has been made towards doubtful debts against recoverable of Rs. 1.12,71,327/- from Director of education, Jhandewalan. This amount is due since 2004-05. The matter is under arbitration. In the opinion of the management quantum of provision made is reasonable.

b) In case of Chandigarh Centre

i) Debtors

The Chandigarh Centre is having Debtors of Rs. 1655.72 lacs, out of which Rs. 519.68 lacs are outstanding for more than 3 years. The debtors outstanding relates to even for the year 2005-06 and before that. During the audit, it has been found that seeing the amount outstanding and its period, some urgent steps for recovery/monitoring need to be taken. However, as the management is of the opinion-that debtors are either from government departments or from public sector undertakings and are recoverable, and which includes existing parties also, so assessment for provision of doubtful debts could not be made..

ii) Grant-in-Aid:

Chandigarh Centre has not maintained any sub-ledgers or separate register for the receipt and utilization of various grants as envisaged under the grant sanction/disbursement letters.

The amount outstanding as on 31//03/18 is Rs.693.29 Lacs out of which Rs.512.85 lacs are on account of grants on projects already completed. At the time of utilization of grants, these amounts were not appropriated out of specific grants. A relevant adjustment entry needs to be passed so that the amount spent/unspent be shown properly as per the accounting system.

iii) Amount Recoverable:

Work contract tax (WCT) being deducted by PSEB/ PSPCL for long is without any legal sanction. An amount aggregating to Rs.48.58 lacs is reflected as recoverable as on 31st March, 2018 in this respect.

iv) Security with Government Departments:

Certain old outstanding security deposits made with

different government departments amounting to Rs.7.87 lacs are due/overdue for refund/recovery. Urgent necessary steps being taken for appropriate action in this regard.

v) **Balance Confirmation/Reconciliation:**

Party Accounts including debtors, creditors, advance received from students and others etc. remained subject to confirmation, reconciliation necessary adjustment consequent to reconciliation. Impact thereof, consequent to the said confirmation/reconciliation, on the income/ expenditure of the current /previous year(s) and assets/ liabilities, if any, is unascertainable.

As the Centre is working with Govt. Deptts. / Autonomous bodies, so in the opinion of the management, old receivables, which are not provided for or written off, are hopeful of recovery. However, the balances remained unconfirmed as on 31st March, 2018.

Provision of Rs.39,44,189.25 has been made during the year against ,/ doubtful debts and charged to Income & Expenditure Account, details whereof are as follows:

- i.) A payment of Rs. 15,21,005.00 is lying as outstanding in the name of DPI, Chandigarh against bill No. 48787 raised during the year 2009 for providing data processing job for recruitment of 536 positions of Teachers advertised by education department, Chandigarh during the year 2007. The -complete data related to the said process was handed over to the department vide letter no DOEACC/20-148/2011/17332 dated 22/09/2011. However, Education Department Chandigarh had again allotted the job of re-checking of complete process to an independent agency (C-DAC Mohali). NIELIT Chandigarh has repeatedly requested to the Education Department, Chandigarh to release the said outstanding payment. Several meetings were also held with the officials of department and C-DAC Mohali in this regard. Last request was sent on 19/03/2018 for release of payments but department is not responding. Hence the amount may be taken under provision till the said payment is received from the concerned Deptt.
- ii.) Payment of Rs. 13,13,746.00 is lying outstanding in

the name of Chief Post Master General (CPMG), New Delhi against bill No. 17143 raised during the year 2004 against the job of Digitization of Property Tax Data of MCD awarded by O/o Post Master General, New Delhi. The job was completed-within the prescribed time schedule. The matter for release of payment is under correspondence with Postal Department. It has been informed by the department that the matter is being pursued vigorously with MCD authorities and the case is now being taken up with the Chief Secretary, Govt. of NCT of Delhi. The amount has been taken under III provision, till such time, the above payment is received/settled with the said Deptt.

- iii.) TDS amount of Rs.11,09,438.25 has been claimed to be deducted by the User Departments in previous years but credit could not be taken by the Centre as no details are available in 26AS.

Amounts aggregating to Rs.2,19,432/- received during the year from debtors could not be credited to the appropriate debtor's account for want of relevant information. The said consolidated amount has been reduced from total debtors.

c) **In case of HQ**

Delhi Development Authority has allotted a plot measuring 4277.88 sq mtr to NIELIT at Sector 8 , Dwarka, New Delhi for construction of its HQ's. Final Cost of the land is yet to be finalized by DDA.

d) **During the Financial Year 2016-2017, Shillong Centre had given an amount of Rs 2,86,50,000/- to Project Management(PMC) as " Mobilization Advance".**

e) **In case of Gorakhpur Centre**

The Centre has shown amount received Rs.27,53,98,087.50 from NIELIT Head office on account of examination fee of CCC Level & BCC Level course as current year income. The fee for CCC level course and BCC level course is paid to NIELIT head office directly by student and out of which NIELIT head office shares revenue with respective centres which is shown as income of that year in of the centre. Output GST on entire fee has been paid by NIELIT head office but output liability of Goods & Service Tax on Gorakhpur Centre share has not been paid/provided by the Gorakhpur centre during the year, the financial impact of which remain unascertained.

5. National Population Register (NPR)

(a) Contingent Liabilities:

In case of Chandigarh Centre

Arbitration Petition was filed by M/SSREI Infrastructure Finance Limited before the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi at New Delhi. Arbitrator has already been appointed in the case. Mediation proceedings held on 24.08.2018 were failed and Arbitration claim will be filed by SREI infrastructure before the Arbitrator. In addition to the payment due to M/S SREI Infrastructure Finance Limited, the MSP has demanded interest @18%. The amount of interest specified in their petition for Zone -61, Uttar Pradesh is Rs 2,32,69,467/- and Zone

-62, Uttar Pradesh is Rs 1,79,62,692/- which were under jurisdiction of NIELIT Chandigarh. In addition to the interest, the MSP is also demanding cost towards renewal of Bank Guarantee.

(b) Current Assets, Loans And Advances:

In the opinion of the management, the current assets, loans and advances have been stated at the value which will be realised in the ordinary course of business.

(c) As per information available, we here by confirm that the society is not having any amount payable to any party covered under Micro Small & Medium Enterprises as defined in section 7(1) of the Micro

Small & Medium Enterprises Development Act, 2006, to the extent such parties identified on the basis of information collected by the management and the same has been relied by the Auditors.

- (d) Department of Electronics, Information & Technology vide its letter bearing No: FNo7(2)2011-EG-1 dated 05/04/2011 has entrusted the work of Demographic Data Digitisation & Bio-metric data collection for creating National Population Register(NPR) in respect of 17 States & 2 Union Territories . RGI vide its DO No;9/83/2010-CRD(NPR) dated 27.06.2012 has withdrawn the work of Bio-Metric data digitisation from NIELIT.
 - (e) Office of the Registrar General of India had released an advance of Rs 522.24 crore to the NIELIT for execution of National Population Register Project. Total cost towards Data Digitisation (NPR Project) stands at approx Rs 569 crore.
 - (f) The work of Data digitisation has been completed. The last Digitised Data has been handed over to RGI during October.2013.However payment to MSP's(Managed Service Provider) could not be made earlier, because NIELIT had imposed penalty as per the terms of RFQ (Request for Quotation) against the bills submitted by MSP's, which was disputed by MSP's. Further the work of LRUR (Local Register of Usual Residents) correction was also withdrawn by RGI (Registrar General of India). The matter relating to settlement of penalty and LRUR correction cost were taken up before the competent authority of NIELIT. The competent authority had accorded approval, as under:
 - (i) hat the payments be released to MSP's in a transparent and accountable manner after deduction of LRUR correction cost, which has been quantified @ 4.3% of the digitised rate quoted by the MSP's.
 - (ii) The cost deducted on account of LRUR corrections to be returned back to RGI.
 - (iii) To revise the agreement signed with MSP's on account of change in the scope of work and also terms and conditions related to payment because of withdrawal of LRUR.
 - (g) In accordance with the decisions of the competent authority ,the cost deducted on account of LRUR corrections have been accounted for under sub head Liabilities-LRUR (NPR) under "Current Liabilities and Provisions".
 - (h) Interest amounting to Rs 241.40 Crore Earned/ Accrued on unutilised Advance has been earmarked under Liabilities and not accounted for as Interest Income in the absence of guild lines from RGI.
 - (i) M/S Virgo Softtech Limited ,New Delhi has served four separate notices dated 16.08.2018 for settlement of dispute under Clause 8.2 of the Agreement dated 5'th January 2012 signed between NIELIT Chandigarh and M/S Virgo Softtech Limited for demographic data digitisation for Usual Residents of Urban areas of Zones 6,23,24 and 27 for appointment of Arbitrator. In the said notices the party has mentioned about non applicability of deduction of Rs 3,36,76,262/- made by the Centre towards delay in the execution of work and has challenged levy of said penalty on the pretext that the work has been completed by them in time.
 - (j) Separate Books of Accounts have been maintained by all the NPR participating NIELIT Centres w.e.f 01.04.2012 in respect of NPR Project & prepared separate Annual Account from the FY 2012-2013.
6. We hereby confirm that the society has no amount payable to micro, small & medium enterprises as defined in section 7(1) of the micro small & medium enterprises Act, 2006, to the extent such parties identified on the basis of information collected by the management.
 7. Previous Year Figures have been regrouped or rearranged wherever necessary
 8. Figures have rounded off to the nearest Rupee.
 9. Debtors & Creditors, loans and advances, current assets and current liabilities are stated in the books at the value which is recoverable/ payable. However the confirmation from the parties are under process.
 10. Only material notes as per the understanding of the management in relation to various centre's audited financial statements have been presented in these consolidated financial statements, for non material notes a reference can be made to individual centre audited financial statements.
 11. NIELIT is in the process of reconciliation of its tax deducted at source with the form 26 AS issued by income tax department for the year ended 31st March, 2018.
 12. Centers does not follow the streamline policy in the preparation of Receipt & Payment accounts in case of

short term & long term deposits resulting into certain reconciliation differences between closing balances of short term & long term deposits appearing in the Balance Sheets and in the Receipt & Payment account as at 31.3.2018. Further there are certain reconciliation differences between opening and closing cash & bank

balances in the Receipt & Payment account as at 31.3.2018.

13. During consolidation of various centres, heading/ groups has been re-arranged for better and fair presentation.
